

Superintendent of Schools Report

This year my report to the people of Westport will focus not so much on this past year as on the future. The existing climate requires a report that provides facts so that informed decisions can be reached. The educators in School Union #48 are professionals who merit our support. If we are to continue providing the education our children deserve it will require not only better salaries for teachers but also reasonable class sizes, adequate facilities and necessary educational books and supplies. We cannot maintain your schools adequately in the face of major budget cuts. Quality education cannot be mandated from Augusta if it is not a local priority.

The towns that comprise School Union #48 have enjoyed a long standing relationship of cooperation and commitment to the betterment of the entire area. That spirit has been fostered in large part due to the leadership demonstrated by elected officials in Wiscasset. However, in 1987 two issues will be decided which may alter that spirit of cooperation.

First, there is an effort to increase dramatically and swiftly the rate of tuition to attend Wiscasset Schools. Based on this year's figures it would generate \$545,000 in revenue to Wiscasset. Unless spent for another purpose or put into reserve accounts, the largest taxpayer in Wiscasset would gain \$523,200 and the people of the Town would save \$21,800. The three area towns would need to raise an additional \$545,000 out of taxpayers' pockets without state participation.

Second, there are those that advocate the elimination of tuition students as a way to avoid building additional facilities. In the past the Town of Wiscasset encouraged the area towns to send their students here to be educated. Currently, approximately one-third of the student body is from the area towns - at the high school that figure is forty-eight percent. The results to the education of all students when you reduce the high school to half its current size are significant and need to be reviewed carefully prior to making the decision. Will the individuals who say we can continue the same programs with two-thirds

the current student body be there when the per pupil cost soars?

Decisions to these questions will be reached. They will not be decided by me, or by the teaching staff, or by the student. I only ask that you look at all the facts and discuss the impact to Westport students with the people who will decide - the citizens of Wiscasset.

Some specific comments regarding the Westport School Department budget. The proposed budget for the 1987-88 school year is \$281,325.70, a 43.3% increase over the 1986-87 amount (\$196,272.87). This represents a 16.8% increase in the tax commitment or an increased dollar amount of \$31,004.01. The state's share of the budget went up 504.3% to a sum of \$32,697.25. The increase in the budget is due to an increase in the tuition rate and number of students on Westport and the need to provide for the special education needs of the students.

Time & Tide RC&D Area Report

It is with a great deal of pleasure that we submit to you our report of Time & Tide Resource Conservation & Development Area activities for 1986. This is a people's program. Our area was expanded in 1986 to include all of Waldo, Knox, Lincoln and Sagadahoc Counties and Brunswick and Harpswell. It is sponsored by the counties, Eastern Mid Coast Planning Commission and soil and water conservation districts, so it's directed by local people called a council, which meets the first Wednesday of every month in Waldoboro. The public is welcome.

We have volunteer committees covering soils and land use, forestry, ocean, energy, recreation and tourism, agriculture, fish and wildlife, information and a new committee in 1986, water resources. The committees make suggestions for program direction. Anyone interested is welcome to serve on one or more committees of his choice.

We are pleased to report that the Time & Tide RC&D Area was selected as one of the outstanding RC&D's in New England. This makes 6 out of 7 years.

We were honored this year to have one of our council members, Anne Favreau, Brunswick, elected president of the New England Association of RC&D Areas for 1987.

Supplement #10 to the Program of Action was developed. It includes a calendar with scenes of the Mid Coast area. Copies were distributed to all town officials.

Through cooperative efforts, many things were accomplished this past year. We believe no one person, organization or agency can take total credit, but with everyone working together doing a little bit, a lot is accomplished.

We completed 32 measures, or projects, in 1986 and received 29 new requests for assistance from towns and others.

Some of the projects deal with salt and sand piles in Troy, flood problems in Stockton Springs, erosion problems in Belfast, erosion problems at the Belfast Water Co. dam, planning workshops for town officials, indoor air pollution booklet, ag/energy conference, kiln dust in agriculture, Bremen municipal facilities, clam diggers newsletter, Rockland breakwater park, St. George light house, pollution from sea gulls, Bowdoinham - update comprehensive plan, Brunswick shore erosion, to name only a few.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Accounting policies of the Town of Westport conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

A. Basis of Presentation

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The various funds are grouped by type in the financial statements.

Governmental Funds

General Fund - The general fund is the general operating fund of the Town. All general tax revenues and other receipts that are not allocated by law or contractual agreement to another fund are accounted for in this fund. From the fund are paid the general operating expenditures, the fixed charges and the capital improvement costs that are not paid through other funds.

