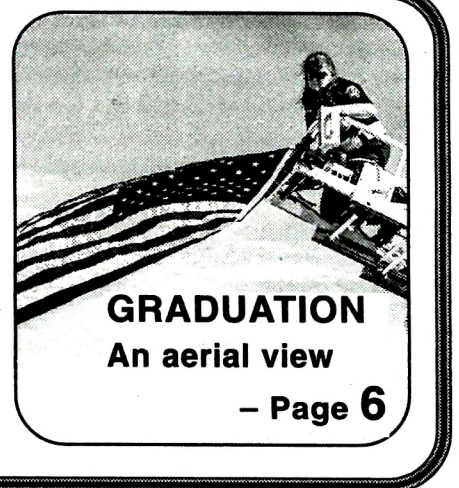

## Annual budget under review

*Council near final vote on 2020-2021 data*

BUCKSPORT – Next week (6/25) is the evening for those who revel in numbers, and municipal numbers in particular.

The Town Council will be holding the annual public hearings on the \$5.8 million 2020-2021 municipal, sewer, marina, capital improvement budgets and more.

The numbers are not expected to be controversial, as the goal is to hold both the town's taxes and sewer rates to about even with the current ones.

The overall proposed municipal budget actually is down by about \$111,000. This was achieved by removing the nor-

mal annual spending on roadwork from the budget as the town embarks on a three-year \$3 million campaign to improve the streets. It also involved tapping the stabilization reserves.

The session next Thursday will continue to be a virtual one, with the public able to watch on cable channel 1303 or via the internet at [https://townhall-streams.com/towns/bucksport\\_me](https://townhall-streams.com/towns/bucksport_me)

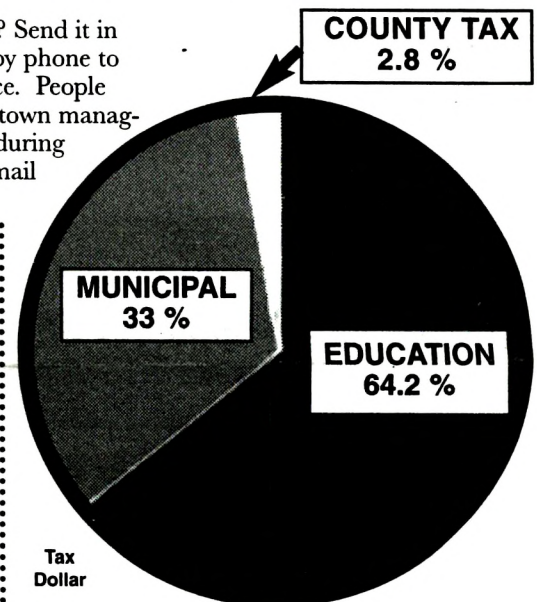

Also on the agenda next week is a public hearing on several councilors' calls to have all of their e-mail correspondence with one another and the town manager posted on the town website each week.

## Higher pay for town councilors?

BUCKSPORT – The town councilors have been receiving the same rate of pay for 32 years - \$40 per meeting per councilor and \$50 for the mayor. Now, one councilor is saying it's time they got a raise.

Such requests have been

made on-and-off in the past, but elected officials have been wary. When Councilor James Morrison raised the issue last week, Mayor Peter Stewart said the panel could consider the idea, but he reminded them that pay raises have been a sticky issue in the past.

Stewart also noted in recent

years three councilors even offered to donate their pay - \$40 per meeting and \$50 for the mayor - back to the town. However, none did.

Morrison later indicated he plans to spur the discussion, in fairness to present and future members of the Town Council.

The town manager advised that changing the rate will take a charter change. To get a referendum on the November ballot requires a council decision by Aug. 20. The councilors first started getting paid in July, 1988, and the rates have not have been changed since then.

