Articles of agreement made by and between A. D. Thompson acting Quartermaster General of the State of Maine, in behalf of said State on the one part, and Increase Blake of Farmington Falls on the other part, witnesseth, to wit, That said Blake agrees to make and deliver to said Thompson at the State House, or such other place in Augusta as may be required by the acting Quartermaster General, or his successor in office, One Hundred ^{twenty five} Drums, to be made of the following material and description to wit: the barrel or bodies of the drums to be at least fourteen inches high and deep, and sixteen inches in diameter, and made of good sound maple wood, free from shakes and splits, and of a proper thickness, each body or barrel to be finished with a suitable air hole bushed; The beating head of the drum to be of calf or the snare head of sheep skin, both of good quality and prepared in the best proper manner, the tugs or ears to be of proper material, the cord and snares of a suitable size and substantial and proper material and quality, the drum hoops to be substantial and of proper quality and painted red; the bodies and hoops to be stained and properly varnished; each drum to have two good and substantial drumsticks, and the whole to be made and finished in a substantial, handsome, and workmanlike manner, corresponding in quality and kind to those made by Charles Town for the aforesaid State in the year 1836. The Drums to be completed and delivered to said Thompson, or to his successor in office, one half the above number on or before the fifteenth day of June next, and the remainder on or before the first day of August next. And

the said Thompson for and in behalf of said State of
Maine, is to pay to said Blake, the sum of Two Dollars and
eighty seven cents for each of the aforesaid drums, on delivery
as aforesaid, and after the same shall have been inspected
by a person to be selected by the said Thompson for that
purpose - In the fulfilment of the aforesaid agreement
the contracting parties bind themselves to each other in
the sum of two hundred dollars.
