Thus, the Saco and Biddeford Savings Institution came into existence, formally ushering in a history of banking to which only 5 other savings banks in the United States can lay claim. At this time in history, the town of Old Orchard Beach was not yet born. Located in Saco, the Saco and Biddeford Savings Institution was open "every Wednesday from half past 10 to 12 o'clock." To Lucinda Goldthwaite belongs the honor of being the first depositor. On May 30, 1827, just a week after the above announcement was printed, she came to the new banking quarters and made a deposit of \$3.00. This deposit opened the first ledger of the bank. The people of Saco began bringing in their small savings because they recognized the sincerity and willingness of this new savings bank to help them save money and do so with security.

The first dividend paid by the bank amounted to \$6.91. Dividends for the year 1982 amounted to \$5,072,014.00!

For 156 years, the Saco and Biddeford Savings Institution has kept up with the growing demands of local citizenry, increasing deposits and processing loans. On November 24, 1951, over 250 persons welcomed the opening of the Old Orchard Beach Branch of the Bank. The colonial style brick building is at the head of Old Orchard Street. In order to continue a pattern of responsible growth, a new addition was constructed at Old Orchard Beach in 1980. This office has been responsible for a continuum of local and tourist-related banking activity. The Saco and Biddeford Savings Institution is recognized as a forerunner in support of Old Orchard Beach and its tremendous tourist industry.

To present depositors, we offer our sincere appreciation for the privilege of working with you. To future depositors who will join this great family of savers, we offer our most cordial welcome and express our warm congratulations to the citizenry of the Town of Old Orchard Beach during this 100th Anniversary celebration.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO OLD ORCHARD BEACH FROM THE MOKARZEL FAMILY

George Salim Mokarzel arrived in Old Orchard in 1908 from Beirut, Lebanon. Here, he operated a linen store and met his wife, Kathleen Dorgan, who was from Cork City, Ireland. At the time of his death in 1976, they had been happily married for 48 years, and had raised four children: Joe, Evelyn, Maureen and Beverly, all whom are married and still living in Old Orchard Beach. The family home at 3 School Street is still occupied by Kathleen.

For many years, Mom, Dad, Maureen and Bev owned and operated the Boston Fruit Store and Maureen's Gift Shop at 24 Old Orchard Street. Dad, wearing his "fez" and smoking a cigar from his pipe was a familiar sight to many tourists each year. Evelyn has for the past 14 years, and currently operates the "Bell Buoy Restaurant" at the same location. Joe owns and operates the Sea Drift Motel on East Grand Avenue.

Old Orchard Beach has been good to the Mokarzel family and we hope that in some small way, our family has made some contributions to our beloved town.

History

The Abbot House was built in 1895 by the Abbot Sisters and provided food and lodging to the guests.

In the early 30's, the property was acquired by Minni Mair; the new owners built a private home next to the existing hotel.

In 1945, Julius Kostick bought the Hotel and House and changed the name to Edgewater Hotel.

In 1953, Lucien Begin & Simonne Janelle acquired the property.

In 1959 the House was moved to West Surf and Odena, and ten motel units were built. In 1955, on the day after Labor Day, the Hotel was torn down, and 25 modern units replaced the 50 room hotel.

1983 will mark the 30th Anniversary of the Edgewater under the Begin and Janelle ownership.

The property now known as the Powder Horn Tent and Trailer Park has had a long and unpredictable history. Its first recorded sale took place in 1846 when Davis Googins purchased 85 acres from Mark Levitt for \$1500. Googins in turn sold it in 1862 to George E. Means and his mother, Mary W. Means, widow of Cyrus Means, for \$335--a bargain price perhaps occasioned by the onset of the Civil War. George Means turned a tidy profit on the property when in 1889 he sold "95 or more acres" to Maria F. Porter for \$2000. In 1919 a group of businessmen consisting of Perly W. Stevens, Lyman Abbott, Sr., F. H. Libby, Montrose Hill and John W. Duffy purchased the property, which at that time included a stately farmhouse, and converted it to a country club, complete with 18-hole golf course. The farmhouse, which served as the clubhouse, burned to the ground in the 1930's, but a new building was promptly built to replace it. In the early 1950's ownership of the Country Club was transferred to Dr. Walter D. Mazzacane and Arthur Dickson. (Dickson to this day continues to own and operate a 9-hole golf course on part of the original property on the west side of Cascade Road). In 1957, the property was sold to Barney Osher's Seashore Amusement Enterprises who made a wholly new use of it as an animal farm. Finally, in 1971, it was purchased by the present owners and converted to a tent and trailer park. The one-time clubhouse is now home to the Ahearns and their two sons.