Special Revenue Fund - Special revenue funds are used to account for revenues derived from specific taxes or other earmarked revenue sources, including federal revenue sharing.

Fiduciary Funds

Trust Funds - Trust funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the Town for others.

B. Basis of Accounting

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed by the governmental funds. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when received in cash except for property tax revenues which are recorded as deferred tax revenues unless collectible within sixty days following the year end. Expenditures, other than interest on long-term debt, are recorded when the liability is incurred.

C. General Fixed Assets

The Town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets. Expenditures for property and equipment are charged against departmental operations whenever such items are purchased.

2. Property Tax

The Town's property tax for the current year was levied October 1, 1986 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 1986 for all real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due on November 1, 1986 and interest charged at the rate of 12% per year retroactive to October 1, 1986.

3. Deferred Tax Revenues

The National Council on Governmental Accounting (N.C.G.A.) Interpretation No. 3 requires that property tax revenue be recognized to the extent it will be collected within sixty days following the year end.

As of December 31, 1986, deferred tax revenues amounted to \$12,150.00, reflecting an increase of \$850.00 of the prior year's balance.

4. Deferred Credits

Deferred credits represent items received during the current accounting period which are to be used as revenue in the subsequent year. These accounts were as follows at December 31, 1986:

5. General Fund Budget

The Town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles, on which amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or the Budget Committee.

6. Designated for Special Reserves

Special reserve accounts for various purposes have been established in the past by vote of the townspeople. These accounts were invested in savings accounts and a certificate of deposit at year end.

7. Designated for Subsequent Year's Expenditures

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances and/or overdrafts forward to the following year for expenditure. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

9. Vacation/Sick Leave Accruals

The accruals for the Town of Westport are not material and need not be disclosed.

10. General

Transfers from surplus, excise tax revenue and federal revenue sharing funds for various current year operations were voter authorized at the annual town meeting. State revenue sharing funds, tree growth tax, watercraft excise taxes, veteran's tax exemption and state services

payments of \$8,029.00, \$71.52, \$2,467.60, \$133.35 and \$120.33 respectively were applied to reduce the 1986 tax levy.

RECOMMENDATION . . . The following recommendation is worthy of consideration:

We recommend that the Town maintain property and equipment records. These records should include at actual cost, or historical cost if actual cost is not determinable, all capital items purchased, land, buildings and additions. Deletions should be at actual or historical cost as a result of sale, trade-in or discard. In addition, a Town official should be designated to perform periodic inventory checks to ascertain that the items are accounted for properly and adequately safeguarded.

ART. 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the tax year of 1987.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will vote to set a date when taxes shall be payable and to set an interest rate due thereafter.

Recommended that taxes be due and payable on November 1, 1987 and that interest shall be due on taxes paid after November 1, 1987 at the rate of 11% per annum and shall be computed from the date of commitment.

ART. 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of tax acquired property by bid process following advertisement in the Lincoln and Sagadahoc newspapers for three consecutive weeks and posting at the Town Hall for the same period of time at a price not less than unpaid tax, interest and costs with the further authority to reject any and all bids, but the Selectmen shall sell the property to the prior owner for the amount of any unpaid taxes, interest and costs when due.

ART. 40. To see if the Town will vote to set a specified time for the Treasurer to pay Selectmen's warrants.

ART. 41. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

ART. 42. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Minimum Lot Size Ordinance as follows:

MINIMUM LOT SIZE ORDINANCE

I. Single Family Dwellings:

No Single family dwelling shall be erected or building altered to accommodate one family as a residence on less than a ~~one~~ three acre lot area.

II. Two Family or Multiple Residential Dwellings:

No two family or multiple residential dwellings shall be erected

or buildings altered to accommodate two family or multiple residential dwellings unless there is maintained a ratio of ~~one~~ **three** acre lot area to each family living unit.

III. Commerical and Industrial Structures:

No Commercial or Industrial Structure shall be erected, or building altered to accommodate a Commercial or Industrial Use on less than a ~~one three~~ acre lot area.

