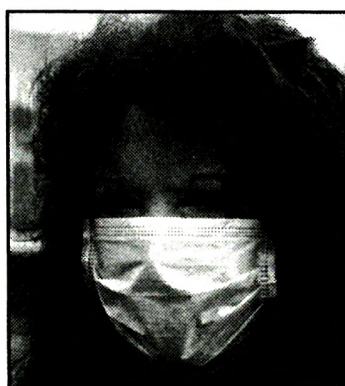
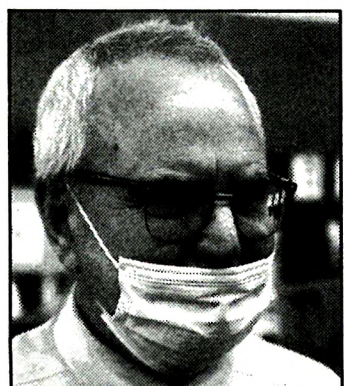
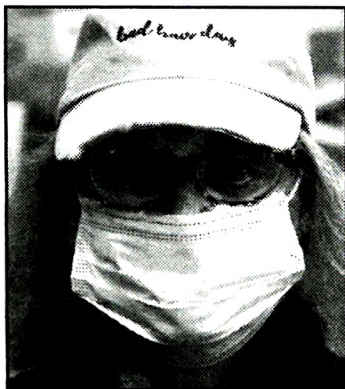

## Bucksport, Verona trash goes to PERC

BUCKSPORT – Rubbish from Bucksport and Verona Island now is being sent temporarily to the Penobscot Energy Recovery Co. (PERC) plant in Orrington.

Orland's solid waste has continued to be processed there since before some 130 communities broke away to join in sending their rubbish to the controversial Coastal Energy/Fiberight plant recently built in Hampden.

Citing "a lot of feedback" from his constituents, Town Councilor Edward Rankin Jr. last Thursday (6/25) called on the town manager and his colleagues to consider backing away from the stalled trash-to-energy operation in Hampden.

Rankin said he finds it

appalling that the town's trash is being buried in landfills again after the years-long effort to get the Hampden plant up and running properly.

He cited growing evidence the Hampden plant won't get the millions of dollars needed to re-start it. Councilor James Morrison added that Coastal/Fiberight's leadership has failed to meet the contracts they negotiated with Bucksport and more than 120 other communities. He suggested the town take steps to cancel the arrangement.

The next day, Town Manager Susan M. Lessard received word that all of the communities in the Bangor area now are free to send their trash to the PERC plant.

That began this week in Bucksport.

The Hampden plant's on-again, off-again operation has been embarrassing, even before it was completed for it failed to be finished on time and within the original budget.

At last week's meeting Lessard again suggested the only alternative - the Penobscot Energy Recovery Co., (PERC) plant in Orrington - has a different set of issues and is "struggling" as a result of "different reasons" than those which have crippled the Hampden plant. However, she did not detail what she considers to be PERC's problems.

State officials said they acted, "in an effort to ease the amount of bypass waste going to the Juniper Ridge landfill. That landfill no longer is accepting rubbish from the communities on the state list. Those communities not on the list will continue to use the Crossroads Landfill in Norridgewock.

## Domestic violence spurs major response

VERONA ISLAND – Last week law enforcement personnel mounted one of the largest responses to an incident on the island in decades, a response that resulted in three arrests.

Acting on a citizen's concern about a possible serious domestic violence situation, Hancock County Sheriff's Office began investigating and learned of what was described as "a very violent domestic violence incident which had been occurring for several hours." The deputies got search warrants for a home at 22 Westside Drive on the island and an arrest warrant for Jeffery A. Witham, 44, who resided there.

At one point last Thursday (6/25), a person on the scene claimed counting roughly two dozen law enforcement response vehicles near the home and on nearby U.S. Route 1.

About 1 a.m. last Thursday (6/25) the deputies tried to execute the search warrants at the home to obtain evidence as part of the investigation and to arrest Witham. After several hours it was determined additional resources were needed to safely execute the search warrants. The Maine State Police arrived to assist.

About 9 a.m., the warrants

were safely executed which resulted in the arrests of Nathan Dilworth, 41, of Verona Island and Texas. Dilworth was charged with possessing a firearm prohibited to do so, a Class C felony.

Lintisha M. Oliveras, 37, also a resident of the Verona Island home, was charged with violating the conditions of release imposed in an earlier

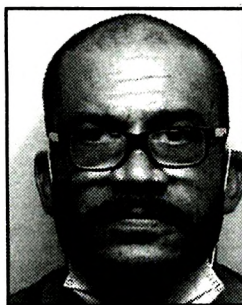
case.

