

THE WESTPORT TOWN HALL

Built in 1790, the Town Hall started life as a Freewill Baptist Church. Some years later it was used by both the Baptist and Methodists and was abandoned as a church in 1864 when the Methodists moved to what is now the Westport Community Church just to the north. The town acquired the abandoned building in 1885 and it has been used as a town hall ever since.

During this era, this section was a center of town activity with the Post Office, a store, and the Center School close at hand at the junction of the Post Office Road.

The building has many interesting features such as wooden fans above the windows, the curved plastered ceiling, the small balcony and a stage.

Unofficial mascot of the hall is the stuffed loon on the beam over the stage. He has presided over many a town meeting, wedding reception and dance since 1889 when he was shot at Squam Creek by Everett McCarthy of the Post Office Road. "Young" Cornelius Tarbox of the West Shore Road mounted the bird and it was presented to the town and has remained in the Town Hall ever since.

FULL DAY OF ACTIVITIES HIGHLIGHTS

WESTPORT'S 150th BIRTHDAY

At 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 22, with temperatures hovering around 90, approximately 150 persons gathered at the Westport Flagpole to witness the beginning of the Town's 150th birthday celebration.

Phyllis Siebert, President of the Westport Community Ass'n., dedicated the flagpole which the Ass'n installed as its memorial to the Country's 200th Birthday in 1976. She then introduced First Selectman,

Richard Malone, who welcomed all present and following his brief remarks he read a letter to the townspeople from State Senator, John Chapman, who sent his birthday greetings and expressed his pleasure at being invited to take part in the celebration and being given the honor of introducing Congressman David Emery.

Congressman Emery expressed his pleasure at being able to be at Westport and take part in the celebration. He wished the town a Happy Birthday and gave a brief talk following which he presented the town with an American flag which had been flown over the Nation's Capitol specifically for Westport. Richard Malone accepted the flag and on behalf of the town officers present and all the townspeople, expressed appreciation for the flag and Congressman Emery's part in the celebration.

Mr. Malone presented the flag to the Color Guard consisting of Westport's Eagle Scout, Chuck Richardson, and Cub Scouts Jimmy Cromwell, Steve Cromwell and Mark Bodmer with their leader, Gerry Bodmer. Chuck raised the new American Flag along with the State of Maine flag which was given by the Community Ass'n. Everyone joined in singing the Star Spangled Banner and the Pledge of Allegiance. The benediction was given by the Reverend Richard Cleaves.

Everyone was invited to the Town Hall where a luncheon consisting of clam chowder, sandwiches, sweets, pink lemonade and iced tea was served.

The hall was packed with folks enjoying the displays of Indian artifacts, old photographs, and many other articles of interest. Frieda Schulze had a display of her paintings of Westport scenes and portraits she has done of some of the Westport young people. Everyone enjoyed listening to Bill Bonyun as he played his guitar and sang.

The dance with music by Bau Graves and his Contra Dance group was very well attended and everyone had a great time dancing or just watching.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the school committee, town officials and other citizens of Westport, I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

As you know the school budget is by law on the State's fiscal year July 1 - June 30. It is not practical or realistic to present the school budget at the March Town Meeting. The closer we get to July the more accurate the budget figures become. The known balance is very important to citizens because any balance goes to reduce what you will be asked to raise locally. The legislature is new, the governor is new, and the present commissioner of education will probably change. Every year there are changes in the school funding law. There is talk about placing a limit on school spending. Westport is now a subsidy receiving town. Possibly this could change. Perhaps you would like to encourage your town officials to adopt the State's fiscal year. Georgetown has done so. Others are studying it.

The Wiscasset School Committee is continuing with its policy of charging one-half the State allowable tuition rate. You now have a contract for all Westport students to receive their education under the direction of the Wiscasset School Committee.

Your bus drivers are conscientious and the buses are efficiently maintained. We hope for no unexpected large expense but, naturally, it could happen.

As the School Committee and I work on the school budget we will make every effort during the many meetings to keep costs at a minimum. We ask for your continued support and understanding. Please always feel free to call me with a problem. Westport residents have always

been supportive to me and the School Committee. We look forward to this continued trust and understanding.

Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Within the scope of our examination, the financial transactions were considered appropriately handled, with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying commentary.

In our opinion, the aforementioned statements for the period February 19, 1977 to December 31, 1977, present fairly the information contained therein, in conformity with the provisions of Title 30, Revised Statutes, Section 5253, applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The operations for the period showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$8,613.82 was lapsed to surplus, per the following summary:

The overlay less an an overdraft in the roads and bridges account were the major factors contributing to the net unexpended balance lapsed. The records did not indicate that authority had been granted by the legislative body to allow overdrafts in appropriation accounts.

* * * * *

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements:

ASSETS The general fund cash balance, which included general and petty cash, totaled \$39,213.84 at December 31, 1977. The bank balance used in reconciling this amount was confirmed by the depository. Petty cash was counted.

Investments of \$2,897.66 consisted of federal revenue sharing and Clough Point funds. These funds were invested in time deposits at the Canal National Bank, Bath, Maine.

Taxes receivable totaled \$15,859.55 at the year end. Of this amount \$15,783.87 was for current year accounts and the remaining balance of \$75.68 was for 1976 accounts. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$4,907.04 and \$24.00 respectively.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS Unexpended departmental balances of \$28,024.76 were carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or voter authorization. Excise tax revenue of \$5,668.74, Clough Point account balance of \$2,886.42 and business inventory tax of \$63.34 are reserved for future allocation by the townspeople.

Unappropriated federal revenue sharing funds of \$1,729.92 were available at February 19, 1977. Entitlement payments for the period totaled \$3,536.00. Interest earnings credited to the fund amounted to \$147.73. Unused funds totaling \$4,500.00 were returned to the fund. Appropriated federal revenue sharing funds of \$6,833.64 were allocated

to the town's operating account to be expended for public transportation and debt retirement purposes. Unappropriated funds at December 31, 1977 amounted to \$3,080.01.

Antirecession fiscal assistance quarterly payments totaled \$3,527.00. Appropriated antirecession fiscal assistance funds of \$1,211.00 were transferred to the town's operating account for roads and bridges. Appropriated funds not transferred to the town's operating account at December 31, 1977 amounted to \$3,527.00.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$19,651.82, an increase of \$8,432.77 for the year. This change was occasioned principally by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed to surplus.

DEBT FUND The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects an outstanding note of \$4,000.00 which matures in the ensuing two years and a demand note of \$9,869.90.

TRUST AND RESERVE FUNDS The trust fund principal totaled \$500.00 and unexpended income was \$194.82 at December 31, 1977. The school bus fund amounted to \$666.92 at the close of the year. These funds were on deposit in the Canal National Bank, Bath, Maine.

GENERAL

The use of excise tax revenue, federal revenue sharing and anti-recession fiscal assistance funds to supplement appropriations for various specific current year operations were authorized by the voters at the annual and special town meetings. State revenue sharing funds of \$2,383.83 were applied to reduce the 1977 tax levy.

The town's fiscal year closing was changed by the town officials from February 18 to December 31.

ART. 34. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted on under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 31, 1979 at 8:30 o'clock A. M. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not, and have the Warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.