IV. Exemptions:

~~This ordinance shall in no way apply to lots of less than one acre which are in existence at the effective date of this ordinance.~~

A single lot of record which, at the effective date of adoption or amendment of this Ordinance, does not meet the area or width requirements, or both, in the Town of Westport, may be built upon provided that such lot shall be in separate ownership and not be contiguous with any other lot in the same ownership, and that all other provisions of this Ordinance shall be met. If two or more contiguous lots or parcels are in single ownership of record at the time of adoption or amendment of this Ordinance, and if all or part of the lots do not meet the dimensional requirements of this Ordinance, the lands involved shall be considered to be a single parcel for the purpose of this Ordinance. A building lawful at the time of adoption or subsequent amendment to this Ordinance, may continue although it does not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance.

ART. 43. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section V of the Shoreline Zoning Ordinance as follows:

SECTION V Area and Lot Size Regulations

A. Minimum Lot Size Within the Rural Residential District.

1. Single family dwellings:

No single family dwelling shall be erected or building altered to accommodate one family as a residence on less than a ~~one three~~ acre area.

2. Two family or Multiple dwellings:

No two-family or multiple dwellings shall be erected or buildings altered to accommodate two-family or multiple dwellings unless there is maintained a ratio of a ~~one~~ **three** acre lot area to each family living unit.

B. Minimum Lot Width and Frontage Within the Rural Residential District

1. Single family dwellings:

No Single family dwelling shall be erected or building altered to accommodate one family as a residence on a lot having a width of ~~one hundred (100')~~ **two hundred (200')** feet measured through that part of the building where the lot is narrowest.

2. Two family or Multiple dwellings:

No two-family or multiple dwellings shall be erected or buildings altered to accommodate two-family or multiple dwellings on lots having less than an additional fifty (50') foot width through building than that part of the building where the lot is narrowest, per additional living unit, above and beyond the initial ~~one hundred (100')~~ **two hundred (200')** foot width limitation for single family dwellings.

3. Frontage:

a. Single family dwellings: No lot shall have frontage less than ~~one hundred (100')~~ **two hundred (200')** feet, on a public or private roadway or on any lake, pond, river, stream or seashore.

b. Two family or Multiple Dwellings: No two family or multiple dwellings shall be erected or buildings altered to accommodate two-family or multiple dwellings on lots having less than an additional fifty (50') foot frontage on a public or private roadway or on any lake, pond, river, stream, or seashore per additional family living unit, above and beyond the initial ~~one hundred (100')~~ **two hundred (200')** foot limitation for single family dwellings.

Set Back

1. No building or structure or any portion thereof except steps and uncovered porches extending less than ten (10') feet from building shall be erected within ~~forty (40')~~ **seventy-five (75')** feet from the right-of-way sideline of any road or street. If there is no established right-of-way sideline for any road or street, said sideline shall be deemed to be sixteen and one-half (16 1/2') feet from the center line of the road or street.

2. No building or structure, or any portion thereof except steps and uncovered porches extending less than 10 feet from building shall be erected within seventy-five (75') feet of mean annual high water line, except those buildings or structures requiring direct access to the water as an operational necessity.

D. Side Yards - Rear Yards

For every building erected in any district, there shall be a minimum side lot clearance on each side of said building of not less

than twenty (20') feet, which space shall remain open and unoccupied by any structure.

No building or structure or any portion thereof except steps and uncovered porches extending less than ten (10') feet from building shall be erected within forty (40') feet of any back lot line.

E. Corner Lots

The setback building line on a corner lot shall be in accordance with the provisions governing the road or street on which the building faces. If possible, the side yards clearance on the side street should conform to the setback line for an inside lot on said street or road, but in no event shall said side yard clearance be less than forty (40') feet from the right of way sideline.

ART. 44. To see if the Town will vote to amend ARTICLE V, (5.2) and (5.3) of the Subdivision Standards and Procedures as follows:

5.2. Fees.

~~All applications for plan approval under this Article shall be accompanied by a fee of \$25.00 plus five dollars for each lot over five.~~

All applications for approval of a Minor Subdivision shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00. All applications for approval of a Major Subdivision shall be accomplished by a fee of \$100.00 plus \$10.00 for each lot over five. In addition, the applicant shall pay reasonable review costs incurred by the municipality, including but not limited to review of the application by the municipal engineer or by legal counsel.

5.3. Approval.

Within 30 days from the date of submission of a completed application, the Planning Board shall hold a public hearing on said application. Notice of such hearing shall be given in a newspaper of general circulation in Lincoln County at least seven days prior to said hearing. The Board shall require the applicant to notify abutters to the proposed subdivision of the public hearing.

