# Castle Island Camps: A Tradition of Fishing and Families and Fun

hen the tradition is fishing and family vacationing there's an oasis – a scenic, compact island – in the Belgrades on Long Pond where the best of the past has left its mark for today's clientele to enjoy that old sporting camp feel without being in the middle of nowhere.

"It's a different type of clientele," says owner John Rice who with his wife, Rhonda, purchased the historic (1929) Castle Island Camps in 2002, explaining that third and fourth generation guests who come to Castle Island for the fishing in May and June bring their families in July and August "just looking for a Maine vacation."

They enjoy the feel of home, the meals prepared by John and Rhonda, the presence of daughters, Lydia 16, Lizzie 14 and Paige 9, who have grown up at Castle Island, and the updates that John and Rhonda have accomplished.

Since purchasing the property the Rices have fully renovated eleven out of the twelve unique waterside cabins, plus the Rice's own living space and the lodge, changes that the guests like, but admit guardedly.

"It's still Castle Island," John says, and that's what they want. "They want to give their children (and grandchildren) the same experiences they had."

bass, pike and salmon. "It's our best salmon year since we've been here," John says.

Guests bring their own boats or rent them at Castle Island. They can also rent kayaks. But many of them just come to enjoy the lake views, the docks, the relaxation and the hosts.

"One of the best things about Castle Island is the people who come here," explains Rhonda. "We were both social workers focused on running the business. It's the little interpersonal connections that are special."

Castle Island Camps is located in the Narrows between upper Long Pond and lower Long Pond on the road from Belgrade to Mount Vernon. It is near the Long Pond Public Boat Launch and near the Long Pond bridge which is popular for land fishing. In addition to the regular overnight guest lodging with meals, Castle Island Camps sells bait, tackle and gas, and rents boats and kayaks. For information call 495-3312.

## Legacies

The facts: Loons mate for life, or at least for seven years, but they don't spend the winters together. They are visual fishers - can see underwater with their red eyes. They do not compete with fishermen, but prefer junk fish. Both sexes look identical. They are federally protected. And they are a Maine treasure.

There were, according to the Maine Audubon Society loon count, 3,302 adult loons and 661 chicks living in the southern half of the state in 2011. Loons need four conditions to survive: clear water, fish, a nesting place, and a nursery. So far Maine offers these conditions.

Loons are water birds. Their legs are set way back in the body and act like propellers, their breast is very big to weight them down, and there is no air space in their bones. They can walk on land only with the aid of their wings. A loon sticks its head under water to look for fish, dives, chomps the fish to stun it, then surfaces and swallows it whole. Chicks are fed live, not regurgitated, food and parents later teach them to fish by stunning minnows and dropping them in the water in front of the chick.

Loons return to the same nesting area. As soon as ice goes out they fly in, make their nest near the water, mate, and lay one or two eggs. They share nesting. If an egg gets lost in the water, the loon often lays another but if it dies in hatching, she won't. Two eggs will hatch 24 hours apart. The parents take the first chick, after it is dry, to the nursery. They will check on the second egg but not stay with it.

Young chicks ride on the parents for protection and warmth. In the fall they fly to the coast for four years. Their life expectancy is 25-30 years, the average 16.

Loons die primarily from two causes – lead poisoning and a fungus, and attacks by eagles.

Loons have four calls: wail (communication), tremolo (fright), yodel (male territorial), and hoot (talking). The tremolo is the only one done in the air. The yodel is not the same for any two males (just like fingerprints).

Loons like to waggle their legs in the air. After

the chicks are reared the adults often gang together – called rafting. They winter on the coast from Maine to Georgia. And the ladies always take off first in the fall.



# Milfoil Matters

## How is the Milfoil Being Removed and What Does it All Cost?

The heart of the 2012 STOP MILFOIL Action Plan is the field work that is being conducted in Great Meadow Stream and North Bay of Great Pond. Two primary control methods are being employed. The first is digging up and removing the entire milfoil plant including the plant roots. The second is laying down benthic barriers, large pieces of geotextile material weighted with rebar, on the bottom to prevent the plants from growing back

This work is being done by two teams. The first is New England Milfoil, a professional dive company based in Brownfield, Maine. They have three divers in the water hand digging the milfoil and an operator stationed on their Diver Assisted Suction Harvester or "DASH" boat. This specialized piece of equipment uses a pump attached to long flexible hoses to vacuum up the milfoil plants that have been dug out by the divers and flush them into fine mesh bags for disposal. The DASH boat significantly increases the productivity of the divers.

The second team is made up of Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance (BRCA) summer employees and a Colby College summer intern. They are hand pulling milfoil in the more difficult areas where it is intertwined with native vegetation and installing the benthic barriers. Two members of this team are also surveying both Great and Long Pond looking for plant fragments and new milfoil infestations. good news is that to date they have not found any milfoil growing outside of North Bay and Great Meadow Stream.