Both were taken to the Hancock County Jail.

The deputies completed their search of the home, but Witham was not located.

The investigation moved into Penobscot County, and with the assistance of the Bangor Police Department, Maine State Police and the Maine Drug Enforcement Task Force, Witham was located in Plymouth and arrested by the Maine State Police on the arrest warrants stemming from the incidents on Verona.

• Witham is charged with two counts of domestic violence assault, with a prior conviction on that charge; terrorizing with a dangerous weapon; aggravated assault; domestic violence criminal threatening; and possession of a firearm by a prohibited person.

## IN THE WORKS . . . Tidbits gleaned from the week's news

SPLISHIN' 'N' SPLASHIN – The municipal swimming pool should be ready for some serious swimming by later this month, according to town officials. The recent repairs have yielded a pool that has proved it can hold water once again, and they were done at a small fraction of the \$1 million the taxpayers said they were willing to pay to get back into the swim.

Thanks to the repairs and some new epoxy paint, the pool should be splashing good for at least another decade, according to Town Manager Susan M. Lessard.

STAND UP, and be counted! – Several groups and individuals are coordinating a local campaign to get everyone to complete the 2020 census. The numbers tallied in the census are to be used to allocate all sorts of dollars, from those spent on education to those

supporting services for older residents. The effort has support of both town and RSU 25 officials.

HIRING – Town Clerk Jacob Gran is seeking a few good election day clerks to help make the polling place at the G.H. Jewett School run smoothly on Tuesday, July 14. The polls will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Voters will be casting ballots in the Democrat and Republican primaries and on several state-wide bond issues. Orland voters also have a two-person race for a single seat on the Board of Selectmen.

TO POST, or not to post? – That question was answered last week when the Town Council opted not to seek a Town Charter change that would have required most all

communications among and between the the councilors and the town manager to be posted each week on the town's website.. Most of the councilors actually favored the move, but were put off by a suggestion that the weekly posting be accompanied by a requirement that all town officials' communications be made available and that each department head be required to maintain daily phone and calendar appointment logs, too.

The paperwork was deemed an unneeded intrusion and a waste of the employees' time.

FLUSH MONEY? – The sewer rates will remain unchanged for another year. They've been virtually the same since July, 2015. New customers, most of them industrial, are providing almost \$20,000 more each quarter and the solar installation at the sewage plant should save \$1,500-a-month in electricity, the town manager said.

### DOCTOR IS IN . . . PRINT –

The first book in a series based on a blog he's been writing since 2018 until earlier this year, **Dr. Hans Duvefelt** next week began distributing his first book on Amazon and the paperback version through the usual channels.

A Country Doctor Writes" is a collection of short essays on diagnoses made, missed or just encountered. Duvefelt also shares some of the human circumstances, destinies, tragedies and victories he has encountered during 40 years in family medicine.

Now semi-retired and residing in The County, Duvefelt spent years on the staff of the Bucksport Regional Health Center.

The doctor has written vignettes ranging from treating Alexithymia to what doctors call Zebras, an exotic condition physicians always look for, but usually never encounter.

From delivering babies to attending timely and untimely deaths, the vignettes touch on many stages of life. Some describe overlooked diseases and disease mechanisms and some describe heart-rending life circumstances caused by both rare and common diseases.

## A fresh start - Part 2

As mentioned in last week's *Enterprise*, this is the first in a series of editorials aimed at dusting off - and actually putting in place - some of the great ideas offered in recent years to make this region an even better place.

Bucksport officials have made great strides in completing the clean-up of the long-vacant lot the town found itself with in the aftermath of acquiring and demolishing several buildings on Main Street.

Real estate professionals have done their best for several years to market the wide-but-not-very-deep lot, and now the pandemic speculative building projects are on hold across the country. Meanwhile, the lot sits, a visible reminder of the \$300,000-or-so local tax dollars spent there. Now town-owned, the site - a focal point on Main Street - generates nothing.

Why not put out a call for three or four volunteers, people with experience in real estate development? Ask them to find a long-term fix, if possible, and a short-term public use of the land in the interim. Give 'em a deadline and then evaluate their recommendations.

Successful real estate development takes vision and commitment, and is outside the realm of traditional economic and community development, especially in a small community.

The answer to what to do with a potentially important piece of very visible property will not come from some outsider anxious to "flip" it for a maximum and quick return. That's not only wishful; it's potentially, harmful thinking.

Now, the only plan in the offing appears to be slipping a few bucks to some UMaine students for a pretty sketch of what they think might be built here. That's not a bold, practical plan for action. The council recently spent a few thousand dollars for a sketch of what proved to be a more than \$2 million makeover of the small depot/museum. That yielded nothing. What's next? Sketch 2.0?

