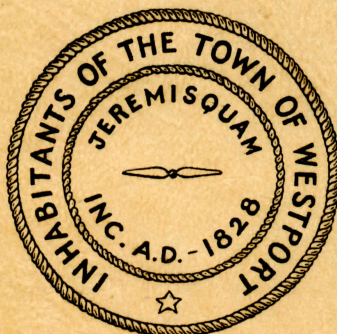

**REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

To the Superintending School Committee and citizens of Westport:

The annual report of the Superintendent of Schools is hereby respectfully submitted:

For our teacher this year we had Miss Elinor Mahan. She has a life certificate in public elementary schools, a member of the Maine Teachers' Association. She received her education at Gorham State Teachers' College, and has taken courses at Farmington State Teachers College and Boston University.

The enrollment of our school is as follows: 3 in grade 1; 1 in grade 2; 3 in grade 3; 3 in grade 4; 3 in grade 5; 2 in grade 6; 1 in grade 7; and 1 in grade 8, making a total of 17.

We have enrolled in high school in Bath: 3 in grade 9; 2 in grade 11; and 1 in grade 12, making a total of 6. The tuition rate for high school in Bath this year is \$350.90, and next year it is estimated to be \$10.00 more, or \$360.90.

For the budget and financial sheet this year, we are using the newly adopted Financial Accounting for local and State School Systems. Payrolls submitted to the town, our ledger sheets, and financial reports to the State Department of Education have been on this form for some time, and it is no more than common sense that our budget and financial sheet be in this form then. It is possible that some people will not welcome this form, as it is different. However, you can readily see the advantages of it in that each year the same account

will be the same way, thereby making it possible to compare the same items each year. In the past, in some towns where school committees changed, an item such as Supplies would be teaching supplies one year; teaching and janitor's supplies the next year; and teaching, janitor's and office supplies the next year making it impossible to compare these items. This followed for the other items.

In December, children of the school were transported to Woolwich where they took part in a mouth health program. This project was carried out by a dental hygienist for the State Division of Dental Health. Children of the second, fifth, and eighth grades were offered the series of sodium fluoride applications for partial prevention of dental decay. Each Child received four applications of sodium fluoride in addition to a professional cleaning and examination of his teeth. Individual toothbrushing instructions were also given each child in hopes that the children will form better home care habits. Four children started the series of applications and three were completed. All of these children stated they made at least occasional dental visits, however, none of them seemed to be completely free from dental caries at the time of examination.

School visitations is always welcomed by personnel in your school, I think that you would enjoy watching your children learn in school ,and I know that your child would profit by having a parent-teacher discussion. I know that the home and school both are attempting to achieve the same result, and by working together I know that we can achieve it to a great extent.

I would like to thank all of the school committee who have shown a very good knowledge of school work and all other people who have helped make our school a better place this year.

## COMMENTS

## TOWN OF WESTPORT

February 16, 1958 To February 12, 1959

An audit of the financial records maintained by the various officers of the Town of Westport has been completed for the fiscal year ended February 12, 1959.

The examination included a review of cash transactions and an analysis of available funds and expenditures. The results are incorporated in the following text, exhibits and schedules.

The fiscal year's operations showed that the net unexpended departmental balances lapsed amounted to \$1,757.12, per the following summary:

## Departmental Operations:

Unexpended balances in the various highway accounts were the principal factors contributing to the amount carried to surplus.

**ASSETS . . . .** The general fund cash balance of \$7,593.87 was verified by reconciliation of a statement furnished by the First National Bank of Bath, Maine and by count of cash.

Taxes receivable totaling \$658.45 consisted principally of current year accounts of \$594.25. The balance of \$64.20 represented uncollected accounts for the two preceding years.

Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$391.86 and \$666.36 respectively.

**RESERVES AND SURPLUS . . . .** Deferred revenue of \$391.40 was comprised of 1959 excise tax collections carried forward for future allocation by the towns-people.

The appropriation accounts show an unexpended balance of \$3,095.43 representing various operating account balances that are carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or customary practice.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$5,746.91, a decrease of \$1,042.88 for the year. The change was occasioned by an appropriation for the Mill Bridge fill account less the net unexpended departmental balances lapsed.

**DEBT FUND . . . .** The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects the outstanding Westport - Wiscasset Bridge and Dyke Bridge notes of \$5,000.00 each which mature during the ensuing five years.

**RESERVE FUND . . . .** The reserve fund for a school building or for tuition totaled \$583.91 and is on deposit in the First National Bank of Bath, Maine.

**DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS . . . .** The departmental operating accounts showed an increase of \$660.58 in funds raised by taxation, as compared with the preceding year. Larger appropriations for education and debt retirement and a smaller highways and bridges appropriation were the principal factors contributing to the increase.

Departmental balances carried forward to the ensuing year increased by \$1,293.77, as compared with balances at the start of the year. This change occurred for the most part in the education accounts.

GENERAL . . . The townspeople authorized the use of the 1958 excise tax revenue for contingent account expenses and the appropriation of \$2,800.00 from surplus for the Mill Bridge fill account.

There is on deposit in the Depositors Trust Company, Boothbay Harbor, Maine, Passbook No. 4613, an amount of \$2.42. The account is in the name of Henry A. Swanton, School Department, Town of Westport, Maine. The origin and purpose of the fund is unknown.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions.

The cash account was verified by reconciliation of statements furnished by the depository. External verifications were utilized, on a test basis, to determine the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined for a selected period.

Excise tax collections were verified with the copies of the receipts retained by the collector. Education account balances were checked with the Superintendent of Schools. Debt and reserve fund transactions were examined. Bond coverage was reviewed.

In our opinion, subject to the foregoing comments, the accompanying statements and supporting information present fairly the financial position of the town at February 12, 1959, and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

## Warrant for Town Meeting

To Robert T. Greenleaf, a Constable of the Town of Westport in the County of Lincoln

### GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Saturday, the nineteenth day of March, A. D. 1960 at nine o'clock in the A. M., then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

ART. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2 To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the Town Officers, and the Audit for the municipal year ending February 11, 1959.

ART. 3 To act on the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor, Treasurer, Collector, Superintendent of Schools, Clerk, and other officers.

ART. 4 To see if the Town will vote as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 91 of the R.S. of Maine, to instruct its Selectmen to appoint a Road Commissioner instead of electing one.

ART. 5 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 6 To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Officers' Salaries, and to set same.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$1,900.00 be raised.

ART. 7 To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Contingent expenses.

ART. 33 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen at their discretion as to price and terms, to sell and convey by quitclaim deed any real estate acquired from tax sources by the Town. Such sales of property to be advertised in newspapers of Lincoln and Sagadahoc Counties, except when property is being redeemed by former owner. *Accepted*