## Lingering legal wrangle now history

**Fort Knox Inn vs. Town**

BUCKSPORT – The dispute between the town and a local motel owner that has cost both sides thousands of dollars in legal fees has ended.

A Hancock County Superior Court panel has upheld the initial mediated agreement to settle the original dispute between Lawrence Green, the owner of the Fort Knox Inn, and the Town of Bucksport.

Green was upset when the town took the narrow strip of land under the Penobscot River Walkway behind the Main Street business. He filed suit, and after months of legal back-and-forth, the mediated agreement was signed by both sides.

## IN THE WORKS . . . Tidbits gleaned from week's news

**PLAYING AROUND** – The Town Council last week spent more than a half-hour debating how best to open the town's playing fields, playgrounds and recreation areas to the public mid-pandemic. In the end, they reached no firm conclusions, but asked the town manager to draft some guidelines.

Councilor Paul Bissonette summed up the mood, noting strict regulations probably would be hard to enforce and, perhaps, "we have to leave it up to the parents" on who does what where in the public spaces. Public Safety Director Sean Geagan said he suspects about half the residents want to see the outdoor spaces opened up, while the other half favor keeping them closed.

**COUNCIL SPLIT** – In one of its rare displays of discord within the council, the panel last week split 4-to-2 on whether to provide another \$20,000 to

underwrite the part-time salary of the executive director of the Main Street Bucksport development group. Councilors Peter Stewart, Paul Bissonette, Edward Rankin Jr., and Kathy Downes backed the idea, citing a number of phone calls and e-mails in supporting the group they received last week. Councilors Dan Ormsby and James Morrison spoke against the idea, saying they believe there are better ways for the town to spend that sum.

No formal vote was taken, but each councilor clearly stated their view. Councilor Mark Eastman could not participate in the discussion because his wife, Brook Ewing Minner, directs the not-for-profit group.

**FIRE TRUCKIN'** – The Fire Department is ordering its new \$141,756, light-duty rescue truck, a 2020 model to be built in Waterville, finished in Bangor and striped and decaled in Bucksport.

The unit will replace a 1994 Maxim the deputy chief says won't pass another inspection. The town manager said the new truck should last at least 25 years.

**FILL 'ER UP!** Work has begun on the repairs to the municipal swimming pool. The initial excavation work uncovered some of the infrastructure in better shape than had been expected as well as some unanticipated problems.

Still, the pool should be ready to hold water by August after repairs costing under \$100,000. Replacing the pool had been estimated at up to \$1 million when voters were asked - and agreed to issue bonds to pay for the work.

**LOAN BACKED** – The Town Council has loaned Dennis and Sue Mason \$6,000 to install a sewer line to their commercial building on U.S. Route 1. The money is being loaned for 36 months, but the Masons told the councilors last week they expect

to pay it back much sooner than that.

Some cash also will pay for landscaping at the former school-house once the sewer line is in.

**ATTN: VOTERS** – Voting in the July 14 primaries may be a little slower and considerably more regulated as the state imposes new COVID-19 guidelines. No more than 50 people in the building, extra sanitary precautions and a call for voters to wear masks.

However, a voter cannot be denied access to the polls if they show up without a facial covering. Poll workers will wear them.

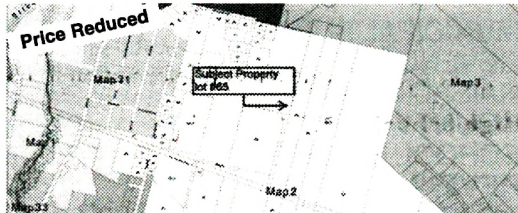

The town received notice late last week that Green's attempts to overturn the agreement he originally agreed to had been denied. The ruling said Green had no grounds for his repeated efforts to overturn that agreement, and also agreed that an appeals judge was right in upholding that pact.

Under the initial settlement, Green and his Bucksport Motel Properties, Inc. received a cash settlement and got the town to

underwrite privacy screening shades and security cameras on the back of his building.

