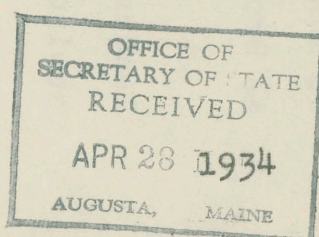


STATEMENT BY THE GOVERNOR.

BROTHERHOOD DAY \* APRIL 29, 1934.

If by sober reflection upon the joint problems of our common faiths, we may be relieved of prejudice and misunderstanding-- then we will have accomplished something by observing tomorrow, Sunday, April 29, 1934 as Brotherhood Day.

Widely approved by Protestant, Catholic and Jewish leaders, its purpose endorsed by President Roosevelt, I am desirous of commending to Maine people, Brotherhood Day.

This day will not deal with doctrinal differences but will suggest that we, as Americans, have the power of mind to rise above old suspicions, petty and unfounded notions and join in a national mobilization of our human resources for the good of the country.
