# Local Legend Is MIFF Centerpiece With World Premiere Film and Free Workshop

t's no secret that author Ernest Thompson wrote the classic play "On Golden Pond" which portrays the magical but very real lakeside summer camp experience on Great Pond in the Belgrades. The movie script won Thompson an Oscar, international acclaim, decades of followers and momentum in the business that never ends.

It's also no secret that being the centerpiece at an event in central Maine is not new to Thompson from his appearance at Belgrade Lakes Region, Inc.'s On Golden Pond Days at Messalonskee High School in Oakland in 1982, to his featured attendance at performances of his plays and movies throughout the area (including On Golden Pond at MIFF) to his fund-raising for the Belgrade Lakes Association and the Belgrade Library in more recent times.

What is perhaps a secret to Mainers about this versatile writer, teacher, actor, director and part-time Belgrader is his life beyond On Golden Pond and why he is the Centerpiece Gala at the Maine International Film Festival with the World Premiere showing of his film "Time and

Charges" and his workshop on "What's the Story? Adapting Life into Film," both scheduled for Tuesday, July 16.

Importantly, Thompson, after serving the de rigueur time in Hollywood, now lives in New Hampshire on his lifetime dream property, Whitebridge – a classic New England farmstead that he searched for starting in high school. There he has pursued many facets of writing, including songwriting, has given workshops in writing and acting and has immersed himself in directing.

Of "Time and Charges" he describes how



what began as an exercise became a cause, an On Location Training project open to anyone (aka 500 participants) interested in any aspect of filmmaking, which, in consideration of the real-job other lives of the cast took a year and a half of Sundays to film.

He had no budget, no shooting schedule and initially no screenplay, but he had a cinematographer with a Panasonic HVX 200 and an extra bedroom that doubled as an editing bay and voila: "Time and Charges".

"Time and Charges" follows the convolutions of a wealthy money manager from New York who turns off the highway in New Hampshire and drives into his own past, full of people he once knew, including his former self, the values

he left behind and the daughter he never met.

Filmed in the Lakes Region of central New Hampshire and in New York City, the movie uses more than 40 locations and includes all four seasons. It will be introduced at the Maine International Film Festival by Thompson.

Amazingly, shortly after "Time and Charges" has its world premiere in Waterville this week, another Thompson film, "Heavenly Angle," will receive the same acclaim at the Woods Hole Film Festival in Cape Cod, Massachusetts on August first, where Thompson will also be teaching a hands-on, interactive writing workshop.

At MIFF the free workshop with Ernest Thompson will be held on Tuesday, July 16, 2-4 pm at the Waterville Public Library, 73 Elm Street. "Time and Charges will be shown at 6:30 pm at the Waterville Opera House.

# More Than Just Movies: the Maine International Film Festival Returns

Do you love movies? Do you want to escape the heat and humidity of July? Then come to the sixteenth annual Maine International Film Festival and enjoy the finest films from around the world in air-conditioned comfort! The festival will be held in various venues in downtown Waterville and will run from Friday, July 12 to Sunday, July 21.

This year's festival offers nearly 100 films, ranging in length from three minutes to more than three hours, covering ninety years of filmmaking, and coming from countries as diverse as Russia, Rwanda, Uruguay, and of course, the United States. As always, the lineup includes a few U.S. and world premieres and screenings of works in progress. More than just movies, this year's festival also offers two concerts, an art exhibit, question-and-answer sessions with the filmmakers, and post-screening receptions.

As is MIFF's custom, the festival will feature several groups of related films. These film series include "Demme Does Music,"

# Local Museums New Exhibitions and Programs About Play in the Past



You are invited to Central Maine Plays summer exhibitions and programs at eight central Maine museums and libraries. The exhibitions and programs help us explore the joy and fun of play in the past. The Central Kennebec Heritage Council of Museums activities begin on Friday, July 12 at 7 PM with a talk about "Milton Bradley: The Man who taught America How to Play" at the Victor Grange in Fairfield by David Richards, the Director of the Margaret Chase Smith Library. The talk will look at the life of Milton Bradley including his youth in Central Maine and the development and success of his home entertainment board game empire. This project "kick-off" talk is free and there will be

refreshments and door prizes.

The location for the talk, The Victor Grange is at the junction of routes 104, 23 and 139 in Fairfield Center. Before the talk David Staber will play tunes popular in the late 1800s in Maine on a fiddle made in 1882 by John Lorring of Norridgewock.

