### *To the Citizens of Scarborough:*

In accordance with the Laws of the State of Maine, I submit the following report of the Public Schools of Scarborough for the year ending February 10, 1908.

Whole number of scholars in town between 5 and 21 years of age, April 1, 1908: 450

I cannot give the average attendance for the year as the schools are still in session.

Not many changes have been made in teachers during the past year, and all of them have worked hard for success in each school. They have maintained a *good average* and have done thorough work and this is sufficient to prove that the school year will be as profitable to the town as any previous year. We have the schoolhouses in good repair in most cases and are well fitted with books, maps and globes. Some new books will be needed the coming year and some reference work for the rural schools.

## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

*To George W. Knight, a constable in the Town of Scarborough:*

### *GREETING:*

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Scarborough, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town house in said Town of Scarborough on Monday the first (1st) day of March, A. D., 1909, at ten (10) o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk, selectmen, assessors, overseers of poor, collector, treasurer, one member of school board, road commissioner or commissioners, and all other necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools, schoolhouse repairs and supplies, text books and appliances, the poor, repairs on roads and bridges, and to defray all other town charges.

Art. 4. To see if the town will accept and adopt the report of the several town officers.

Art. 5. To see what compensation the town will vote its collector for the ensuing year.



Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to maintain a free High school and raise a sum of money for same.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to meet expense of breaking roads.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for decorating soldiers' graves.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to furnish a police officer for Prouts' Neck and raise a sum of money for the payment of same.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote yes or no upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid for highways for the year 1909.

Art. 11. To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the main highways within the town, such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by Section 5 of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, being the sum of \$157.50.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the Black Point Road, south of the B. & M. R. R. Western Division. By request.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to build sidewalks on Ocean Avenue, Higgins Beach, also, to see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to improve the streets at Higgins Beach, which have been accepted by the town. By request.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to accept road as laid out by selectmen on petition of W. H. Googins and others.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the existing way leading from Black Point Road near house of W. H. Googins and running thence to the "Ferry Rock" so called.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to have six water hydrants installed and equipped at Pine Point commencing near the town line of Old Orchard and extending easterly to the Point on petition of Wm. Moulton and others.

Art. 17. To see what action the town will take to improve the sanitary conditions at the Oak Hill School. By request.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to accept a road as laid out by the selectmen on petition of James W. Green and others, and raise a sum of money for same.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) to be expended on the Muzzy road near South Portland line. By request.

Art. 20. To see what action the town will take in regard to rebuilding the fence on town hall lot.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise money to purchase a gravel pit at Scottow's Hill. By request.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to restrict and limit automobiles from running more than eight (8) miles an hour in villages in the Town of Scarborough; under a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50), one-half to be paid to the complainant and one-half to the Town of Scarborough on petition of Walter Seavey and others.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) to be expended on the Payne road from Alexander Higgins to the Vinegar road. By request.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum

of money to widen and repair the road leading from Spurwink road to land of J. C. Jordan heirs. By request.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the Gorham road; between the Buggy Meeting House and junction with the Hunnewell road. By request.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on Pleasant Hill road near house of Thomas Williams. By request.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the erection of Guide Posts, where needed in the town, by direction of the State Highway Commissioner.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) to be expended on the highway from Coal Kiln Corner to Westbrook between the town line of Gorham and the town line of Westbrook.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to accept the following provisions contained in the Will of Arrabella Libby late of Scarboro, deceased: viz.—“It is my will that my executor so place or invest the sum of \$100 from my estate that the income therefrom may be devoted to the keeping in order and repair of my lot in Black Point Cemetery at Scarboro.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Clay Pits Landing.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the Town Farm buildings.

Art. 32. To see what action the town will take in regard to taking clams.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to recompense Andrew Jensen for loss of horse, claimed to be caused by defect in highway and raise sum of money for same.