It is important that we have good response rate to the census

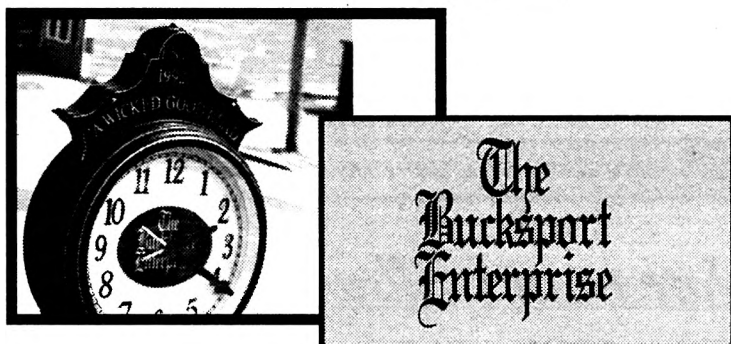
because the results of that tally are used in many important decisions related to federal funding for schools, hospitals, roads and public works.

## Dave Davis: A remembrance

Dave Davis would not want us to begin a memoir of his life by listing his many contributions and achievements. He was not that kind of man.

Our local paper, the *Bucksport Enterprise*, described Dave as "the poet who dwelled and flourished by the river;" the Narramissic River, in Orland, Maine to be precise. He was a gentle man, a humble man, who observed and appreciated all that life brought his way. Dave's collection of poems is titled "Ready to be Surprised."

In his poem "Wishing," Dave wrote "Tears come to my eyes when I count all blessings. No more will I wish my life away."

His book is full of poems about his family activities with his wife, children, grandchildren and friends. Poems like "Belly Hockey," "One More Swing," "Late Winter Snowfall," and

"Whence Hoo Hoo" describe a man in love with his family. He also was a man with a hint of mischief in his eyes, a ready smile and a contagious laugh.

The accomplishments of a person who has been married for 70 years is never about just one person. Ginny, Dave's wife and active partner, was beside him and supported him as he participated in many career and community activities. Dave wore many hats: mill worker, manager of the Community Development Department of the Cooperative Extension at the University of Maine, and greenhouse business manager. He participated in the local Grange, the Masons, the local Methodist Church, the Orland Historical Society and the Bucksport Bay Area Chamber of Commerce. He and Ginny were also instrumental in starting the Narramissic Valley Friends Meeting in Orland, which has continued to meet since the 1970's. Anyone who knew Dave would agree he lived his beliefs.

Dave was not a person to give unsolicited advice. The closest he comes is a poem in his book "Ready to be Surprised" titled "A Living Marker."

*On this solstice night  
A winter's moon shines full  
Upon majestic, white pine  
Reminding us all:  
Stand firm, stand tall.  
Faith, tenderness and love will  
Weather all seasons.*

We believe that Dave is still, "Ready to be Surprised."

### Francis R. Bartley, 1931 - 2020

BUCKSPORT – Francis "Frank" R. Bartley was born at home on a family farm at Dennistown Plantation (Jackman) to George Abel Bartley and Marie Louise Rodrigue. His birth was in the midst of a brutal snowstorm, the great depression and the height of prohibition. 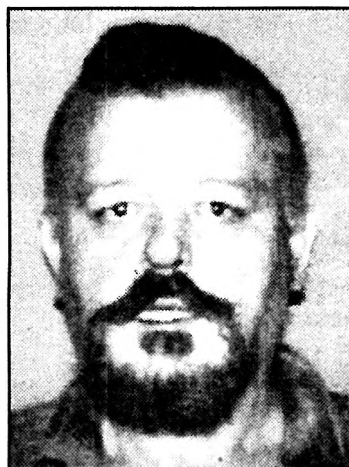
### Charles A. Robshaw, 1949 - 2020

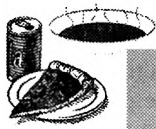

## Town reports fewer tax liens filed

BUCKSPORT — Town officials closed the municipal books on the fiscal year that ended this week, and they did so with some strong economic news:

- The number of tax liens filed as a result of overdue taxes was lower than last year, despite the damages of the pandemic-impacted economy.

- Many local taxpayers also anted up earlier than in the recent past, avoiding late fees

and allowing the town to invest some of the tax money earlier than normal.

- And Town Manager Susan M. Lessard reported that excise tax collections were up by some \$30,000 over the initial projections. The reason? Some vigorous truck and car buying by the public, reflecting a long period of pent-up demand and strong discounts to move the vehicles off the dealers' lots.