During its 31 year existence as part of the first century of OOB, the club has sponsored Red Cross swimming programs, annually donates a scholarship in memory of the late W. WARREN HARMON. It also sponsors a student to GIRLS AND BOYS STATE, respectively, as well as helps to underwrite several programs with other groups which include "CHILDREN'S SNOW DAY," sponsored by the OOB Snowmobile club, Multiple Sclerosis, Muscular Dystrophy, local Retirement centers, School Lunch programs, Salvation Army Christmas Kettle Appeal, needy families with clothes, food and shelter. A MEMORIAM AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT TO SOME OF OUR ANCESTORS

- MARTIN JAMESON (1705-1760); a Scotch-Irishman born in Ireland. Settled here as a neighbor of Patrick Googins. Their mutually agreed land boundary is now Forest Avenue. His land titles encompassed the present school locations on the T-For-Turn Road.
- JOHN JAMESON (1827-1885); a fifth generation grandson of Martin was the first Treasurer of Old Orchard, 1883-84; then elected Selectman in 1885. He died in office.
- CAPT. ISAAH MILLIKEN (1763-1834); the lumber-carrying ship he captained was stopped in 1813 by a British warship seeking to impress his crew, but "being lumber laden and pleading poverty was released." Ship and crew returned unharmed. Purchased his homestead 1792 and settled there in 1798 about 1700' from the Brick House on Portland Avenue, Millikens' Mills, built by his son, Henry and, grandson, Michael in 1834-1835.
- HENRY MILLIKEN (1791-1874); lived on homestead all but the first seven years of his life. Pioneer farmer, self-taught millwright, wrote "I saw a sawmill raised where mine now stands" in 1798. Built a grist mill on this site in 1825. Later, he changed it to a sawmill that he and his descendants ran until the 1930's.
- MICHAEL NASON MILLIKEN (1819-1908); walked to Somerville, Mass. before he was aged 16 to learn to make bricks. Came home and helped his father build the brick house.
- ISAAH PARKER MILLIKEN (1821-1909); brother of Michael but two years younger helped build the brick house. Later married and built his own house on the homestead that burned about 1900.
- JOHN PARKER MILLIKEN (1861-1917); son of Isaiiah Parker Milliken. A bookkeeper, grocery store owner, elected Selectman in 1901. Probably the best liked man in town.
- HENRY ALONZO GRISWOLD MILLIKEN (1853-1933); older son of Michael, in 1895-6 represented this Town in the State Legislature. Joined with his brother to form the firm of H.A.G. & B.F. Milliken which ran the sawmill more than thirty years.
- BENJAMIN FRANK MILLIKEN (1855-1918); brother of Henry Alonzo G. Milliken, served the Town as Selectman for twelve years before 1901. This has been the second longest record of service as a Selectman during the town's first century.
- JOHN NASON MILLIKEN (1892-1971); son of H.A.G.M., elected Tax Collector 1916-1918; Representative to the Legislature 1929 and 1931. Chief of Police 1943-1944.

We feel a visit to Old Orchard Beach is not complete in this Centennial year or any year, without trying our salt water taffy, karmelkorn or our other delicious homemade candies. We hope you feel the same.

Our fine line of quality candies was established in 1940 when my father, Emerson Parlin, purchased Caswell's on the Pier. In 1942 he changed the name to EMERSON'S, and so we have been since then. Several years later we opened another store at 42 Old Orchard Street (across from St. Margaret's Church) which is now our primary store.

In July Of 1969, EMERSON'S Candy, along with other familiar landmarks including Noah's Ark and the Merry-Go-Round was completely destroyed by fire. At age 70, Emerson worked all winter making cases, buying equipment, etc. and in the Spring of 1970 EMERSON'S Candy was once again opened on the Pier. In 1978, when the pier was destroyed by a storm we moved to 17 Old Orchard Street and stayed there for only two years. In 1980 with the opening of the new pier, EMERSON'S was back again on the Pier with Karmelkorn and salt water taffy. In 1981 we completely renovated and enlarged our store at 42 Old Orchard Street.

In the many years of candy making, my father insisted upon quality in his candy. He instilled this in Larry LaChance our present candy maker and general manager, in the ten years that Larry worked directly with Emerson. It is quality that I insist upon too--we use butter, cream, the best grade of chocolate, flavoring, etc. We believe that you as customers appreciate this quality, as you have proven over the past 43 years.

The building in which Toni's Beauty Salon is now housed was originally built by a Dr. Jones of Biddeford as a summer office. It was subsequently operated as Cote's Beauty Shop. In 1955, the building was purchased by Toni Ladakakos, who has continued to operate a beauty parlor in that location for the past 28 years. Mrs. Ladakakos has serviced patrons from throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia, including the actresses who played in the summer stock theatre that enjoyed great popularity here in the 1950's.

GULL MOTEL

The GULL MOTEL was built in 1962 by John and Anna Anderson on the site of their former residence. It originally consisted of 10 units.

On June 3, 1969, the motel was purchased by its present owners, Bob and Theresa Guerette. They subsequently added a swimming pool and four new street-side units in 1975.

SPRINGHURST

81 Portland Avenue, O.O.B.

"Springhurst," originally the summer home of John C. Miles, one of the best known businessmen of his time, was an important estate consisting of about 20 acres of fertile land. The entire estate abounded in natural spring, one of which never exceeded 50° on the hottest day. There was never a charge made for this water that was supplied to hotels and others.

The variety of crops grown on Mr. Miles' estate included potatoes, corn, lettuce, beets, melons and various oats and wheats grown in abundance and consumed by summer residents and hotel guests who patronized the Beach.

Springhurst is now the year round home of Stephen and Anne Tripp.

