NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS
M. R. S. Title 36 Section 706


Before making an assessment, the assessors shall give reasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting notifications in some public place in the town, or shall notify them, in such other way as the town directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all of their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the 1st day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, or any non-resident owner after being reasonably requested thereto by the assessors, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the assessors or the county commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed. The request upon non-resident owners may be proved by a notice sent by mail directed to the last known address of the taxpayer or given by any other method that brings notice home to the taxpayer.

1973 PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Due to the press of increased building and land-use pressures and the passage of a state statute which requires the towns to zone their shoreline area by June of 1973, your planning board has been working for the last six months to implement this state directive. Basically, we have been attempting to put together an ordinance containing protective regulations relating to the use of land on Westport. Since these regulations will affect all of us who own land, both resident and non-resident, we will be holding public meetings to get your reactions, ideas, and opinions concerning the ordinance we plan to present for your eventual approval. It is especially important that we get maximum attendance and participation at these meetings because if we do not regulate ourselves according to a comprehensive plan, the state will do it for us in a manner which may not be the most beneficial to Westport. 1972-73

COMPLETED ACTIVITIES:

1. Took a public stand opposing the Maine Port Authority Bill (LD 1947); presented position paper to State Senators and Representatives. (July 1972)
2. Conducted a regional conservation commission meeting for Edgecomb, Phippsburg, Westport and Woolwich; presented and discussed Ian McHarg's film, "Multiply and Subdue the Earth." (August, 1972)
3. Joined area conservation groups (Chewonki Foundation, Citizens for Safe Power, Phippsburg Shellfish Conservation Commission and Woolwich Conservation Commission) as inter-

venors in the Maine Department of Environmental Protection hearings on the Maine Yankee Atomic Power Plant mixing zone for thermal discharge; retained lawyers to represent us at the hearings; became instrumental in reducing the mixing zone from 2500 requested acres to 25 acres, effective at the end of a two year adjustment period; presented public testimony (Judson Cromwell, Joseph Feely) regarding environmental effects of Nuclear power thermal effects upon Westport Island.

4. Conducted a public meeting for Westport citizens (Aug. 28, 1972)
 - a) Through a panel discussion and open forum, discussed the following environmental issues:
 - 1) Nuclear power, and the Westport Conservation Commission's role in the DEP Hearings.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the school committee, town officials and other citizens of Westport, I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The 1972 school budget has an overdraft of \$451.06. This was due to tuition expenditures being about \$1,400. more than budgeted and there was not money enough left in other accounts to compensate for this. All other accounts were expended as originally planned.

The 1973 school budget has an overall increase of nearly \$10,000. This is due to tuition increases and an increase in the number of students. Because of no balance from 1972 and no increase in state aid, the Town of Westport will need to raise \$49,411 for education. This is approximately \$14,000 more than was raised in 1972.

The transportation of the Westport students has greatly improved. The new bus provides more room for present students and will allow for the student population to grow. Mr. Cromwell is a fine bus driver and is doing a most satisfactory job. The noon bus schedule is currently being handled by Mrs. Eleanor Dow and that, too, is most satisfactory.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as it pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of bank statements and/or count of cash and by bank confirmation.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as disbursements and bank charges. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined on a selective basis.

Revenue accruing to the municipality from various sources was reviewed and checked to pertinent records. Records of town meetings, as they pertained to financial matters, were reviewed. Trust and reserve fund transactions were reviewed and investments verified. Surety bond coverage was determined.

COMMENTS

OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The current years operations showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$566.58 was lapsed to unappropriated surplus, per the following summary:

The overlay and an unexpended balance in the aid to dependent children account less and overdraft in the town road improvement account were the major factors contributing to the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed. The records did not indicate any authority allowing overdrafts in appropriation accounts.

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements:

ASSETS The general cash balance was \$13,786.28 at February 9, 1972 and the change fund amounted to \$25.00. The bank balance and the

in transit deposit used in reconciling the general cash balance were confirmed by the depository. The change fund was counted. An amount of \$2,210.36 representing the Clough Point account balance, was confirmed as being on deposit at the close of the fiscal year.

Taxes receivable totaled \$1,495.83 at the year end. Of this amount \$1,465.33 was for current year accounts and the remaining balance of \$30.50 was for delinquent accounts dating from 1968. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$182.50 and \$112.26 respectively.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS The departmental accounts showed an unexpended balance of \$7,500.25 carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or voter authority. The 1972 excise tax revenue of \$2,411.29 and the Clough Point account balance of \$2,210.36 are reserved for future disposition.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$5,690.33, an increase of \$566.58 for the year. The change was due to the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed.

TRUST AND RESERVE FUNDS Trust fund principal totaled \$500.00 and unexpended income was \$4.45 at the year end. The school bus fund amounted to \$2,597.48 at the close of the year. The funds were on deposit in the Canal National Bank, Bath, Maine.

GENERAL

The use of 1971 excise tax revenue for the town roads and bridges and contingent accounts was voter authorized at the annual town meeting as was the carrying forward of certain operating account balances.
