Dear Sir,

I trust you will pardon the liberty I take in addressing you, but failing to obtain, from what I presumed were the proper sources (viz. The Adjutant General & The Secretary of State) the information I desire, I have ventured to apply at Head Quarters.

In June last immediately after the Maine 4th Regt left Rockland, I forwarded to the Department a bill due Capt S. M. Fuller, C. S. together with an order from Capt S. directing payment of the same when allowed to me at Belfast, and my enquiries have been relative to this claim,

Whether it has been allowed? and if so, what course I should pursue to obtain the amount? and in each instance have recd no reply to my inquiries.

In addressing the above named officials I may have overstepped the bounds of propriety, if so I most humbly beg pardon, & plead the sin of ignorance in excuse. But if I have not, and am entitled to a reply to my inquiry I would most respectfully ask the fate of Capt S.'s claim, and the prospect of its settlement.