RADLEY'S MARKET

Cascade Road

Donald Radley, Owner

The original Radley's Market was opened in December 1945 by Edward D. Radley, Sr., on Old Orchard Street in a building owned by Jack Suddenfield directly across from the old Everett Hotel. Ed Radley, who had worked for years prior to that time at Joe Mullen's store on Old Orchard Street, ran the market until 1956, when he sold it to his brother, Alan C. Radley. In 1962, Alan Radley moved the store to its present location on Cascade Road the site of the former homesteads of the Googins and Lyons families.

Edward "Don" Radley, Jr. bought back his father's original business in 1970. Since then, he has expanded and developed the property. Now named "Cascade Plaza," it includes a branch of the Canal National Bank, David's Sandwich Shop, Radley's Maytag Laundry, the Holland Family Restaurant, Baggage Car Ice Cream and, of course, Radley's Market.

The building that houses the Holland Family Restaurant -- which stands separate from the other Plaza stores -- is the oldest standing building in Old Orchard Beach. It was constructed in 1798 and rehabilitated in 1977. Marion Davis, an early resident of Old Orchard Beach, was born in a bedroom of the house shortly after the Town's separation from Saco in 1883. Her mother, who was born in the very same bedroom, had as her place of birth, not Old Orchard Beach, but Saco. Who, after learning that story, will be able to look at the house without being reminded of Old Orchard Beach's own birth?

Radley's Market continues to serve the community in the way envisioned by Ed Radley 37 years ago. Open 364 days a year, it has as its motto, "the friendliest store in town." Don Radley hopes to keep up the tradition for at least another 37 years.

CANAL NATIONAL BANK

Cascade Plaza

In 1825, Canal Bank was chartered with a capital of \$300,000. The bank officially opened in 1826 at 50 Union Street in Portland and was the first bank to serve Portland's population of 8,500 and assist in financing the canal which was to be constructed between Portland and the Sebago-Long Lakes region, parts of which can still be seen today. In its 155-year history-through the Great Portland Fire of 1866, which destroyed its original quarters, and through two other moves, the last to its present headquarters in the 10-story Canal Plaza complex-Canal National Bank has remained open without interruption.

Canal now has 30 branches throughout Maine. Its Old Orchard Beach branch was formerly the York National Bank of Saco. In 1944, The York Bank's original quarters in Old Orchard Beach consisted of a trailer alongside town hall. Later, in 1956, the Bank constructed a building in Veteran's Square that was considered an astounding departure from traditional bank design: an all-glass-sided, circular structure having as its principal decorative feature a massive safe visible from any angle within or without the building. Canal acquired the York Bank and took over its Veteran's Square quarters in 1959. It remained there until the summer of 1982 when, because of increased space and parking needs, it moved to its present location at Cascade Plaza.

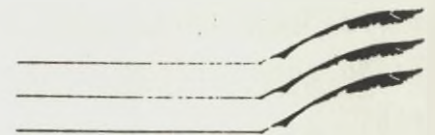

- 1605-Sands of Old Orchard Beach are seen for the first time by a white man, Samuel de Champlain.
- 1624-Capt. Christopher Leavitt reaches the banks of Goosefare Creek and turns back.
- 1635-Thomas Rogers, employed on Stratton Island, visits Old Orchard Beach for the first time.
- 1638-First settler, Thomas Rogers, files deed at Court in Saco and plants first apple tree that will become the Old Orchard.
- 1659-Thomas Rogers marries Esther Foxwell of Bluepoint, trudges the sands of the King's Highway to court Mistress Foxwell. Rogers submits to Mass. Bay Colony jurisdiction.
- 1662-First white native of Old Orchard Beach Richard Rogers, is born.
- 1722-Patrick Googins' arrives with his blushing bride to claim the Old Orchard in their name and becomes the first permanent settler. Many of his descendants remain among us.
- 1740-Settlement of the town. About 30 or 40 families settle in the town, some of the more prominent being the Banks', Jameson's, Patterson's, Milliken's, Mean's and Googins'.
- 1775-Revolutionary War soldiers march on foot with the men of Scarborough In Colonel Edmund Phinney's 31st Continental Regiment.
- 1777-John Googins is killed at the battle of Hubbardstown, New York, on July 7, 1777, while his mother, over 300 miles away in Old Orchard, goes thru the same agonizing death throes as her son at Hubbardstown.
- 1780-Great forest fires ravage all surrounding area but leave the Old Orchard unscathed.
- 1790-Staples Inn is built. The original farmhouse still stands and forms a part of the present day Staples Inn, located at 8 Portland Avenue.
- 1798-Residents petition Selectmen of the present-day city of Saco, for new and better roads, creating the first rumblings of discontentment and the beginning of ill feelings between residents and the City of Saco.
- 1814-Great crowds of men and boys gather here to see the British man-o-war HMS Bulwark land Marines and sailors and burn all of Biddeford Pool. British regard the beach at Old Orchard as a "Fort-Hill."
- 1821-First schoolhouse built at what is now 6 "A" Street. Original building still standing at #30 Summit Street.
- 1842-Portsmouth/Portland Railroad comes to Old Orchard, original station still standing at 15 St. John's Street.
- 1845-Ned Clemens, "The Hermit of Old Orchard", establishes what is today the shore dinner industry; hosts first clambakes and rents first bathing suits. The site of Ned Clemens office was located at 25 West Grand Avenue, where the Old Orchard Bath House used to be, now the site of Jimmy's Ocean Front Parking Lot & Bath House.
- 1853-Benjamin Milliken walks from Old Orchard to Boston to learn the brick-makers trade, returns back to Old Orchard and makes all the bricks and builds the present day Milliken homestead. Popular naming of that section of town is still known as "Milliken's Mills".
- 1861-Civil War-Men of Old Orchard march with the men of Scarborough and serve with the 5th Maine Regiment of Volunteers and the 11th Maine

Regiment of Volunteers, commonly called the "Lawyer's Regiment". Charles Fayette Staples, after whom the local American Legion Post is named, was the best remembered Civil War Veteran.