The three years of legal wrangling has cost the town well over \$30,000. Town officials also have spent hours in the effort to keep around-the-clock public access to the walkway.

Green had wanted the town to install gates at both ends of the short, narrow strip, and then lock them each night and reopen them each morning. The Town Council decided to seize the land instead.

# What's Plan B?

If someone told you they'd take care of your rubbish every week and then faltered and, occasionally, stopped altogether, only to re-start and stop again, you'd seriously look for a Plan B. That time has come for Bucksport and the 114 other communities which have contracted with the new Coastal Resources of Maine trash processing plant in Hampden.

The plant, developed by Fiberight LLC, now is temporarily closed - again. It owes \$1.2 million to a crucial contractor, who has quit and is suing to get money it already has earned. And Coastal/Fiberight needs \$14.7 million just to re-open. Meanwhile, many huge efforts to recycle trash are dead in the water, and the resulting rubbish is being buried in landfills once again.

All in all, it's an environmental, financial, managerial and municipal disaster - and not a surprising one. As Paul Rabs, a former town councilor here, and this newspaper reported years ago, Fiberight left a trail of unfulfilled promises to municipalities in the Midwest. It never had attempted a plant on the scale it built in Hampden.

It's beyond time to be exploring Plan B.

## A fresh start!

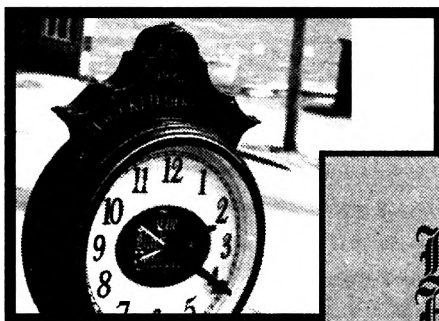
When you're in the moat and the alligators just have been released, it can be hard to concentrate on the future. The present danger is too much with you.

Communities, like the people that comprise them, know they need to cope with those immediate needs, but in periods like this one we also have the obligation to give at least some thoughts to what we want to become. ## Now that the chamber has closed . . .

One lasting lesson I learned in a long business career was that strong, mutual support of - and within - the local business community is good for everyone. Maybe some day we will all be content to stay in our homes and have everything dropped at our door. Yet, for me, I'd rather deal with a local business with someone I know, right here where I live, keeping the dollars I have earned by serving local people rotating through the community. What helps me, helps you, and around and around it goes. If there's anything the virus has taught us, it's how we need and depend on each other.

Now with a pending business venture of my own in Bucksport, it was hard to read about our local chamber of commerce deciding to shut down due to financial viability. Especially hard with Bucksport on a path of real progress and a promising future. The chamber will be missed, but there is good news in our town. We still have all the elements for success. A strong local government with vision that continues to move forward. Residents who support each other and their town. Committed groups that have not stopped working. A resilient business community and the unique beauty of our place. This virus will pass and Bucksport's future remains bright. The article [in the June 4 *Bucksport Enterprise*] about the chamber also mentions Main Street Bucksport and being the president of its board, I'd like to give a quick update on some of our work and plans for the future. Our business coffee hours continue (virtually), Kids on Main will return in a redesigned, safe for the times, format. A grant has been received for 3 or 4 more art murals in downtown and another grant has been awarded for a self guided walking tour project, "Museum in the Streets", to be completed with the Historical Society. Both of these were identified as priority efforts in the final Heart & Soul report.

The Bucks' Bucks Fund has started and been generously supported by personal and business donors with every dollar, now over \$16,000 raised, going to support "a smoking' deal" at local businesses affected by the pandemic. If you don't know about the program, you should because the donated

dollars in the fund turn \$10 Bucks you purchase into \$20 at all the participating Bucksport businesses. So far more than 1,400 \$10 Bucks have been sold to almost 200 people which, when redeemed, will generate over \$28,000 in local business. Over 50 citizens and businesses less affected by the pandemic have contributed to the fund and at its present level of support, we have a few more \$10 Bucks to sell.