During the summer, each of the participating museums will have programs and/or exhibitions about Play. The Exhibition subjects range from Sports Over the Years to Leisure Time Entertainment before TV. The participating museums are L.C.Bates Museum, Margaret Chase Smith Library, Oakland Historical

# Conservation -



Holly Ewing, Associate Professor at Bates College in the Environmental Studies Program, will be sharing notes from the front lines of her important research on Gloeotrichia echinulata, a tapioca-like algae that seems to be gaining prevalence in Maine lakes. Holly's investigations zero in on the ways in which Gloeo may be a potential driver of changes in Maine lakes.

Ever wonder what the difference was between a crayfish, a crawfish, and a crawdad? Curious to know if the crayfish hanging out by your dock is a native species or an invader? 





musicians, most of them in their 20s, from music schools around the world to Colby College for four weeks of intensive study, rehearsal and performance. This year, the festival will have around 150 participants, including students, faculty, fellows and special guests. Most come from conservatories in the United States, but around 40 hail from other countries, continents and regions, including Asia, Australia, Canada, Europe, the Middle East and Central America.

Starting with the opening concert on Saturday, July 13, when the Atlantic Music Festival Orchestra will present Mozart's Symphony No. 29 and Mendelssohn's A Midsummer Night's Dream, there will be concerts almost every night and on Saturday afternoons. The schedule includes two more orchestral concerts, on Saturdays, July 27 and August 3; piano recitals on Tuesdays, July 16 and 30; chamber music concerts on Wednesdays and Fridays, six all together; and three Thursday vocal performances, where aspiring opera singers will sing art songs, arias and opera choruses. Audiences will also be able to hear world premieres of works by the Atlantic Music Festival's young, aspiring composers at concerts on Monday, July 15 at 7:00 and on the next three Saturdays at 1:00.

Finally, AMF will offer its Salon @ The Bar series on Sundays. Inspired by the intimate gatherings, or salons, of the European aristocracy in the 18th and 19th centuries, these concerts will be a variety of chamber and solo favorites. These 21st century salons will be very informal: the programs will not be set in advance, and audience members may come and go as they please and enjoy food and drink during the perform-

Included in the salons will be experimental music from participants in AMF's Future Music Lab, where traditional instruments are mated with computer technology to create new musical possibilities. An example of this technology is the special fingerless glove worn by the new program's head violinist and composer Mari Kimura. The glove has wireless sensors to monitor her movements of her bowing hand and transmit them to a computer to enable her playing to interact with audio and video.

Except for the composer concerts, all performances start at 7:00 p.m. and except for the salon concerts and the final vocal music concert, all will be held in Colby's Lorimer Chapel. In keeping with their spirit, the Salon concerts will take








# Katy's Column –

#### Music is a Lifetime, Joyful Experience

This past spring I attended a concert of "Piano ■ Favorites" played by my Hallowell neighbor, Chiharu Naruse. Exposure to the arts in early life seems the most meaningful way to impress children. Once they experience it there no need to direct them to it. They will have already made up their minds that they like it.

I have absolutely nothing against sports and athletics programs. In fact, with the increase of obesity these programs should never be neglected, but why not have an equal focus given to the arts and not have them be deleted when the school budget is out of line. A continuous reminder should be presented to all educators that exposure to the arts, especially teaching music, is almost certain to be a lifetime of knowing what listening to or making music can provide us.



Hearing and enjoying music is one very important part of life. As we "mature," the solace, rhythm and pleasure each of us enjoy as we grow older is certainly another virtue in bringing music into the life of our children, grandchildren and, yes, great-grandchildren. It's a well-known fact that early exposure will remain for their lifetime.

If you have not already done so, please take your children to the New England Music Camp's Sunday after noon concerts in Sidney this summer. Neither you nor they will ever forget the outing.







site, "Demme follows his musical passions to Naples, Italy to document an extraordinary gathering of world musicians, led by Enzo Avitabile, the Neapolitan multi-instrumentalist, singer and songwriter whose past collaborators include James Brown and Tina Turner. One of the world's great directors tells us not just about the thrilling music of a singular artist who fuses Neapoliltan, folk, world music and jazz, but also of a city, Naples, with all of its treasures and contradictions, ..."

Four other Demme concert films will also be screened during the festival. They are Live from Wildwood Beach (about country singer Kenny Chesney), the Neil Young Trunk Show, Stop Making Sense (about New Wave, pop/rock group The Talking Heads), and Storefront Hitchcock British singer-songwriter Hitchcock). All will be shown on Friday and Saturday, July 12 and 13, at Railroad Square Cinema.