- 1872-Old Orchard enters its Plush Age. Famous boxer John L. Sullivan, attends clam bakes held in Old Orchard every Sunday during the summer. Boston and Maine Railroad comes to Old Orchard. 10,000 people a day debark at the Campground Station to attend the first of the Campground's "Campmeetings".
- 1881-So-called "Dummy Railroad" established between Old Orchard and Camp Ellis. Joseph Bernier is the 1st Franco-American to establish residence in Old Orchard.
- 1883-FEBRUARY 20-THE PETITION BEARING MANY RESIDENTS NAMES IS RECOGNIZED AND HONORED BY THE STATE LEGISLATURE AND THE NEW TOWN OF OLD ORCHARD IS INCORPORATED AS A SEPARATE AND DISTINCT TOWNSHIP FROM THE PRESENT DAY CITY OF SACO.
- 1888-First horse drawn trolley service inaugurated on July 4, 1888.
- 1892-Old Orchard Kite Track is built. Harness racing reaches its peak in the State of Maine.
- 1898-Old Orchard Ocean Pier is built by the Hildreath family and becomes a familiar landmark. The present day pier stands on the original site.
- 1900-1907-Beginning of the velvet and restful era. Seaside Park is constructed by Wesley Smith. (Now the Hoffman, Foote Streets area).
- 1907-August 15-the blackest day in the history of the town, the most prosperous center of town, over a quarter of the town, is destroyed by fire.
- 1911-In an attempt to revive the economy of the town, automobile races are conducted on the beach, and Captain Harry Jones flies the first airplane seen in Maine.
- 1918-World War 1, the war to end all wars calls 52 of the youth of the town. Edward I. Lord, at 16, is the youngest man to leave the town to go to war.
- 1924-1929-Many famous pilots and planes attempt trans-Atlantic ocean hops. Planes such as "The Dawn", "Old Glory", "Yellow Bird", "Royal Windsor" and "The Spirit of St. Louis" land and take off from the sands of the beach. The name of the town is changed in 1929 to read "OLD ORCHARD BEACH".
- 1930-1935-In an attempt to alleviate the economic plight of the townspeople during the depression years, such events as Marathon road races, dances and flagpole sitters attract thousands here. Many of the famous name dance bands play at the Pier Casino.
- 1941-World War II commences. Three of the town's youth are captured during the fall of Corregidor and Bataan. Two die and the full brunt of the war is brought home to the residents. The population jumps from 200 residents to 4200 nearly overnight, with the influx of shipyard workers living in summer cottages. 582 of the youths of the town answer the call to the colors, and the town mourns the loss of 13 of her men to war. 'G' Company, 181st Regiment of the 26th Division stationed in town mess hall converted into present-day 26 Imperial Street.

- 1947-47 stone houses built in the "Half Way" section of town. York County experiences great fires. Old Orchard Beach remains untouched by flames. 1st Franco/American, Charles E. Huot elected as a selectman in town's history.
- 1948-Roller coaster, Tunnel of Love and many other rides go up in flames. Entire block (present day Palace Playland) destroyed.
- 1950-Town-manager form of government is instituted.
- 1952-W. Warren Harmon retires as town meeting moderator after 25 consecutive years. Town meetings no longer held in the Town Hall, instead they are held in the High School Gym. Harness racing comes to an end with the final closing of Kite Track.
- 1953-Tragedy strikes! Townspeople learn of tragic auto accident involving four High School boys, 2 die, 2 seriously injured.
- 1954-The whole town mourns the lives of the five children of the Whitcomb family who perish in a tragic fire. Townspeople and organizations raise money to build a new home for the parents. Hurricanes "Carol" and "Edna" slam into town in the same month. Water and electricity are shut off in some sections for two weeks.
- 1955-Jameson School is constructed. Fred I. Luce is defeated as town clerk after 41 years in office. Esther Snow Crowley is the 1st woman ever elected to the office of Town Clerk. Fred I. Luce is also remembered for having set out 3/4 of the shade trees lining the streets and avenues of the town, many of which were victims of Dutch Elm disease in the 60's and 70's.
- 1957-Fire Chief "Ted" Mingo retires after 41 years as fire chief. The High School basketball team is a source of great pride as it captures the Western Maine Championship under coach John McSweeney. Jerome G. Plante 1st Franco/American elected to the State Legislature at the young age of 21.
- 1958-Diamond Jubilee year. Thomas Rogers, last surviving member of the original settlers is the honored guest of the town's week-long celebration.
- 1959-Primary sewer treatment plant construction is begun at a cost of one million dollars. One of the 1st type treatments in the State. Because of financial restraints, school building additions are placed on back burner.
- 1960-Greatest football record ever in Old Orchard Beach's history comes to an end. Team loses it first game after 33 straight games without a loss. Robert Morse, Postmaster and survivor of Japanese P.O.W. camps, dies.
- 1961-Special town meeting of June 13 adopts a license, traffic and parking ordinance. New charter is adopted by townspeople. A hurricane in September. Former State Representative and Selectman Herman Gerrish dies.
- 1962-New Post Office building is dedicated May 6. Manager/Selectman form of Government changed to Manager/Council District.
- 1963-90 years of railroad passenger service to Old Orchard Beach ends. Herbert R. Bean, High School principal retires after 29 years of service.