## STOP MILFOIL CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The reality is all this work costs money, lots of it. It appears now that approximately \$250,000 will be spent this year to remove the milfoil from Great Meadow Stream and North Bay, and to increase public awareness of the milfoil infestation.

To raise this money the Milfoil Task Force launched the "BLA --STOP MILFOIL" Capital Campaign last March. All donations go into a special account and are only being used to fund this milfoil work. To date, \$154,470 has been raised. Much more is needed.

2012 is a critical year in this fight against milfoil both in terms of controlling the infestation and funding the work. By removing 90-95% of the plant material this summer we should be able to control it next year with less work and

But if we don't stop it right now, the whole infestation will get much worse both in terms of the milfoil spreading throughout our lakes and the costs of trying to manage it.

#### YOUR SUPPORT IS NEEDED

The community really needs to step up right now. Help is needed in two critical areas. The first is for volunteers in kayaks and canoes to net and remove milfoil plant fragments in North Bay and Great Meadow Stream. Here's why this is so important. New England Milfoil will continue pulling milfoil through the end of September but the BRCA team members will wrap up their work by the end of August when they go back to college. That means volunteers are going to have to step in for the whole month of September to net fragments around the work site to make sure they don't get out into the lake and cause new infestations. If you can volunteer please call BRCA Milfoil Program Coordinator, Toni Pied at 207 512-5554.

Additional funds are also needed to pay for the milfoil mitigation work. Over 200 individu-

als have donated to date. Their support is greatly appreciated. If you haven't given yet, please consider making a donation. Every gift helps. #### **GREAT POND ACTION PLAN UPDATE**

Working primarily in Great Meadow Stream, New England Milfoil removed 3,880 gallons of milfoil last week. The BRCA team hand pulled an additional 1600 gallons. To date this summer, 27,880 gallons have been removed. That's almost 9 times the total that was removed in 2010 and 2011 combined.

Tew people living along the Kennebec River today can trace their family genes back to the late 1700s but Alice Ballard Buck is one who can. Her father, the late Robert Ballard, was the seventh generation of midwife Martha Ballard's descendants. In spite of the length of time elapsed, those who know Alice Buck feel she is just as "historic." Of course, she has not been recorded in history as was the lady more than 200 years ago but Alice Ballad Buck is as well known today as her ancestor was in her day!

Alice was interested in the health of her family and friends so studied nursing once out of high school and followed that talent until she married and had a family. When the kids were off to school, she was behind the counter at Boynton's Market on Water Street in Hallowell aiding Jake and Lorraine Baker for many years.

Today her world is far different but she is often seen at the NEW Boynton's Market just next door. Same Alice, same smile, same interest in answering questions and helping find something you need. That aspect of this unique Lady has never changed.

As with Martha Ballad, I suspect, Alice has faced difficult times but one story I have permission to recount assures us that Alice always sees the cup more than half full and never half empty.

Just before the last months of the original Boynton's Market closed, her delightful daughter, Karen, was the manager. The entire Hallowell community was awed when it was announced the store was closing one February for repairs. Weeks passed and the store did not open. Then tragically it was learned that Karen had passed away – very unexpectedly one night. Not only was the Buck family stunned, the entire city was as well.

A gathering was easily planned for all who wanted to attend - a simple service on the lawn of the family home atop Winthrop Hill overlooking the sky and fields across the road. It was truly a beautiful site. Prayers, memories, witty and many admiring comments were provided by family, friends, local clergy and even the local animals that were part of the Buck

A few days later I stopped in to see Alice. We chatted a bit and then she told me a story.

"Katy, remember that guy who spoke? Well, when he came back from the burial service at the cemetery he asked to speak to me. He told me that he put a pack of cards and a cribbage board into the casket before it was placed in the ground – he did that and told Karen 'Tonight, dear Karen, you and your Dad enjoy a game of cribbage together!""

With that Alice wiped her eyes and provided her usual smile.

Alice Ballad Buck was honored one year as the Hallowell "Citizen Of The Year." People who know Alice truly believe she is the model of a person who makes this unique 250-year-old city a "Genuine Maine Community."



## Belgrade's Town House

Or was it like this originally in 1815?

ne of Belgrade's earliest remaining structures, the "Town House", is now a topic of conversation. Think "cemetery." In its modesty, it is hidden in the middle of Town...a small square building, white with green metal roof, sitting at the road side of Woodside Cemetery, the oldest of the three town cemeteries which stretch between Routes 11 and 27.