Hopefully more donations will come in and the program will continue throughout the summer. You can find more about the program and purchase Bucks on Main Street Bucksport's website ([www.mainstreet-bucksport.org](http://www.mainstreet-bucksport.org)).

Businesses are enthusiastic and customers are loving the deal. Remember that around and around it goes, this program is a perfect example of how that works. In other news, the arts festival has been canceled, but the International Film Festival is moving forward under a format appropriate to our new reality.

Despite the pandemic, there are many things happening that will have positive impacts on the future of the town. An example of one of those is the town's awarding of the contract for a marketing plan to a Maine company. Through my work with the town's Economic Development Committee, I know the town and the company who received the contract will be seeking input from businesses, groups and residents. Without the chamber, there will be one important voice missing, and it will be incumbent on Main Street Bucksport and others to be that voice and continue to find more ways to support our town and its business community as the chamber did for many years.

With the generous financial support of the town, its residents, businesses, and volunteers, Main Street Bucksport, like others, will certainly be working hard to develop more innovative programs like Bucks' Bucks, find more grant funding, and be one of the groups to help fill the void left by the chamber's closing.

Yet the public continues to tolerate the Municipal Review Committee (MRC), representing some 115 cities and towns, hiding behind the screen that "legal obligations under the current

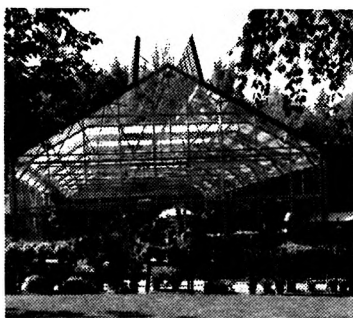
contract" prevent them from negotiating with PERC for a logical and common-sense resolution of their dilemma.

### 'Pier-side cruise' MMA's answer to COVID-19

**CASTINE**—The Maine Maritime Academy will run a pier-side training cruise for graduating seniors aboard the *US State of Maine* with the help of two Maine organizations - The Jackson Laboratory and Puritan Medical Products.

Sixty students, faculty and crew will "self-quarantine" after being double-tested for COVID-19 prior to boarding. The ship will use test specimen collection kits from Guilford-based Puritan. The Bar Harbor laboratory will test the samples at its Connecticut-licensed and accredited lab. The test results will be ready within 24 hours.

Previously, the Jackson lab focused on complex tumor profiling assays to help cancer patients. When the pandemic hit, the lab quickly adapted its capabilities to now test samples for a specific RNA signature unique to SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19.

Senior engineering and navigation students must have hours at sea time and required by the U.S. Coast Guard to obtain limited license credentials and air degrees. They will stay aboard the ship for the entire pier-side training period - from July 8 to August 4.

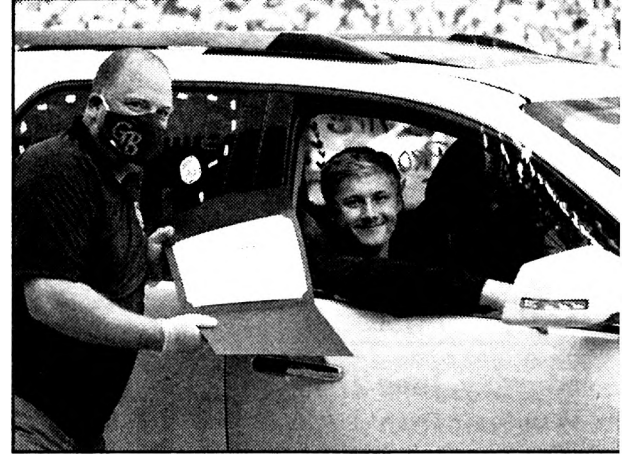