- 1964-Sewer treatment plant completed. Police and Fire Departments are placed under Civil Service. A zoning law is adopted. "Cascade Highlands" development is begun. Jerome LePelletier becomes 1st Old Orchard Beach High School graduate to become High School Principal.
- 1965-After 83 years the Town-meeting form of Government is replaced by the Town-meeting-Representative form of Government. The old style town meeting gavel comes down for the last time March 6th. Jerome G. Plante appointed Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 1966-Once again fire strikes and brings tragedy to the town when arsonists burn the "Federal School" on September 13th. As a result students are forced to go to double sessions.
- 1967-New Junior High School is erected to replace the "Federal School" and named Loranger Memorial School in honor of the late Charles A. Loranger, school board member, former teacher and coach.
- 1968-Fourteen of the last "Good-Old-Days"-style hotels are demolished in order to usher in the day of "the Motels". "The Lookout Hotel" (formerly the Revere House) is demolished. Present day Swiss Colony Motel is located on this site
- 1969-Many of the town's famous landmarks are lost to fire: "The Slide". "Noahs Ark", "The Coal Mine" and the "Merry-Go-Round". Flames are seen as far away as Westbrook on July 19th. Ann E. Pennell becomes the first woman ever elected to the town council.
- 1970-A new Public Works Department garage is completed on the Smiths Wheel Road. All Public Works Department vehicles are replaced.
- 1971-Naval Reserve Training is established at the High School. Town Clerk refuses to re-apportion voter districts.
- 1972-The format of the town report is changed to make it a valuable Historical collectors' edition. After much discussion, the town dump is relocated across the street on the Smiths Wheel Road.
- 1973-"Ocean Pines" in Ocean Park is established as a community for the elderly. The town and the Historical Society accept a most generous gift bequeathed by W. Warren Harmon, his residence, as a historical museum for the Town.
- 1974-Looking to the future the town purchases many acres of the old Titcomb Farm in order to have land for construction of a new high school and a Public Safety Complex. Town bicentennial committee is established.
- 1975-The old Foss Homestead (1836) is moved to make room for a Public Safety Complex and becomes Superintendent of Schools office. The first local boy, James Angelosante, to be appointed to West Point is a great source of pride to the town. New 100 ft. American LaFrance ladder truck is the pride of the fire department.
- 1976-A plaque is placed on Veterans War Memorial in honor of the townsmen killed in the Revolutionary War. Local Art Association finds first permanent home in the old fire barn section of the Town Hall.
- 1977-A replica of Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis lands on the sands of Old Orchard Beach marking 50 years since "Lucky Lindy" was here himself in 1927. Old Town Hall Auditorium converted to new Council Chambers.

- 1978-The famed "Pier Casino" is devoured by the angry seas during a fierce February storm. New charter revision is rejected by townspeople. John McSweeney, former teacher and coach, is elected to legislature. Town receives \$250,000 State-Federal Grant of Recreation/Sports Complex. Seaward boundary of town is extended 500' to facilitate for future pier construction. Secondary treatment facility commences operation.
- 1979-Volunteers plant 1 mile of dune grass with \$40,000 federal grant.
- 1980-New High School is opened January 7th. The new pier is re-opened June 7th, replacing the original 1898 pier. First family housing project (Pine-Brook Terrace) located off Saco Avenue is erected. Old High School opened in 1937 located on Saco Avenue is renovated and becomes Junior High School.
- 1981-Town experiences the coldest winter in 100 years. The town's 1st Composting Facility is constructed on Dirigo Drive, at the cost of \$410,000. Lifeguard Championship won by Old Orchard Beach Lifeguards in Statewide competition.
- 1982-Great snowstorm occurs on April 7th. Centennial Committee formed in June. The old High School (1881) on School Street is torn down in 3 1/2 hours. The Gables Inn (Thomas Goodall Estate) located between Bay Avenue and Pearl Street is demolished to make way for 1st condominium on the beach front. Town's own shoreland zoning ordinance approved by State Agencies.
- 1982-Centennial Place (School Street) opens its doors for our senior citizens. 350 townspeople gather for a Centennial dinner on February 20th--the exact date of the Town's founding 100 years ago.

