



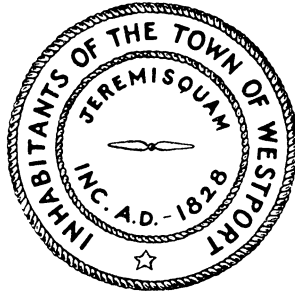

COMMENTS

TOWN OF WESTPORT
FEBRUARY 11, 1962 to FEBRUARY 9, 1963

An audit has been completed of the financial records of the Town of Westport for the fiscal year ended February 9, 1963. The audit included an examination of the records maintained by the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector and other municipal officials.

The operations for the year showed that the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed amounted to \$1,528.92, per the following summary:

Departmental Operations:

Net Unexpended Balance	<u>\$1,528.92</u>

The overlay and unexpended balances in the contingent and interest accounts were the major factors contributing to the amount lapsed to surplus.

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements and to the scope of audit.

ASSETS . . . The general cash balance of \$5,417.36 was on deposit in the Bath National Bank, Bath, Maine at February 9, 1963. Petty cash and bounty funds were on hand.

Taxes receivable totaling \$428.73 represented current year accounts of \$424.08 and a 1961 account of \$4.65.

Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$223.68 and \$736.35 respectively.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS The appropriation accounts showed a net unexpended balance of \$2,037.55, representing various operating account balances and an overdraft carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or by authority of the municipal officers.

Excise tax collections of \$755.19 are reserved for future allocation by the townspeople.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$4,048.38, an increase of \$694.57 for the year. The change was occasioned principally by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed, less an authorized transfer for debt reduction.

DEBT FUND The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects the outstanding Westport-Wiscasset and Dyke bridge notes of \$1,000.00 each and school bus notes of \$5,695.00. These notes mature over the next six years at varying rates of interest.

RESERVE FUND The reserve fund for a new school or for tuition totaled \$634.34 and was on deposit in the First National Bank of Portland, Bath, Maine.

DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS The departmental accounts showed an increase of \$1,149.75 in funds raised by taxation, as compared with the preceding year. Larger appropriation for most operating categories, except highways and protection, were the principal factors contributing to the increase.

The departmental balances carried forward increased

by \$1,061.87, as compared with balances at the start of the year. This change occurred principally in the state aid road and education accounts.

GENERAL The townspeople authorized the use of the 1962 excise tax revenue for the contingent account and the transfer of \$1,000.00 from surplus for payment of a bridge note. The voters also approved the issuance of serial notes to finance the purchase of a new school bus.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined for a selected period. Verifications were utilized, on a test basis, to determine the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Excise tax collections were reconciled by examination of copies of receipts retained by the collector. Education account balances were reconciled with the Superintendent of Schools. Reserve fund transactions were reviewed and the investment verified. Surety Bond coverage was examined.

Warrant for Town Meeting State of Maine

To Robert T. Greenleaf, a Constable of the Town of Westport in the County of Lincoln.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Westport, in said County, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to assemble at Town Hall in said town on Saturday, twenty first day of March A.D., 1964 at nine o'clock in the A.M., then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

ART. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote to set Collectors percentage, and to pay expenses incidental to Treasurer and Collector.

ART. 3. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ART. 4. To elect a Fire Inspector.

ART. 5. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Officers Salaries, and to set same.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$2,200.00 be raised.

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ART. 6. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Contingent Expenses.

Recommended by Selectmen that 1964 Excise Taxes be transferred to Contingent Account.

ART. 7. To see what sum of money, if any, should be raised and appropriated for Civil Defense.

ART. 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Westport Volunteer Fire Department.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$1,000.00 be raised.

ART. 9. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$25.00 be raised.

ART. 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Workmans' Compensation Act (R.S. Chap. 26, Sec. 2, Paragraph 1).

ART. 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to take out insurance to cover injuries to Town employees under the Workmen's Compensation Act, and raise money for same.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$150.00 be raised.

