## NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

M. R. S. Title 36 Section 706

Before making an assessment, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting notifications in some public place in the town, or shall notify them, in such other way as the town directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all of their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the assessors or the county commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayer.

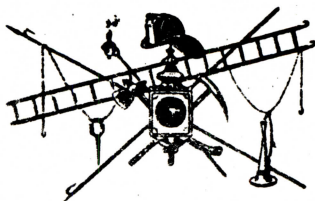

Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Services in Westport  
in the year 1969

Public health nursing in the Town of Westport was offered by a member of the staff of the Division of Public Health Nursing. Your nurse provided nursing care, health counseling, and served families through planning to meet health needs. The nursing activities included participation in your school health program and management of child health conferences. The nursing care emphasis was placed on prevention of disease, promotion of health and rehabilitation.

Immunizations and medical appraisal were offered to all pre-school children at Wiscasset Child Health conferences during the summer months. Parents were notified of their child's needs for immunization according to their health records and these were given in conjunction with the Wiscasset School health program. Home visits consisted of maternal health, infant and pre-school health supervision, and where there have been special health needs known to the nurse. During the six visits to the town fifteen persons were visited.

Sincere appreciation is extended to those persons who volunteered time and service to help during the health activities. The co-operation of town officers, school personnel and physicians is acknowledged.

## Report of The Superintendent of Schools

To the school committee, town officials and other citizens of Westport, I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The 1970 school budget has an overall expenditure of \$39,550.00. This is approximately \$10,000.00 more than our 1969 school budget. The increase is in the tuition account. The number of students has increased considerably.

The Wiscasset School Committee is proposing to adjust the 1970 tuition rates so as to aid those towns such as Westport in their school budgets.

The estimated income for 1970 is \$1,001.08 balance plus \$3,074.00 state aid for a total of \$4,075.08. The 1970 budget requires a local appropriation of \$35,475.00 which is approximately \$9,000.00 more than was raised in 1969.

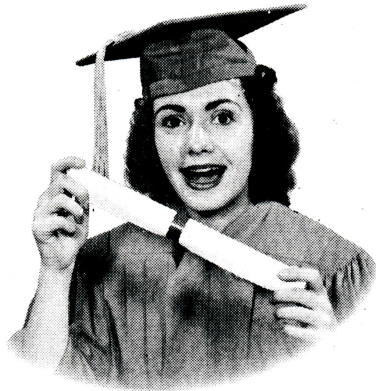

## SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of bank statements and count of cash.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined on a selective basis. Records of town meetings, as pertained to financial matters, were checked. Surety bond coverage was determined.

## OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The fiscal year's operations showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$1,531.77 was lapsed to surplus, per the following summary:

port, Maine, 1956. Scale 1":30', Surveyor M. F. Hammond and recorded in Lincoln County Registry of Deeds, Book 6, Page 43, as a Town Road.

Art. 47. To see if the Town will establish a Conservation Commission pursuant to title 30 MRSA-1964, Sec. 3851 as amended — such Conservation Commission to be comprised of 5 members to be appointed by the Selectmen to serve without compensation for staggered terms of five years each.

Said Commission shall by working with other Conservation Agencies and organizations serve the Town of Westport in an advisory capacity on questions dealing with the protection, improvement and development of the natural resources of the Town.

Art. 48. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday the 21st day of March A. D., 1970 at 8:30 o'clock in the A. M. for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not and have this warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