IN MEMORIAM

W. Warren Harmon

1887-1974

The Old Orchard Beach Historical Society was incorporated on November 10, 1954. Among the original members, W. Warren Harmon and his wife, Grace Wales Harmon, then living at 4 Portland Avenue, were active and loyal supporters. Warren was an active businessman for over fifty years and was elected moderator at twenty-five Town Meetings, from 1928 to 1952. He was also elected Town Treasurer in 1915 and was appointed in 1920 as Town Treasurer. He was held in high esteem and respect for his fairness to everyone with whom he had dealings, in addition to being a participant in many civic activities as well as founder of the American Legion Post. Upon his death on January 22, 1974, at age 87, he added to his honorable record of community service by making the Town and the Historical Society a principal beneficiary of his Will. The Town Council and the Historical Society accepted the bequests in February 1974. The Harmon residence thus became the property of the Town and has now been designated the Harmon Memorial.

- 1933 Marathon dances the rage at the Casino on the Pier.
- 1938 Trolley system from OOB to Biddeford - Saco phased out.
- 1940 Pqpopulation 2,557. Decade of the Big Bands attracts the best to the Pier.
- 1943 The Old Orchard House, a landmark built in 1876, is razed.
- 1948 Roller coaster and other rides go up in flames.
- 1949 CHAMBER OF COMMERCE INCORPORATED**
- 1953 Final horse race held at old Kite Track.
- 1955 Edith Belle Libby Memorial Library opens on Staples St.
- 1963 Passenger train service to OOB phased out as depot is demolished.
- 1969 Another major fire destroys Pier entrance and other popular attractions.
- 1970 Population at 5,404.
- 1978 February storm destroys last remains of old Pier.
- 1980 Pier rebuilt to length of 475 feet.

AMVETS Post #5 Old Orchard Beach was named for Gideon Abbott and Roger Verville, who gave their lives on the famous Bataan Death March.

Post #5 was chartered March 1, 1951 with 53 Charter Members. In a few months we were Incorporated in the State of Maine.

The first Commander of the Post was Joseph Angis. An Auxiliary was formed May 1, 1952 with 19 Chartered Members.

On January 25, 1956 the fun group of AMVETS (Sad Sacks) was formed with 15 members.

Some of the programs and activities of the Post were as follows:

Donation of flags to schools, sponsored Boy Scouts, Little Town League Baseball, Little Bowling League, and now Special Olympics Bowling and Winter Games.

In December of 1957 we published a Post newspaper that was mailed to all Post members.

The post was going great guns until sometime in 1970 when the Post started to build an addition on the Post home. Someone forgot to get a building permit, and when they went to get one, the Building Inspector refused to give them one. This went on for about a year or so with the Zoning Board and Appeals Board, until August of 1972 when the headlines in the paper said Beach AMVETS Officers to be sentenced August 18. That is when we had to move our addition to the Post Home. Shortly after that we sold our Post Home.

We are still meeting every month at members homes.

The Old Orchard Beach Pier originated in 1898, when the prominent families of Staples, Milliken, Yates, and Porter collectively financed its construction. The Berlin Iron Bridge Company of Berlin, Connecticut erected the 1770 foot structure at a cost of \$40,000.00. The Pier became a center for dancing, vaudeville, and fishing, as well as a stopping point for Boston-to-Portland passenger liners. One dollar could afford one an all-day sail departing from and returning to Old Orchard's new landmark.

The Pier met its first real physical test on December 4, 1898, when a Northeastern storm threw the remains of the 40 foot schooner Grecian Bend against its seabound end. The lavish pavillion, after only its first season as a premier docking and dancing spot, tumbled into the Atlantic, along with 150 feet of steel pier, the wreckage to be washed upon the Saco Bay shores for miles.

The White City Pavillion was reconstructed in 1899, and the Pier withstood the elements until the Great Fire of 1907 consumed 100 feet of the shore end. In 1909, however, a March storm once again took the Pavillion and several hundred feet of the Pier. The magnificent steel structure was reduced to 700 feet, with a Casino erected at its end.

In 1913, John W. Duffy purchased the White Way and the Pier, and brought the Big Band sounds and dancing to the remodeled Casino. Throughout the 20's and 30's, The Old Orchard Pier and Casino hosted such magnificent talent as Guy Lombardo, Rudy Valle, Duke Ellington, Xavier Cugat, Woody Herman, and Buddy Rich. During this period, Old Orchard became "cosmopolitan" and "hip".

The war period of the 40's saw a turn to game, food, and souvenir concessions on the pier. For the next thirty years the Pier was instrumental in creating a resort town that would entertain millions each year.

On July 19, 1969, fire destroyed the famed White Way and much of the Pier, which stubbornly refused to succumb entirely. Through the 70's, the Pier garnered its highest patronage, though it was never fully restored. Finally, on February 7, 1978, an intense storm brought the Pier down completely, with pilings and debris washed up in the square area.

June 7, 1980, saw the completion of a new 485 wooden Pier, under the ownership of John Duffy's granddaughter, Catherine Duffy Petit. A first-class restaurant, Kate's, replaced the Casino at the Pier's end. Civic leaders deemed the reconstruction a positive facelift for a community committed to improvement.

The Sandbar Inn sits on the former site of a fruitstand owned and operated by Sam Stroumbas. During World War II, Mr. Stroumbas replaced the stand with a restaurant called "Victory Grill." Following the war, "Victory Grill" was purchased by the late David K. Marshall, a prominent local attorney who served as chairman of the Maine Public Utilities Commission. Marshall in turn sold the restaurant in 1950. The purchasers included Mary Stroumbas Morsey, daughter of Sam Stroumbas. The restaurant was remodeled in 1955 and renamed The Sandbar Inn.