On Sunday and Monday, July 14 and 15, the festival turns to the work of Keith Carradine, win-



ner of this year's Mid-Life Achievement Award. Each year, MIFF honors an actor, director, screenwriter, or film editor who has coman impressive piled résumé in cinema, but still has more to contribute. Past winners of

the moose trophy include film editor Thelma Schoonmaker (2012); actors Malcolm McDowell (2011), John Turturro (2008), Ed Harris (2004), and Sissy Spacek (2001); directors Arthur Penn (2010), Jonathan Demme (2002), and Terrence Malick (2000); and screenwriter Jay Cocks (2010).

Carradine is most acclaimed for his work with

director Robert Altman in McCabe and Mrs. Miller, Thieves Like Us, and Nashville, all of which will be shown at this year's festival. For his role as a self-absorbed womanizer rock star in 1975's Nashville, he won an Academy Award and Golden Globe and was nominated for a Grammy. Nashville will be shown on Monday at the Opera House after the 6:30 award presentation. Carradine was also nominated for a Primetime Emmy as a supporting actor in the 1983 CBS mini-series Chiefs and most recently for a Tony for starring in the new Broadway



musical, Hands on a Hard Body. His latest film, Ain't Them Bodies Saints, an outlaw drama in which he plays a storekeeper, will also be shown at MIFF, along with The Moderns, Choose Me, and the Robert Altman films listed above.

MIFF will also present several Altman films in which Carradine does not appear. Many cinephiles consider Altman, who died in 2006, America's greatest film director. To celebrate his life and work, MIFF will screen seven of his movies and bring some of those who knew him best — Michael Murphy, Allan Nicholls, Mike Kaplan and, his widow Kathryn — to town to introduce and discuss the films. Besides the three Carradine pictures, MIFF will present Short Cuts, Luck, Trust & Ketchup: Robert Altman in Carver Country, Kansas City, and A Prairie Home Companion, his last work. As a capstone to this retrospective, Annie Ross, who starred in and sang in Short Cuts, will sing at the Waterville Opera House on Wednesday, July 17, at 8:00. Now 82, Ross was an early exponent of vocalese, a jazz style in which original lyrics are sung to an existing instrumental line.

Each year, besides presenting new films and those featuring its special guests, MIFF brings back several unfairly overlooked films from decades past. This year's crop of eight includes





# —The Luckiest Boy

uring the 20th century, the economy of the greater Belgrade area was partially if not primarily driven by tourists' dollars. This included the Lakes, the Depot and North Belgrade, as well as the seven-lake chain. Many sets of "fishing cabins" housed summer folk, but when 1900 rolled around, several larger hotels became available. Places like The Belgrade Hotel, Lakeshore Hotel, The Locust House and others came into vogue. The train came into the Depot so "Folks From Away" came in greater numbers and it took greater numbers to care for them. Of the many drawing cards of our area, such as the beauty and quiet, there was FISHIN. In those early days, the number and size of the fish were beyond today's imagination. Many pictures of large catches were recorded and reside in our history books.

Many of the local men became guides who were hired to take sports fishing. The demand for a good number of boats to ply the waters of the Belgrade chain fostered the building of what became known as guide boats. These boats var-




ied in size from 18 to 26 feet and were pointed on both ends, like a canoe. They were powered by 1 to 4 cylinder gasoline engines that sat amidships. The early models had to be hand cranked like a model T Ford; the electric starters came along later.

The guide boats were fitted with a least two comfy chairs, for the sports, including arm and backrests. The guide sat near the motor and could row from there or from the front chair if only one sport was aboard. Most boats had no reverse so oars were used to back her out and head her out. Most trolling was done by oar as well as the old motors could not idle slow enough to suit the trout and salmon.

Many if not most of the guide boats built in

Belgrade were built in the boathouse that sat where Lake Point Realty sits now. Ernest Solar and Ralph Stuart were the primary builders up into the 1950s. My dad, Cliff Johnson, a student of Ralph's, carried on repairing the existing boats until little demand remained. The building, as well as the boat patterns, was razed in a bonfire in 1972. A few of these boats have survived through philanthropy and museum help. Joe Tinker has presented one in the last several boat parades on July Fourth. That is the same boat that is shown in the Belgrade 1976 Bicentennial Book, with Everett Johnson and Bunny Tillson aboard. I believe that boat came from the August Family Camp on Indian Island, Great Pond.











# Fishing '

### **Great Summer Fishing**

Diana had a great day catching some big fish on a top water Heddon Torpedo. She also caught a few on a live bait and a spinnerbaits

The Loons seem to be very healthy and happy this year. The annual loon count is coming up soon – we all hope the overall loon numbers are up!

