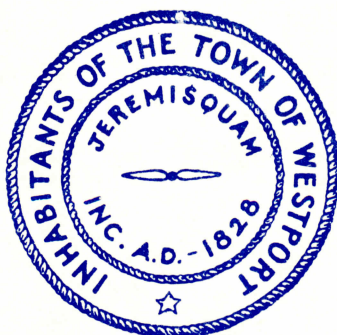

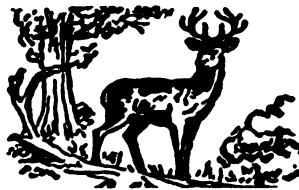

## **Volunteer Fire Department Report**

Meetings were held on the first Tuesday of each month, with an average attendance of 15 members present. There are 20 active dues paying members, with some junior members. New members are invited to attend any time, and we would welcome your membership.

The Maine Yankee Drill held in October was well attended by members of our Department and we received very favorable reports on our participation and knowledge of procedures, etc.

Radiation Monitoring Training was held at Maine Yankee and one of our firemen attended this training course.

The Department purchased a new portable pump for the tank truck, which has been mounted on the truck in such a way that it can easily be removed to use as a portable pump, when necessary.

An energy audit was conducted at the Fire House and it is planned to insulate the inside of the Fire House to help conserve on oil consumption.

The small Army truck has been equipped with a tank and a portable pump. This truck will be especially useful in the event of forest fires.

During 1983 the Department responded to 4 chimney fires, 1 structure fire, 2 woods fires, and 1 call for a tree on a power line.

Chimfex, for use on chimney fires, are available through the Fire Department. Many residents have purchased them and keep them handy - just in case. The Department appreciates the care residents are taking in keeping their chimneys clean and the careful manner folks watch out for outside burning. Please remember, that for any type of outside fire, a permit is required by State Law. These permits are available by calling Chief Llewellyn Delano at 882-7568.

The Westport School Committee is renting the garage bay on the south side of the Fire House to use for one of the School buses.

The Department wishes to publicly express sincerest appreciation to the former Westport Willing Workers for their most generous donation, which they would like to see used toward painting the Fire House or put toward insulation. We hope to do both projects during 1984.

Sincere thanks to all who have generously donated money to the Department this past year. These donations help greatly toward buying new equipment and upkeep on the Fire House and trucks.

## Superintendent of Schools Report

In this my third annual report to the citizens of School Union #48, I would like to briefly review this past year and look forward to 1984-85.

Following a year of preparation and meetings, the high school was visited by a 13-member accreditation team in October. Their report was released in November. Key points of the report have been reported in the newspaper; if you would like to review a complete copy, please contact the principal's office. We are currently developing an action plan which will address identified weaknesses.

As a follow-up to the accreditation study at the high school, the elementary schools and the special services department are currently conducting a state-mandated self-evaluation. This self-evaluation study is scheduled for completion by early summer. I want to publicly thank the staff and community for the time and effort that went into assuring both of these studies reflect an accurate assessment of our schools.

Some specific comments regarding the Westport budget. The total proposed budget for 1984-85 is \$142,110.14, a 10.5% increase over the 1983-84 amount (\$128,582.43). Due to a projected balance of \$18,500.00 in the Common School Account, this represents a 2.5% increase in the tax commitment or an increased dollar amount of \$3,027.71. The major increase in the budget is in the area of projected tuition cost; however, Wiscasset continues to charge one-half tuition, a savings to the Town of Westport of \$108,460.00.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Paul Hodgdon, who willingly gave of his time to fill in as a bus driver substitute for us last fall when we were without a regular driver. It is through the efforts of individuals who are committed to the Town of Westport that difficult situations such as that can be handled with minimal disruption. We were able to hire as a regular bus driver Clyde Smith, who is doing a very fine job of serving the Town of Westport in the very critical task of transporting their children.

The Union School Committee this past year developed evaluation criteria for the position of Superintendent. As part of this plan I was instructed to develop some goal statements for the 1984-85 school year. These were adopted by the Union board on

January 26, 1984. The goals provide a statement by the School Committee regarding the priorities which they wish the administration to work on during the coming school year. They are listed here in rank order for your information and will be worked on as such.

1. Establish a five year plan to insure on-going curriculum articulation and coordination. The final product will be a K-12 scope and sequence of the entire curriculum and a thorough review of materials being used. Expectations within each curriculum area and techniques of evaluation will also be standardized.
2. Institute staff development plans for each building.
3. Develop action plans to address needs identified in the elementary self-evaluation and high school accreditation report.
4. Institute parent conferences within the schools.
5. Establish a study committee to study future facility needs in Wiscasset.
6. Develop a policy manual for the Dresden School Department.
7. Institute a comprehensive teacher evaluation process. One which will lead to consistency of expectations between buildings.
8. Develop a salary ladder for support staff.
9. Institute a public awareness forum with education as a focal point.
10. Review school transportation within Union #48 and present a plan for action.
11. Develop a complete set of job descriptions.

