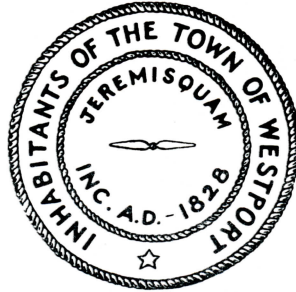
All taxpayers should read the following requirement and comply with it:

Section 35. Assessors to give notice to bring in lists of taxable property; if no lists are brought in, no claim for abatement.

Chapter 81, Section 35, Revised
Statutes of Maine, 1944.

"Before making an assessment, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting notifications in some public place in the town, or shall notify them, in such other way as the town directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all their estates real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the assessors or the county commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayer."

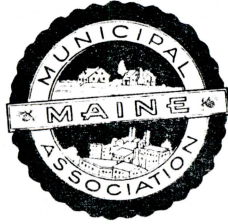

Westport for the year 1966.

Public health nursing in the Town of Westport was offered by a member of the staff of the Division of Public Health Nursing. Your nurse provided nursing care, health counseling, and served families through planning to meet health needs. The nursing activities included participation in your school health program and management of child health conferences. The nursing care emphasis was placed on prevention of disease, promotion of health and rehabilitation.

Your nurse assisted the community to receive needed immunization and medical appraisal for pre-school age children at Wiscasset Child Health Conferences during the summer months. Parents were also notified of their child's need for immunization according to their health program. The nurse made a home visit to promote maternal health, infant and pre-school health. When special health needs were known to the nurse, she made home visits as indicated. Twenty-seven persons were visited by the nurse during ten visits to the town.

Sincere appreciation is extended to those persons who volunteered time and service to help during the health activities. The cooperation of town officers, school personnel, and physicians is acknowledged.

TOWN OF WESTPORT

FEBRUARY 16, 1965 TO FEBRUARY 12, 1966

An audit has been completed of the financial records of the Town of Westport for the fiscal year ended February 12, 1966. The audit included an examination of the records maintained by the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector and other municipal officials.

The operations for the year showed that the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed amounted to \$1,199.54, per the following summary:

The overlay and an unexpended balance in the contingent account were the principal factors contributing to the amount lapsed to surplus.

* * * *

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements and to the scope of audit.

ASSETS The general cash balance of \$4,614.62 was on deposit in the Canal National Bank, Bath, Maine at February 12, 1966. Petty cash and bounty funds were on hand.

Taxes receivable of \$235.05 represented unpaid current year accounts. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$131.98 and \$653.89 respectively.

LIABILITIES, RESERVES AND SURPLUS The departmental accounts showed a net unexpended balance of \$341.03 carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or by authority of the municipal officers.

Comments Continued

Town of Westport

Excise tax collections of \$676.56 are reserved for future allocation by the townspeople.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$4,652.95, an increase of \$666.54 for the year. The change was occasioned by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed less an authorized transfer to the state aid road account.

DEBT FUND The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects school bus notes of \$2,695.00. These notes mature during the next three years at varying rates of interest.

DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS The departmental accounts showed an increase of \$1,526.84 in funds raised by taxation, as compared with the preceding year. A larger appropriation for town roads was the major factor contributing to the increase.

The departmental balances carried forward decreased by \$3,850.21, as compared with balances at the start of the year. This change occurred principally in the highway and education accounts.

GENERAL The townspeople authorized the use of 1965 excise tax revenue for the contingent account and a transfer from surplus to the state aid road account.

It is again recommended that the townspeople establish annually the amount of compensation to be paid to each municipal official.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recorded cash transactions.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined for a selected period. Verifications were utilized, on a test basis, to determine the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Excise tax collections were checked with copies of receipts retained by the collector. Surety bond coverage was examined.
