## COVER PICTURE

### THE WESTPORT FERRY SERVICE

The original Westport bridge, 1,350 feet long, was constructed in 1840 at a cost of \$6,000.00 and was located at the Northeastern end of Hockamock Bay, running between the West Shore Road, Westport, and Phipps Point, Woolwich. On February 17, 1885, ice damaged the bridge and teams were unable to pass over the span for two days and for some time thereafter no toll was charged but those who used the bridge did so at their own peril. The bridge was again damaged by very high tides on January 12, 1891 and the aging structure was badly damaged in the great storm and gale of February 20, 1893. Another storm on March 15 of the same year finally destroyed what had stood for fifty-three years. The Town then had three special meetings and on November 6, 1893 voted 53 - 42 to build a new bridge, but apparently funds were not raised and the bridge was never built.

A cable ferry service was approved by the voters in 1899 and established in 1903 between Ferry Road, Westport and what is now the Maine Yankee Road, Wiscasset, and over the next 47 years two or possibly three scows were used. The original scow was either replaced or rebuilt in 1919 and another was built in 1938.

This photograph, taken by former First Selectman Colin R. Dunn in the 1930's, was taken from the Wiscasset side and shows the Westport landing with the Westport Chapel on the far left and several houses along the Ferry Road and the Main Road.

For many years the only means of propulsion was provided by the river current and the men pulling the scow across by hand on the steel cable. John Cromwell was the first ferryman and was followed by Grant Whitten who was the first to experiment with using a launch to drive the scow across. Other ferrymen were Lester Dow, Fred Waite, "Charlie Gene" Cromwell, his son Luther and Horace Lewis.

Many unexpected trips up and down the river were made when the cable broke, and as fate would have it this usually happened in the winter months when storms were at their worst or in the middle of the night. More excitement was had when cars were accidentally driven off the end of the scow. Local residents nostalgically recall these quick trips to the bottom of the river. Tragically, however, there was one fatality when Morris Lewis, who was taking a team of oxen across the river on the scow, became caught in the cable and drowned.

Local opinion is divided as to the identity of the ferryman shown in the picture. "Charlie Gene" Cromwell and Horace Lewis are the most likely candidates however. When discontinued in May of 1950 the Westport Ferry was one of only three cable ferry operating in the State and an era of a half century of isolation from the mainland had ended.

## **REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

To the school committee, town officials and other citizens of Westport, I hereby submit my annual report as superintendent of schools.

We can not ask you to vote on the 1978-79 school budget at your March annual town meeting.

Since the Uniform Property Tax has been repealed we do not know at this time what the new law will mean for Westport. We do not know the legal wording for the school articles. When the school committee knows the effect they will review their budget before asking the citizens to vote. This will probably be in May. You are reminded that the school department, by law, is on the state's fiscal year of July 1 - June 30, so there is no need to rush on the funding. As we get closer to June 30 we will be able to more accurately provide you with information related to 1977-78 expenditures and balances.

The recent action by the Wiscasset School Commission to cut the tuition in half beginning September, 1978, will have a significant effect on the school budget.

As voted by the citizens of Westport the school committee purchased another bus and hired another driver. Nearly all the students ride the bus every day (grades K - 12).

### COMMENTS

#### OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The fiscal year's operations showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$14,579.75 was lapsed to surplus, per the following summary:

## Departmental Accounts:

The overlay and an unexpended balance in the tax anticipation note account less an overdraft in the interest account were the major factors contributing to the net unexpended balance lapsed. The records did not indicate that authority had been granted by the legislative body to allow overdrafts in appropriation accounts.

\* \* \* \*

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements:

**ASSETS . . . .** The general cash balance which included general, federal revenue sharing, Clough Point and petty cash totaled \$9,680.98 at February 18, 1977. The bank balances used in reconciling this amount were confirmed by the depository. The petty cash fund was counted.

Taxes receivable totaled \$12,333.65 at the year end. Of this amount \$11,706.75 was for current year accounts and the remaining balance of \$626.90 was for prior years dating from 1973. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$2,278.00 and \$112.26 respectively.

**RESERVES AND SURPLUS . . . .** Unexpended departmental balances of \$5,244.53 were carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and voter authority. Excise tax revenue of \$1,810.81, Clough Point account balance of \$2,760.78 and antirecession fiscal assistance funds of \$1,211.00 are reserved for future allocation by the townspeople.

The excess of state revenue sharing funds over estimated totaling \$428.80 was carried forward to be applied toward the 1977 commitment.

Federal revenue sharing entitlement payments for the year totaled \$5,321.00. Interest earnings credited to the fund amounted

to \$408.92. Appropriated federal revenue sharing funds of \$10,943.97 were allocated to the town's operating account to be expended for public transportation and debt retirement purposes. Unappropriated funds at February 18, 1977 amounted to \$1,729.92.

The deficit of \$3,360.70 at February 19, 1976 changed to an unappropriated surplus of \$11,219.05 at February 18, 1977. This change was occasioned by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed to surplus.

**DEBT FUND . . . .** The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects outstanding notes of \$8,500.00 which mature in the ensuing three years.

**TRUST AND RESERVE FUNDS . . . .** The trust fund principal totaled \$500.00 and unexpended income was \$157.89 at the year end. The school bus fund amounted to \$631.47 at the close of the year. These funds were on deposit in the Canal National Bank, Bath, Maine.

### GENERAL

The use of 1976 excise tax revenue to retire the prior year's outstanding tax anticipation note was voter authorized at the annual town meeting as was the carrying forward of certain operating account balances. The townspeople also authorized the use of federal revenue sharing funds for public transportation and debt retirement purposes. State revenue sharing funds of \$861.46 were supplied to reduce the 1976 tax levy.

**RECOMMENDATIONS . . . .** The following recommendations are worthy of consideration as aids in keeping audit costs at a minimum:

A complete general ledger be maintained and kept on a current basis. A trial balance should be taken at least monthly.

The valuation book was not complete at audit date. It is again recommended that the valuation book be in proof before the taxes are committed to the tax collector.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted on under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

ART. 39. To see if the Town will vote to be designated as a municipal assessing unit rather than a primary assessing area.

ART. 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the County of Lincoln to submit, on its behalf, an application to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Community Development Block Grant funds to be used for a Housing Rehabili-

tation Program to serve low and moderate income families in the Town.

ART. 41. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate any monies received from Title II, of the Public Works Employment Act of 1976, Anti-Recession Fiscal Assistance for maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.
