WARRANT

To E. M. Crowell, a Constable in the Town of Orrington,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Orrington, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town, on Monday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To elect a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act on the report of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Assessors and Overseers of Poor.

Art. 4. To act on the report of the Health Officer and Board of Health.

Art. 5. To act on the report of the Superintendent of Schools and the School Board.

Art. 6. To fix the compensation of the following town officers for the ensuing year: Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioner, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Health Officer, and of any others that may be deemed necessary.

Art. 7. To elect all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, including a Collector of Taxes.

Art. 8. To see what sums of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the following purposes: For the Support of Schools,

Books and Supplies, Repair of School Property, Insurance of School Buildings, for School Flags, Support of Poor, Mothers' Aid, Repair of Roads and Bridges, Pay of Snow Bills, Purchase of Snow Fence, Repair of Ditches and Culverts, Patrol Maintenance, Pay of Town Officers, Pay of Schoolhouse Note and Interest due in 1929, Miscellaneous Expenses, and any other town charges that may be deemed necessary.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Memorial purposes.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 11. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$533.00, for the improvement of the section of the State Aid Road, as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges. The above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to purchase land to enlarge Pine Hill Cemetery, at South Orrington, and raise money for same, also to fence same and put land in condition for burial purposes, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the Mill Bridge, so called, at South Orrington, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money for the use of the Bangor Public Library for one year, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 15. "By Request." To see if the town will vote to expend \$750.00 on the Brewer Lake and Club House Roads, so called, and raise money for the same, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine, or what other action it will take.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Treasurer, subject to the approval of the Selectmen, to loan the credit of the town, if necessary, to defray town charges, for an amount or amounts not to exceed in the aggregate, the sum of \$15,000.00, and to make, execute and deliver the negotiable note or notes of the town therefor, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money to provide for the services of a Public Health Nurse, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 19. "By Request." To see if the town will vote to sell the schoolhouse at Swett's Pond, or what action it will take regarding same. Also to see what action the town will take regarding the King schoolhouse.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to establish a date when all taxes on real estate and personal property shall become due and payable each year, and that upon any such taxes not paid on or before such date, interest shall be charged, at the rate of six per cent per annum, and that for any part of a month that such taxes remain unpaid, interest shall be collected for a full month, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money to purchase land to enlarge the schoolhouse lot at South Orrington.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money to pay the overdraft on repairing the East Orrington schoolhouse, or what action it will take regarding same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will take any action in regard to the purchase of any motor equipment for road work.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Treasurer to sell, at public auction or private sale, its equity in any and all real estate upon which the town holds tax deeds that have been recorded or may be recorded in Penobscot Registry of Deeds.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$50.00 for the perpetual care of the David L. Dodge burial lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 for the perpetual care of the Charles Wilson or Elizabeth Blake burial lot in Dean Hill Cemetery.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00, the income from the same to be used for the perpetual care of the George C. Rogers burial lot in Pine Hill Cemetery.

Art. 28. To see what action the town will take in regard to the care and letting of the town hall.

Art. 29. To act on any other question that may legally come before said meeting.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of Jurors, as revised by the Selectmen and Treasurer.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising the list of voters.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF BUDGET COMMITTEE

Your Budget Committee make the following recommendations for the year 1929-1930 :

Art. 6. We advise the office of Tax Collector be abolished, and that office be combined with Town Treasurer.

Your committee further recommends that taxes be made payable on or before September 15th, interest to be charged thereafter, at the rate of six per cent.

If office of Collector of Taxes is abolished, your committee would recommend an increase in salary, for the second and third Selectmen, of \$50.00 per year, and also Town Treasurer, of \$50.00 per year.

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

To the Citizens of the Town of Orrington:

I hereby submit my report as a public health nurse for the period from Jan. 1, 1928, to Jan. 1, 1929.

Dental inspection was given by Dr. C. E. Allen of Bangor. One condition found made it necessary for the child to be brought to the doctor's office by nurse for extraction of several teeth and bad roots. The high percentage of defects found in teeth indicate that little or no attention is being given to this important health point on the part of the parents. Something should be done this coming year to provide opportunity for treatment for those children who are unable to pay for dental work. A pre-school and infant conference was held in August in the Town Hall, at which time opportunity was given parents to consult with physicians regarding the condition of small children. Forty-two came to this

conference, defects were chiefly of weight, posture, throat and teeth. Four children were referred to throat specialists for abnormal conditions of tonsils. The large number of patients attending are due to the efforts of interested citizens who provided motor conveyances. It is hoped that the work so well begun this year will be continued the coming year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

*To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the
Town of Orrington:*

I herewith submit my fifth annual report of progress and needs of your schools.

I feel that Orrington is doing remarkably well with the school improvement program outlined four years ago. The new building at East Orrington, which has just been completed is attractive and modern in every respect. The main floor consists of the corridor, a library equipped with a book case and reading table, two standard size classrooms, well lighted and ventilated with a wardrobe for each room. The basement contains a large boiler and fuel room, two play-rooms for the boys and girls, and two toilet-rooms equipped with flush toilets and lavatories. The lavatories were presented by the East Orrington Parent-Teacher Association. The building is heated throughout by a steam heating plant amply large to care for another room. Indirect lighting fixtures were used in each classroom and library. Some of these fixtures were given by friends of East Orrington. A modern sanitary drinking fountain, which was presented by Mr. L. H. Smith, is installed in the corridor. Doubtless this is one of the best two-room buildings in the State.

At the special town meeting the Committee informed the town that \$1,000 was needed additional to the Burns Fund for the remodeling of the old building and the building and equipping of the new part. This amount was not granted at that meeting, therefore many of the bills are unpaid as you will note in the financial report. **The first plan figured on** had dirt toilets and a hot air heating plant. Later it was decided to have a steam heating plant and flush toilets. This necessitated the digging of a well

and cesspool, and the installing of an electric pump and pressure tank. These changes increased the total cost of building and equipment. However, the cost of the town in a few years will be less, for the building can be heated by steam at least \$125 a year cheaper than by hot air and wood, as used at North Orrington.

We received \$400 from the State this year and expect \$500 next year, which will reduce the overdraft or total cost to the town to approximately \$1,600. The town is exceedingly fortunate to have such a fine building for so small an expense. This amount is not much in excess of the cost of repairing the old building. The old building was raised two feet, a new foundation constructed, painted inside and outside, shingled, hardwood floor laid, steel ceiling installed, and wired for electric lights.

With the two new buildings already completed there remains the Corner, Center, and South Orrington buildings to be considered in the future. At the Corner the building will have to be remodeled or the children conveyed. The crowded condition at North Orrington will not permit them to be conveyed to that school, so it might be well to continue as at present. The building at South Orrington has been greatly improved in the last four years, still it is far from satisfactory. It should be moved back where it would be possible to have a basement to care for the heating plant and toilets. The Center school offers the most difficult problem, for here we have a large number of children and all grades for one teacher.

Orrington is not raising an excessive amount for schools as many seem to think. The rate of taxation for school purposes is slightly above the average for the State, but much below many of the surrounding towns. The school account shows rather a large balance because the schools opened one week later in September, and another week's payroll is due from this account.

There are a few changes in the teaching force this year. The better buildings and improved teaching conditions will make it possible to retain teachers for a longer period. In the large one-room schools we are unable to hold a teacher more than a year. The present salary of teachers is from seventeen dollars to twenty-five dollars a week, according to the length of service, educational training, and size of school.