Some of the goals are on-going for a period of years such as number one; others have received low priority and may remain on the list for a second year as it may not be possible to accomplish the entire list in one year.

I would like to highlight a couple of the goals. The top priority as adopted by the School Committee is to establish a five-year curriculum review plan. At its completion this will result in a K-12 sequence of curriculum in all subject areas. It will also provide the community with a clear understanding of what we expect to be accomplished in each subject area.

A second goal is the initiation of parent conferences within the schools. This will be in addition to the current report card procedures. We need and desire parent involvement as we seek to provide the best in educational opportunities. This past year has

seen the release of many national studies regarding education. All reports indicate the need for strong community involvement in order to achieve educational excellence. As we look forward to 1984-85 I would strongly encourage and welcome your involvement in the investment we are all making in your child's future.

## **Time & Tide RC&D Area Report**

It is with pleasure that we submit our report of the Time & Tide Resource Conservation & Development activities in 1983. This people's program is sponsored, in part, by the counties and is directed by local people. The Time & Tide Area covers 60 towns and cities and serves as a place for people to come together to plan and carry out projects relating primarily to natural resources. We assist towns and non-profit groups with conserving, developing and improving our natural resources.

Groups of volunteers meet on advisory committees covering Soils & Land Use, Forestry, Ocean, Energy, Recreation & Tourism, Agriculture, Fish & Wildlife and Information. The volunteers make suggestions for program direction. Anyone interested is welcome to serve on one or more resource committees of their choice.

Measures were completed in 1983 and included Waldoboro and Warren flood plain studies, Boothbay Harbor recreation area, Swanville - State Park, Searsmont comprehensive plan, Camden nature trail, Dresden ball field and comprehensive plan, St. George ball field, Lincoln County energy plan, Brunswick fish viewing room and Coffin Pond swimming area, Cushing recreation area, Rockland Bog assistance, Harpswell condo/cluster housing, Bowdoinham recreation area and Monroe fire pond. Other measures are in progress covering Islesboro shore erosion, Belfast City Park and waterfront, Brunswick water quality, rural fire protection, St. George River corridor, North Haven basketball court, Wiscasset recreation area, Bath recreation areas, water quality on Tolman Pond, Sheepscot Island fire pond and Camden Snow Bowl and recreation area development, to name a few.

In 1984 the Time & Tide RC&D Council will put special emphasis on solid waste problems in the Mid Coast area.

Any town can request assistance from the Time & Tide RC&D by contacting it, the local Soil & Water Conservation District or the County Commissioners' office.



The Time & Tide Council has two 30-minute color movies dealing with farmland and food. They are available to service clubs, etc.

In our opinion, the financial statements listed in the aforementioned table of contents present fairly the financial position of the Town of Westport at December 31, 1983, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The accompanying supplemental information is not necessary for a fair presentation of the financial statements, but is presented per statutory requirements and as additional analytical data. The information has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements mentioned above, and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
DECEMBER 31, 1983**

**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The accounting policies of the Town of Westport conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

**A. Basis of Presentation**

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The various funds are grouped by type in the financial statements.

**Governmental Funds**

**General Fund** — The general fund is the general operating fund of the Town. All general tax revenues and other receipts that are not allocated by law or contractual agreement to another fund are accounted for in this fund. From the fund are paid the general operating expenditures, the fixed charges and the capital improvement costs that are not paid through other funds.

**Special Revenue Fund** — Special revenue funds are used to account for revenues derived from specific taxes or other earmarked revenue sources, including federal revenue sharing funds.

**Fiduciary Funds**

**Trust Funds** — Trust Funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the Town for others.

**B. Basis of Accounting**

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed by the General, Special Revenue and Trust Funds. The modified accrual basis of accounting is defined as the basis of accounting under which expenditures are recorded as incurred and revenues are recorded when received in cash except for material and/or available revenues which are accrued to reflect properly the taxes levied and the revenues earned.

**C. General Fixed Assets**

The Town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets. Expenditures for property and equipment are charged against departmental operations whenever such items are purchased.

## 2. Property Tax

The Town's property tax for the current year was levied September 16, 1983 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 1983, for all real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due on November 1, 1983 and interest charged at the rate of 12% per year retroactive to September 16, 1983.