The applicant or his agent shall appear at any hearing held by the Board for the purposes of answering questions about and providing information relative to his application.

Within 30 days from the date of the public hearing, the following submission of a completed application, the Planning Board shall approve conditionally approve, or disapprove the final Plan. The Board shall specify in writing its reasons for any conditions or disapproval, and notification shall be mailed immediately to the applicant.

In the event the Board is unable, because of snow cover, to examine the site, the date for a public hearing shall be extended until such time as the Board may reasonably inspect the site.

ART. 45. To see if the Town will vote to amend ARTICLE VII of the Subdivision Standards and Procedures Ordinance as follows:

ARTICLE VII - STREETS

Any street or road constructed within a subdivision shall be constructed in accordance with the following minimum provisions:

A. Definitions.

1. Street-A way for vehicular traffic, however designated, serving more than one residential unit or more than one lot.
2. Minor Street-A Street which is used primarily for access to the abutting properties.
3. Sub-grade-The shaped and compacted foundation of a road lying beneath the traveled way.
4. Gravel Surface-The layer of gravel which lies above the subgrade and forms the traveled way.

B. Design Standards.

1. All streets shall be designed so that they will provide safe vehicular travel and where possible shall conform to existing topography.
2. Minimum width.
 - a. width of right of way - - - 32'
 - b. width of traveled way - - - 18'
3. Shoulders. A traveled way with drainage ditch on either side shall include gravel shoulders 4' wide on both sides unless otherwise approved by the Planning Board and the ~~Road Commissioner~~ **a Registered professional Engineer chosen by the Planning Board at the applicant's expense.**
4. Drainage.
 - a. All streets shall have adequate facilities for removal of storm waters.
 - b. No surface drainage shall be conveyed or directed across a traveled way.
 - c. Ditches shall have side slopes no less than 2% unless otherwise permitted by the Planning Board and the ~~Road Commissioner~~ **a Registered professional Engineer chosen by the Planning Board at the applicant's expense.**

5. Grade.

No grade shall be greater than 12% with at least one hundred foot (100') visibility at all times to the end that a driver at four feet (4') above the road surface can see the road surface one hundred feet (100') ahead at all times.

6. Curves.

All curves shall be constructed to provide for a minimum visibility of one hundred feet (100') at all times.

C. Standards of Construction.

1. Subgrades.

a. All tree stumps, roots, and organic matter shall be removed to the full width of the traveled way.

b. The subgrade shall be carefully graded and compacted for approval by the ~~Road Commissioner~~ **a Registered professional Engineer to be chosen by the Planning Board at the applicant's expense.**

c. Sub-grade fills shall be constructed with materials meeting the requirements of Maine Department of Transportation Standard Specifications in current effect.

2. Gravel Surface.

a. The gravel surface shall be at least 1' 2" deep and shall be compacted to the satisfaction of the ~~Road Commissioner~~ **a Registered professional Engineer to be chosen by the Planning Board at the applicant's expense.**

b. Gravel shall be applied in layers not over 8" deep and thoroughly before placing the next lift.

c. The top 6" of gravel shall conform to Maine Department of Transportation Standard Specifications currently in effect.

Aggregate for untreated surface course and levelling course shall be screened or crushed gravel consisting of hard durable particles which are free from vegetable matter, lumps or balls of clay and other deleterious substances. The gradation of the material shall meet the grading requirement of the following table:

Sieve Designation	Percentage by Weight Passing Square Mesh Sieves
2 inch	95-100
3/4 inch	90-100
No. 4	40-65
No. 10	10-45
No. 200	0-7

D. Performance Bond.

1. Except as provided in section 2, herein, a performance bond with surety or sureties, or other security satisfactory to the ~~Board of Selectmen~~ **Planning Board** in an amount approximately the estimated cost of building projected streets may be required.

2. A performance bond shall not be required where the street will be completed pursuant to this ordinance prior to construction of any dwelling that will require the street as access.

ART. 46. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article IX of the Subdivision Standards and Procedures as follows:

ARTICLE IX - PERFORMANCE BOND

9.1 A performance bond with surety or other security satisfactory to the ~~Board of Selectmen~~ **Planning Board** in an amount equal to estimated costs of building projected streets may be required.

ART. 47. To see if the Town will vote to extend the Moratorium Ordinance, Article 34, passed at the March 14, 1986 Annual Town Meeting for six months.

The registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open, Friday, March 20, 1987, to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 21, 1987 at 8:30 o'clock a.m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not, and have the Warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
