Dear Sir

As I may have a hurried notice to repair any injury to the seal of war, at least or was so intimated to me by the Board of Exs. I will to make such preparation as I can - Therefore you will confer a favour by adjusting my acct. against the State for medical services to the troops. My services by land from May 14th to June 30 during which time I attended

1 Case of dislocation of Shoulder

31 Cases of measles

1 Case Brain fever

7 Cases of mumps

4 Cases Inf. fever 6 Cases Gonorrhoea

5 Cases of Lung fever

I enclose 246 merits
and fill out duplicate copies
to 205 of these which
disposes of all the blanks, on
hand - I visited the bar-
racks twice daily while I
attended - for these I have
memoranda, & for the examina-
tions the certificates of the Captains.
But probably you will think
best to allow me a certain
sum for the whole as you
intimated in your letter to me
of the 29th May, at any rate
any decision you may make
will be perfectly satisfactory
to me & as I said in my note
to you, will accept any bill
you may direct to be paid.