## 3. Deferred Credits

Deferred credits represent items received during the current accounting period but to be used as revenue in the subsequent year. These accounts were as follows at December 31, 1983:

## 4. General Fund Budget

The Town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles, on which, amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or Budget Committee.

## 5. Designated for Special Reserves

Special reserve accounts for various purposes have been established in the past by vote of the townspeople. These accounts were invested in savings accounts and a certificate of deposit at the year end.

## 6. Designated for Subsequent Years' Expenditures

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances forward to the following year for expenditures. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

**8. General**

State revenue sharing funds, business inventory tax, tree growth tax and veterans' exemptions of \$4,125.54, \$15.36, \$507.98 and \$156.16 respectively were applied to reduce the 1983 tax levy.

ART. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. The polls will be open at the Westport Town Hall on order of the Moderator and will close at eight o'clock in the afternoon for voting on the following:

To choose by secret ballot, a First Selectman for a term of one year, a Second Selectman for a term of one year, a Third Selectman for a term of one year, a Town Clerk for a term of one year, a Treasurer for a term of one year, a Tax Collector for a term of one year, a Road Commissioner for a term of one year, and a School Board Member for a term of three years.

All other business under this warrant will be conducted upon the reopening of the meeting on Saturday, the tenth day of March A.D., 1984 at nine o'clock in the forenoon at the Westport Town Hall.

ART. 18. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Civil Emergency Preparedness.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$200.00 be raised and the balance of \$203.00 be carried forward.

ART. 19. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town's share of the Wiscasset dump operating expenses.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$3,000.00 be raised.

ART. 20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the 1984 State Block Grant Allocation for roads.

Recommended by Selectmen that it be put in a reserve fund for roads and voted on at the next annual meeting.

ART. 21. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$12,000.00 from the State Block Grant money to the Town Highways and Bridges Account.

Recommended by Selectmen that this action be taken.

ART. 22. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$6,000.00 be raised, the balance of \$1,511.24 carried forward, the amount of \$6,000.00 be transferred from Surplus, the amount of \$12,000.00 be transferred from the State Block Grant fund and that the amount of \$16,000.00 be transferred from the 1984 Excise Tax Receipts. Total recommended for Town Highways and Bridges \$41,511.24.

ART. 23. To see if the Town will vote to require the Road Commissioner and the Selectmen to put any Town road construction and/or repair exceeding the sum of \$1,000.00 (excepting emergency repair) out to bid, to negotiate and execute on such terms and conditions as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town. -- By Request

ART. 24. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Snow Removal.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$8,419.10 be transferred from the Revenue Sharing Account and that the sum of \$15,390.00 be transferred from the Excise Tax Receipts.

ART. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for support of the Poor.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$292.19 be carried forward.

ART. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Wiscasset Library.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$500.00 be raised.

ART. 27. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the School Bus (Reserve) Fund.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$5,000.00 be raised.

ART. 28. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Interest.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$3,000.00 be raised.

ART. 29. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Abatements.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$300.00 be raised.

ART. 30. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for care of Veteran's Graves.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$25.00 be raised.

ART. 31. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the support of WCBB/Channel 10 Educational/Public Television.

ART. 32. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$168.00 for Coastal Economic Development Corporation (CED) to provide services for low-income people which include Head Start, Fuel Assistance, Employment Programs, Weatherization and Project Aware.

ART. 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the State and County Taxes and to take any action relative thereto.

ART. 34. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell Town Property known as the Dump Lot. (260 ft. x 260 ft.) by bid, after being advertised in local papers and posted in the Town.

ART. 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a Town Road a section of road between Ames Marine driveway to the Clifford property on the North End of the Island.

ART. 36. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a Town Road a section of road from the East Shore Road to the property line of Lord and Hopkins, part of which was known as the Log Cabin Road.

ART. 37. To see if the Town will vote to set a date when taxes shall be payable and to set an interest rate due thereafter.

Recommended that taxes be due and payable on November 1, 1984 and that interest shall be due on taxes paid after November 1, 1984 at the rate of 12% per annum and shall be computed from the date of commitment.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of tax acquired property by bid process following advertisement in the Lincoln and Sagadahoc newspapers for three consecutive weeks and posting at the Town Hall for the same period of time at a price not less than

unpaid tax, interest and costs with the further authority to reject any and all bids, but the Selectmen shall sell the property to the prior owner for the amount of any unpaid taxes, interest, and costs then due.

ART. 39. To see if the Town will vote to set a specified time for the treasurer to pay Selectmen's warrants.

ART. 40. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

The registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open, Friday, March 9, 1984 to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 10, 1984 at 8:30 o'clock a.m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not, and have the Warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