The only building owned by the Town since 1815, it was used for town meetings until 1872 and for voting until about 1962. At various times it provided shelter for an Indian recovering from smallpox, visitors to the cemeteries, the horse-drawn hearse, lawn mowers, and most recently, a raccoon (not inside).

Town business was transacted here, as can be seen by scribbles on the lime-plaster wall. Lawrence Sturtevant, town sexton, was proud of the original wide-board horizontal wainscot in his office. We hope it is still there, just covered with modern panelling.

Remnants of that wainscot can be seen behind an enormous steel water tank inside the north wall of the Town House. For years water was pumped for cemetery lots from Hamilton Pond, under Route 27 and up the hill into the tank. Old town reports record frequent problems with the pump or the piping. A well now supplies water in the cemetery.

Every Memorial Day outdoor services are held from the small porch which was added to the front of the Town House in the 1930's.

And now the Belgrade Historical Society hopes to restore this building, one of the earliest town halls in Maine, and call it home for its small collection of historical artifacts, papers and Belgrade memorabilia. The Board of Selectmen voted to allow the Historical Society to restore and to use the Town House at their own expense. The Town will continue to own and maintain the integrity of the building.

## The Good, the Bad & the Wicked Cute!

es, I know the title of this ■ week's article is supposed to read, "The Good, The Bad & The Ugly" after the 1966 film starring Clint Eastwood and Eli Wallach. In the movie these guys were rough and tumble characters that didn't trust each other during their search for hidden gold in a remote ceme-It was a western classic designed to highlight tough guys, tumbleweeds and beef jerky. But did you look at the photo attached to this article?? Did you? How can you use the word ugly when you have a 7-year old boy with a smile like that? And to top it off, you have one proud dad helping to hold the fish. Seriously, that picture would make Clint Eastwood smile, or at least he'd think about grinning.

The bottom line is that Travis (dad) and Josh (kid) were focused on some serious father/son time on the water. What we didn't realize is that Josh was a natural fisherman. Seriously, this kid can flat out fish

and it's obvious he inherited his skills from his father! We arrived at our fishing spot early in the morning and Josh was ready. We had four poles rigged and loaded with a tube jig, 2 Senkos and a top water lure. The fishing poles we were using were 7-foot Cabelas Pro Guide series with 8 pound fluorocarbon line, designed for long casts. Bottom line is, young Josh caught 5 fish on his first five casts! Seriously – and he kept catching fish throughout the morning. Travis caught his share, too, but honestly we were both focused on the young boy. There was something special about watching young Josh learn to cast and set the hook and reel in his fish. It was one of those days you wished never ended and who knows, we might see that kid on the BASS tournament someday.

So that explains the "cute" in the title, but how about the good. Well, the good is the fact that big smallmouth bass live in the Belgrade Lakes, and they have been hitting hard and often. Honestly, I can't remember such good smallmouth fishing in the heat of the summer. Ask Dave Mallui who summers over on Great Pond down by Blueberry Island. This past week, he caught his personal best smallie on a hot July day. The bass was fooled by a wacky worm in about 12 feet of water. The interesting thing about Dave's trip was the fishing was pretty stale. They really were not biting well, but the fish that did bite were big! Sometimes it's a nice compromise to catch big fish instead of a lot of fish. Both Dave and I agreed – we were fine with that! During the course of our morning's fishing, Dave caught and released a

few nice bass and caught and "quick released" a few more. The bigger fish were taking senkos, but the strikes were light and often the fish would shake the hook before getting to the boat. Smallmouth bass are professional hook shakers so anglers need to deal with the disappointment. I call it a "big fish bummer" and it happens to anglers on a daily basis. Fishermen handle the disappointment better when they get to see the bass near the boat or she jumps out of the water and throws the hook. At least you had visual contact (and let's face it, hooking the fish and seeing the fish is just as much fun!). One tip that's helped this summer is to increase your hook size and sharpen your hooks! For wacky worms, I've been throwing 2/0 Gamakatsu octopus hooks. I know it sounds like the hooks are too big, but even the small bass inhale the bait and for the most part the hook set is right in the corner of the mouth. As for sharpening hooks, I use a file designed specifically for fish hooks but any file will work. Every morning while I'm in the boat, I sharpen hooks that have been used. Anglers should sharpen their hooks often because it makes a HUGE difference in