ART. 12. To see what action the Town will take, if any, to transfer Capital Reserve Fund of \$634.34 to the Common School Account.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for support of Schools.

Recommended by School Committee that \$14,151.84 be raised.

ART. 14. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for care and maintenance of the Town Dump.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$75.00 be raised.

ART. 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to plowing driveways for the ensuing year.

ART. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for snow removal.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$1,051.28 be carried forward and \$3,500.00 be raised.

ART. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.

Recommended by Road Commissioner that \$2,500.00 be raised.

ART. 18. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care and maintenance of highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 44, 49 or 50, Chap. 23, R.S. 1954 as amended.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$533.00 be raised.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for cutting bushes on Town Roads.

ART. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Groving of Parkways.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$15.00 be raised.

ART. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for support of the poor.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$150.00 be raised.

ART. 22. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Aid to Dependent Children.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$300.00 be raised.

ART. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$35.00 for Public Health Nursing in Westport. Said sum to be expended by the Maine Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Health for local service.

ART. 24. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate for interest.

Recommended by Selectmen that Balance of \$135.90 be carried forward.

ART. 25. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate for repair of Town Buildings.

ART. 26. To see whether or not the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

ART. 27. To see if the Town will continue membership in the Maine Municipal Association, and if so, authorize the officials to pay fee from Contingent Fund.

ART. 28. To see what sum, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate for the care of Veterans' graves.

Recommended by Selectmen that Balance of \$14.50 be carried forward.

ART. 29. To see what sum, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate to pay for Audit for the Municipal year ending February 15, 1964.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$250.00 be raised.

ART. 30. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for abatements.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$50.00 be raised.

ART. 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$25.00 for the Wiscasset Public Library.

ART. 32. To see if the Town will vote to set a date when taxes shall be payable, and what interest shall be collected thereafter.

ART. 33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to sell and assign unmatured tax mortgage liens at discretion as to terms, but at a price not less than unpaid tax, interest and costs.

ART. 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen at their discretion as to price and terms, to sell and convey by quit claim deed any real estate acquired from tax sources by the Town. Such sales of property to be advertised in newspapers of Lincoln and Sagadahoc Counties, except when property is being redeemed by former owner.

ART. 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans within the 1964 taxable year in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the Town.

ART. 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen and Treasurer to renew outstanding notes held against the Town, if necessary.

ART. 37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State and County tax; take any action relative thereto.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will vote to set a specified time for the Treasurer to pay Selectmens' warrants.

ART. 39. To see if the Town will vote to set a wage scale for labor, trucks and equipment.

ART. 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to rent or lease the Town Hall facilities for entertainment purposes.

ART. 41. To see what action the Town will take in regard to putting a heating system in the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for same.

ART. 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 as a pension for Ross T. Beaton for the ensuing year.

ART. 43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35.00 for the Wiscasset Airport.

ART. 44. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in the Town of Westport on Saturday the twenty-first day of March A.D., 1964 at 8:00 o'clock in the A.M. for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

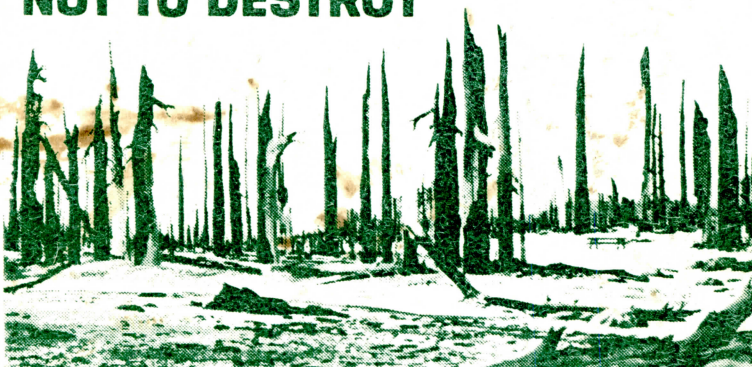