Teddy and Mary Morsey now operate the Inn on a year-round basis, with cocktails and dancing nightly.

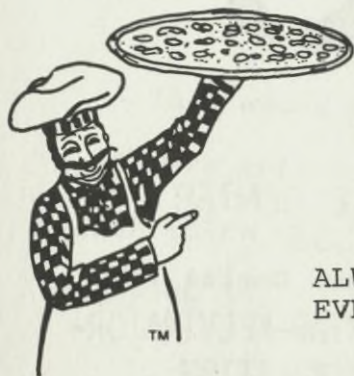

The Seashore Guest House was originally part of the Brunswick Hotel, built in the latter part of the nineteenth century.

In 1965 it was purchased by the present owners, Gerard and Georgette Proulx, who say of their experience in Old Orchard Beach: "We have enjoyed our 18 years in business here and have acquired, during that time, motels, guest houses and cottages to accommodate families as we enjoy our own family atmosphere with our 91- and 95-year old parents. SAINT MARGARET'S CHURCH

The Catholic presence in Old Orchard Beach is almost as old as the Town itself. The first Catholic Sunday Mass ever publicly celebrated here was offered in July 1892 at Porter's Hall by the Rev. T.P. Lineham, pastor of St. Mary's Church in Biddeford. Prior to that, Catholic residents and tourists would travel to Biddeford by horse and carriage, trolley car or train to attend mass. Subsequently, masses were said in the old Ocean House (on the site of the present Town Hall) and in what was the Odd Fellows Hall. It is now Molko's Department Store.

In 1895, a small wooden summer church was erected on the site of the present church and named in honor of St. Margaret, Queen of Scotland. Until the great fire of August 1907, people would come to church in the buckboards or carryalls that were standard equipment at all the large hotels. Dress was formal. Ladies wore lace gowns, picture hats adorned with flowers or plumes, and white kid gloves. Gentlemen wore white flannels and straw hats or panamas. Women carried parasols; men, canes. The fires marked the end of that era of conspicuous elegance, but not of Old Orchard Beach, for the summer visitors came in even greater numbers, and St. Margaret's flourished.

In 1921, St. Margaret's was officially separated from St. Mary's parish -- under whose care it had been -- to become a charge of the Cathedral in Portland. Three years later, heat was installed, and the church was operated year-round. Soon thereafter in 1926, St. Margaret's was named a parish, with Father James J. Mullen as its first pastor. In the 57 years since then, it has had only five pastors: Father Mullen, until his death in 1954; Father Edward J. Walsh, until his death in 1962; the then Monsignor Edward C. O'Leary, present Bishop of Portland, from 1963 to 1967; Father John H. Clancy, until 1978; and, the present pastor, Father Laurent Laplante. Great strides were made during that time: the parish acquired a rectory, a parish center, and a convent to house the Sisters of the Holy Rosary who, since 1963, have supervised the religious education program; the church was twice renovated and enlarged, and two new summer chapels were constructed, St. Jude's in 1957 and St. Luke's in 1968; and, most important, membership increased to the present 950 families. When St. Margaret's three churches are considered with the Town's six Protestant churches and one synagogue, it does not seem unreasonable to conclude that God is alive and well and, in a very real sense, living in Old Orchard Beach.

OCEAN HOUSE MOTEL

Built at the turn of the century, the Ocean House was part of Old Orchard Beach's grand era of elegance. The two large downstairs parlors originally served as dining room.

Ladies in long gowns and gentlemen in formal evening attire would come down to a many-coursed dinner following which the tables would be removed and the chairs arranged along the walls; the orchestra would strike up and an evening of waltzing would begin.

When first constructed, the Ocean House was a 2½ story guest house. In about 1904, John C. Pierce, after whom the adjacent street was named, purchased the buildings and enlarged it somewhat. A few years later, Pierce and a new partner, Lyman Abbott, Sr., raised the building and constructed a new first floor, thus creating the 3½ story structure that stands today. In about 1907, Abbott bought out his partner and continued in ownership until 1940, when illness forced him to sell to William Clark. Roland Sylvestre was the next purchaser in 1945. He in turn sold to Alfred and Emelda Paul in 1961.

From time to time today, the hotel's public rooms are again alive with music and dancing by formally dressed guests -- a junior prom for Mr. Sylvestre's son in 1950, a wedding reception for Mrs. Paul's daughter in 1979 -- but, by and large, the parlors are just parlors, no longer ballrooms. Still, many of the hotel's lovely original features remain -- the stately welcoming fireplace, the sunny reading room filled with old volumes. Concessions have been made to present-day tastes: a swimming pool replaces the croquet playing-area and 34 modern motel units complement the hotel rooms. Certainly no one would trade today's casual summer-vacation styles for the strict formality that prevailed in 1900. But it's pleasant now and then to sit back in a parlor chair reminiscing of a more leisurely time and listening for the strains of a long-ago waltz.

