Volunteer Fire Department Report

REPORT FOR 1981

Meetings were held on the first Tuesday of each month, with an average attendance of 14 members present. There were 23 due paying members in 1981. New members are always welcome.

Any outdoor fire, at any time of year, now requires a burning permit. Chief Llewellyn Delano issues these permits and will ascertain if conditions are favorable for outdoor fires. Contact him at 882-7568 before having **ANY** outdoor fires.

Portable sirens and pagers were supplied the Department by Maine Yankee. The pagers will be used for fires, as well as any emergency situations. The Sheriff's office can activate the pagers in the event of a fire at Westport. He can also activate the two large fixed sirens which are used for fires, as well as other emergency situations. If the large sirens' wail fluctuates (up and down) this is a fire alarm. The steady siren sound of one minute (or longer) with no fluctuation indicates an emergency situation and you should turn your radio or TV to a local station for further instructions, or an announcement as to why the siren is sounding.

The Walter Greenleaf family gave the Fire Dept. an oxygen outfit and a spare oxygen tank. This gift is greatly appreciated.

A new portable, gas operated pump was purchased by the Dept.

The Fire Dept. took part in two Maine Yankee drills in Sept. The people conducting the drills and the observers reported very favorably on the Westport firemen's knowledge and efficiency in both drills.

Fires responded to in 1981 were 1 structure fire, 1 chimney fire, 1 vehicle fire and 1 grass fire. Everyone is urged to use extreme care when installing a wood stove. We appreciate the care people have been taking.

An Open House at the Fire House is being planned for the summer of 1982. Announcements of this will appear in local papers.

The Department wishes to thank all who gave so generously in response to our letters and other generous donations received.

Superintendent of Schools Report

As I near completion of my first year of service as your Superintendent of Schools, I look back on the 1981-82 school year with a great deal of satisfaction and forward to 1982-83 with much anticipation. The transition on July 1, 1981, from an eight-town union to a four-town system, coupled with a change in superintendents and a move in office locations from Woolwich to Wiscasset, served to create a very busy beginning.

I would like to express my thanks to the people of Westport and most particularly to the Westport School Committee for their continued cooperation and support.

One of the major changes which we have been able to implement is that the town will be able to take action on the school budget at the annual March Town Meeting. This is possible in light of the fact that the Town of Westport does not receive state subsidy and through the cooperation of the School Committee working with the Superintendent in order to move up the budget deadlines. It is my belief that this will prove very helpful to the town as they try to accurately assess the tax commitment for the coming year.

The current budget reflects an increase primarily due to the anticipated increase in the cost of tuition, bus expenses and maintenance. It was my intent, and the School Committee worked diligently, to keep any budget increases to a minimum.

In fiscal year '84 school systems are being required to adopt a new accounting system state-wide. Therefore, the School Committee will be asking the town to vote on an article which will allow them to modify the current line-item budgeting system in order that they may comply more readily and more fully with the new accounting system. This request will be explained in greater detail at the March Town Meeting. However, if you should have any questions as you contemplate making your decision on this issue, please do not hesitate to call my office and talk to me about it.

All of Westport's school bus drivers have completed the state bus driver safety course, and in general transportation on Westport has gone smoothly this year, thanks to their dedication and training.

If at any time during the coming year you have any school related problems, please feel free to contact your child's teacher, the school principal, and then the Superintendent in order to resolve the matter.

I look forward to working with the people of Westport as their school Superintendent as effectively as possible this coming year. I want to assure you that if you have any concerns regarding the school system or the transportation of Westport children, please do not hesitate to call or come and see me about it. It is only through this combined effort that we can provide the best, educationally, for the children of Westport.

The Town has not maintained a record of its general fixed assets, and accordingly a statement of general fixed assets, required by generally accepted accounting principles, is not included in the financial report.

In our opinion, the financial statements listed in the aforementioned table of contents present fairly the financial position of the Town of Westport at December 31, 1981, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The accompanying supplemental information is not necessary for a fair presentation of the financial statements, but is presented per statutory requirements and as additional analytical data. The information has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements mentioned above, and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 1981**

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The accounting policies of the Town of Westport conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

A. Basis of Presentation

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The various funds are grouped by type in the financial statements.

Governmental Funds

General Fund — The general fund is the general operating fund of the Town. All general tax revenues and other receipts that are not allocated by law or contractual agreement to another fund are accounted for in this fund. From the fund are paid the general operating expenditures, the fixed charges and the capital improvement costs that are not paid through other funds.

Special Revenue Fund - Special revenue funds are used to account for revenues derived from specific taxes or other earmarked revenue sources, including federal revenue sharing funds.

Fiduciary Funds

Trust Funds - Trust funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the Town for others.

Account Group

General Long-Term Debt - This account group is established to account for the long-term debt that is backed by the Town's full faith and credit.

B. Basis of Accounting

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed by the General, Special Revenue, Trust and Special Reserve Funds. The modified accrual basis of accounting is defined as the basis of accounting under which expenditures are recorded as incurred and revenues are recorded when received in cash except for material and/or available revenues which are accrued to reflect properly the taxes levied and the revenues earned.

C. General Fixed Assets

The Town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets. Expenditures for property and equipment are charged against departmental operations whenever such items are purchased.

2. Property Tax.

The Town's property tax for the current year was levied September 16, 1981 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 1981 for all real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due on November 1, 1981 and interest charged at the rate of 12% per year retroactive to September 16, 1981.

3. Long-Term Debt

During the year, the Town paid the balance of the revaluation notes which had previously been authorized.

4. General Fund Budget

The Town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles, on which, amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen.

5. Appropriated Fund Balance

Historically the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances and/or overdrafts forward to the following year for expenditure. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

6. Special Reserve Funds

Special reserve funds for various purposes have been established

in the past by a vote of the townspeople. These funds were invested in savings accounts and a certificate of deposit at the year end.

7. General

The use of excise tax revenue and federal revenue sharing funds for various current year operations were voter authorized at the annual town meeting. State revenue sharing funds and business inventory tax of \$3,000.73 and \$30.60 respectively were applied to reduce the 1981 tax levy.

Recommended that taxes be due and payable on November 1, 1982 and that interest shall be due on taxes paid after November 1, 1982 at the rate of 12% per annum and shall be computed from the date of commitment.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of tax acquired property by bid process following advertisement in the Lincoln and Sagadahoc newspapers for three consecutive weeks and posting at the Town Hall for the same period of time at a price not less than unpaid tax, interest and costs with the further authority to reject any and all bids, but the Selectmen shall sell the property to the prior owner for the amount of any unpaid taxes, interest, and costs then due.

ART. 39. To see if the Town will vote to set a specified time for the treasurer to pay Selectmen's warrants.

ART. 40. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

ART. 41. "Shall the citizens of Westport hereby request the President and Congress of the United States to take immediate action to halt the nuclear arms race, by proposing to the Soviet Union the adoption of a **mutual** freeze on all further testing, production and deployment of nuclear weapons and their delivery systems;

And, that copies of this resolution be sent to the President, members of the Maine Congressional delegation and our local legislators, so that they will know of our concerns."