In the last week the Belgrade Lakes fishery has Lchanged in so many ways. The lake temperatures have gone up about 10° and the water levels are at an all-time high. The good news is that the fishing has stayed the same... excellent. What's made the fishing tricky is the fish have moved to different locations. Just a few days ago we were catching big smallmouth and largemouth bass in shallow water, and even some pretty big pike were shallow. But that's all changed recently. Some of the bigger bass have moved into deeper water, and many of the fish moved into areas where there are currents and channels. Because the water is flowing harder than normal and is a little bit warmer, the fish seem to enjoy the deeper areas with more oxygen. One of the best places to fish from shore when the water is rocking through the dams is the Belgrade Village. Simply find Day's Store and travel north about 200 yards. If the water is rolling through the dam, you'll find fish out in front of that spillway. It's a time-honored and classic fishing spot and people have been catching magnificent salmon and brook trout there for generations. The key is to fish it when the dam is open and the water is flowin'.

When speaking about oxygen levels and water

flows, brown trout pop to mind. They prefer the cooler waters and normally hang out in the thermocline around 28 feet deep. But, as anyone who's been on the water lately or lives near the lake has noticed, the big mayflies have begun to hatch. You see the flies stuck to screen doors or glued to the sticky moisture on your car. The bugs are creepy looking, but if you were a fish, you'd be psyched! Every year these big flies emerge and change the whole dynamic of the lake. This year it's been even more dramatic because the water levels rose at the same time as the July heat wave. The bugs LOVED the conditions and had a super-deluxe hatch around the 4th of July. I couldn't get over the number of husks floating in the water this year. When the bugs shed their husks and emerge, the fish spring to action and devour as many as they can! I was surprised to see so many big white perch cruising the shorelines searching for the mayflies. I think this is the best time of year to find big perch close to shore and anglers looking for a fish fry should take notice. You don't have to be fly fishermen either; you can catch the perch on small stick baits, live minnows and earth worms. The key is to find the school; once you accomplish that mission you will soon find a bucket full of tasty perch!

One quick story: on July 6 we were fishing one of the Belgrade Lakes for northern pike. The weed bed is in about 10 feet of water and the fishing has been consistently good all around this spot. When we arrived it was pretty breezy but a few smallmouth and one pike hit our spinnerbaits and Bomber Long-A stickbaits. Then the fishing went silent and we noticed two loons show up. Right behind them was a good-sized baby loon and she looked healthy. The parents were diving on the weed bed and sure enough one of them rose with a fish trapped in her beak. What a sight! Keep in mind this loon was only about 10 feet from our boat. I didn't turn on the trolling motor and we just floated along and watched this beautiful bird feed her baby right out of her mouth! It was awesome and I swear you could hear the baby call out "thank you." This scenario reminded me that there is so much more to fishing than just catching fish. I can't wait to see what adventure tomorrow brings.







# Rolling the Dice on Married Life Shakespeare's Taming of the Shrew Next up at Theater at Monmouth

7illiam Shakespeare's epic battle of the sexes, *The* **V** Taming of the Shrew opens at Theater at Monmouth on Friday, July 12 at 7:30 p.m. In Shrew, Shakespeare explores the institution of marriage, the rifts between men and women, and the rough and tumble journey toward enduring love. The play bursts with disguise, deception, and devilment as well as the taming of not one but two shrewish lovers fighting to maintain control and independence.

Former TAM artistic director and audience favorite, Sally Wood returns for the first time since 2007 to direct one of her favorite of Shakespeare plays. Wood acknowledges that many people have strong visceral reactions to this story, which makes it both a delight and a terror to explore. So many love stories are easy; this one is not, notes Wood, adding that she hopes by the end, audiences see how complicated love can be, but that the payoff makes it all worthwhile.

The stage is set in Padua, Italy in the late 1900s. Fortune-seeking Petruchio swaggers into town looking to to marry money when he learns of the fiery tongued Katharina. Some call her plain Kate, sometimes Kate the Cursed, but Petruchio has a cunning plan to tame her for his wife. She has other ideas, most of them violent, and none involving marriage. Meanwhile, little sister Bianca, the apple of her father's eye, inflames the considerable passion of every eligible man in town and attracts would-be husbands everywhere she looks. But daddy won't let that happen until big sister Kate gets a husband of her own. Through bickering and brawling, Kate and sound design by Rew Tippin, and light design by Petruchio's comic courtship is a no-holds-barred battle Lynne Chase. of wills that results in a love and understanding that neither one imagined.