JIM AND MAXINE POURAVELIS

Two Seaside Avenue

New Year's Eve 1980 was the first night we spent in our house, long known as "Sunny-bank." Dating from the early 1900's, the house served as a summer residence for a succession of owners: Miss Shea, Miss Tetreault, and her sister, Mrs. Bonenfant, the Egans. But it's the winters that the year-rounders remember this house for -- generation after generation of neighborhood children have slid down the bank on which the house sits. To this day, after a good snowfall, the children come. Peter Gregory used to slide here as a boy; now he brings his four-year-old daughter. Soon our own two-year-old, Claudia, will join them -- and on and on it will go.

JIM'S OCEANFRONT PARKING

25 West Grand Avenue

Early in the century, the property at 25 West Grand Avenue now known as Jim's Oceanfront Parking consisted of a parking lot and the popular Old Orchard Beach Bath House. To the daytrippers from nearby stops along the Boston & Maine Railroad line who would step off the train carrying a change of clothes and a picnic basket, the changing rooms and showers at the bathhouse were an indispensable part of a day at the beach. From 1948 to his death in 1963, Elias Pouravelis leased and managed the bathhouse with the help of his sons, Tom and Jim. After the death of his father, Jim continued to run the operation -- adding for a time a trampoline center. In 1970 he and two friends purchased the property outright from its owner, the Goulet estate, and tore down the aging bathhouse. The parking lot was repaved and a new building constructed containing a light-lunch restaurant and, yes, changing rooms and showers. It seems that three-quarters of a century later, people still bring a change of clothes and a picnic basket for a day at the beach.

The Funeral Home was founded in 1961 by ROGER A. TOUSIGNANT, who is a descendant of the first known French pioneer settler in the State of Maine, FRANCOIS VIOLETTE. In 1791, Mr. Violette settled at Violette Brook, which is now Van Buren.

The main portion of the building was built in 1898 by FRANK H. LIBBY. Mr. Libby and his wife EDITH BELLE LIBBY, occupied it as a residence until Mr. Libby's death in 1944. Mrs. Libby died in 1940.

Laura Z. Dean, who was a beneficiary of Mr. Libby's estate, sold the homestead to Barbara Stroumbas in November of 1944. Mrs. Stroumbas and her husband Anastasius (Sam) and their family occupied the premises as their residence until the present owner purchased it in 1961.

In 1964 his wife, MARY C. (VERRILL) TOUSIGNANT became a joint owner of the property.

The last will and testament of Mr. Libby directed the trustee of his estate, York National Bank of Saco, to have the land, now used as a parking lot, accepted by the town of OOB for the erection and equipment of a public library which was to be known as "EDITH BELLE LIBBY LIBRARY". Under authority of the Supreme Judicial Court of the State of Maine, on a bill of equity, the Trustee sold the parcel to Barbara Stroumbas. Mr. Tousignant purchased this site at the same time as the residence in 1961.

In 1860 Nathaniel Brown purchased this property from Ebenezer Staples. The home which now stands at 34 Portland Avenue was known as "Pine Cottage" and presently houses a law office and the home of Clifford and Barbara Holman. The present owners, Roger and Mary Tousignant, purchased the property from Doris Jones in 1970.

THE BRUNSWICK HOTEL

The Brunswick Hotel, built in 1912 by Mary J. Hutchinson, doubtlessly has a rich history; but some say the best is yet to come. For, in this Centennial year, the hotel has been purchased from the Garneau family by Ronald Boutet, and plans for its conversion into a condominium have been announced.

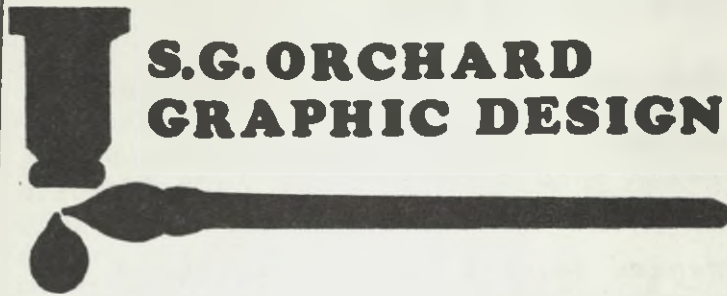
Situated near the center of Old Orchard Beach's 7-mile stretch of sand, the large, white, 4-story building has long been one of the Town's most easily recognized landmarks. When present plans reach fruition, the Brunswick should be even more distinctive. The hotel building itself will be stripped to its frame and wholly renovated; another floor will be added and the resultant 5-story building will house 26 one- and two-bedroom condominium apartments. A new elevator will service floors 2-5. The 34-unit motel that now sits on the beach side of West Grand Avenue will be moved to the opposite side of the street, freeing up the land on which it is now located for parking. Both the apartments and the motel units will be available for summer rentals by the newly organized Brunswick Management Company.

Exciting renovations are also planned for the Brunswick's present ground-floor restaurant and lounge. A new 100-seat Class A restaurant, "Lindbergh's Landing," will trace Old Orchard Beach's aviation history in its decor. Its glass front should permit a panoramic view of the Town's famous landing strip. An intimate pub, "Pilot's Lounge," and a larger entertainment lounge, the "Old Orchard Room" are also on the drawing board, along with an outside bar, "Seaside Cafe."

If work proceeds on schedule, all should be completed in time for a grand opening in the Town's Centennial year. One of the centennial Committee's stated objectives is "to lay a foundation for the Town's purposeful development in the next 100 years." At the Brunswick, that objective is being taken literally.