Last Wednesday I was fishing with Simon and his two boys Scott and Adam. They were from the U.K. and we had a great time fishing. On Wednesday we were fishing on one of the Belgrades when a thunderstorm rolled in. It was about noon and our trip was pretty much over (besides, the boys were hungry – as usual). We all reeled in quickly and laughed as the rain came roaring across the lake. OH OH - we're going to get wet! I cranked the motor up and off we ran at about 30 m.p.h, trying to get out of the rain. As we clipped across the lake I saw a movement out in front of the boat - keep in mind that we are in about 100 feet of water and at least a half-mile off the shoreline. Basically we are out in the middle of the lake in a heavily travelled area. To make a long story short, the movement I saw was a young boy swimming across the lake! He was waving toward my boat, but the rain was coming

down so hard he was difficult to see. In all honesty, I could have run him right over, and I thank God I saw him when I did. First emotion was shock, second emotion was fear, and third emotion was anger. Why was a little boy swimming way out here in the middle of a channel during a thunderstorm? There were no boats around him to supervise, and he was almost impossible to see. I lurched back on the throttle and stopped the boat 20 yards in front of the kid (who didn't look more than 12 years old). As we looked through the driving rain, Simon and I were flabbergasted to see two more young boys out there swimming, too! Honestly, with visibility at about 50 feet, being way out in the middle of the lake, swimming with no support boat nearby, a thunderstorm looming, etc, etc -who would have expected that! To say the least we were shaken; and I'm still shaken as I write this. So I'll end this article with "The Ugly" and ask that everyone please make good decisions out there on the water. We live and play in such a beautiful area, and I hope that everyone has a safe and happy summer. Good Luck!

## **Noise Phobias**

onsidering how much noise an average dog can make when he's excited, it is a little ironic how many canines are deeply disturbed by loud noises, like thunder, fireworks and gunshots. Reactions to such noises are not uncommon: loud noises from overhead are difficult to orient to. While many dogs get accustomed to them (habituation), others may become more sensitive, resulting in additional fear with each exposure. When fear escalates to shaking, hiding, howling, running away, house soiling, or downright destruction of the house, the problem can be daunting for owners. In such cases the term "phobia" better describes the pet's reaction. Even normally happy, well adjusted dogs can become full of panic at the sound of thunder or fireworks and can end up hurting themselves, others or their residence.

What can be done to help our canine friends "weather the storm" with less panic? If your dog seems agitated or restless, you may be able to assist him in securing a safe haven and help him relax during storms. Dogs often try to hide to avoid a thunderstorm; this is a normal response. This safe location should be readily available, especially when no one is home. You can try to limit exposure to the overwhelming and fear-evoking noises by closing doors and windows, and using white noise, TV or music to block out the sounds. You can also redirect the dog to alternative and anxiety-incompatible behaviors such as obedience exercises, or fun activities (agility or food puzzle toys). Each dog and family may need to implement different strategies based on their dog's unique response. If your dog shows little or no response to noises, you need not do anything.

For very anxious animals, however, it is essential to reduce anxiety during a storm or firework display to prevent escalation of the anxiety and allow management and treatment options to be successful. Chose interventions based upon the severity of the anxiety and the severity of the noise. A number of non pharmacological alternatives are available that may help calm the moderately fearful dog. intervention (e.g. Pheromone Appeasing Pheromone, Adaptil ® collars, room diffusers and premise sprays) can be used alone or in combination with another intervention. Nutraceutical or natural products such as Composure® treats or Bach's Rescue Remedy may also be beneficial. A promising new product that is becoming widely available is the Thundershirt®, a snug fitting vest that swaddles the dog, giving him the feeling of being securely held, and possibly triggering pressure points that act to calm him.


A dog with severe anxiety may benefit from longterm management with anxiolytic medications (such as fluoxetine or clomipramine) that must be given daily; in addition (or instead), rapidly-acting anxiolytics (similar to Xanax or valium) may be given immediately prior to or even during a storm or firework display. It's important to consult with your veterinarian before giving any prescription medications

to your pets, however.

And try not to forget how exquisitely atuned your canine friend is to your own responses. Don't panic or show your own anxiety during storms to avoid making your dog's anxiety worse. You should try to reassure him to encourage relaxation or direct him with obedience or trick cues. If your dog's anxiety is minimal and he startles but recovers quickly, it may be appropriate for you to ignore him or praise him calmly, reinforcing his natural ability to adapt to noises (habituation). Ignoring severe anxiety or extreme displays when the dog is not likely to adapt naturally is not recommended. If his anxiety persists, seems extreme or your pet is at risk for self injury, be sure to consult a professional.

It should be noted that loud noises per se don't cause a seizure disorder, but they can escalate a problem if the pet is prone to seizures. While thunder and lightning or the sound of fireworks can trigger seizures in a dog, normally the dog has a pre existing or underlying condition, such as epilepsy, that is exacerbated by the fear response. Similarily, dogs with separation anxiety may have a harder time with loud noises. Some dogs are more anxious during thunderstorms when they are alone, and thunderstorm and noise fears are common in dogs with separation anxiety. Planning ahead to make sure your fearful pet is in a safe place and you have the necessary tools to help when bad weather is predicted or fireworks are expected is best.
