## Volunteer Fire Department Report

Meetings were held on the first Tuesday of each month, with an average attendance of 17 members present. New residents are invited to attend meetings and we would welcome all residents to membership. More members make for more interesting meetings and activities.

Work is progressing well on the office/meeting room. This is being done by members in their spare time and we hope to move into the area by late spring. Much of the material has been donated and these folks have received notes of thanks. Paul Hodgdon, a former Fire Chief for many years, has done much to help the Department in many ways over the years and is still helping us. We certainly owe him lots of appreciation.

The trucks are checked and worked on as needed. The pagers are tested at least twice a week through the Lincoln County Sheriff's office. Turn-out gear consisting of coats, helmets, boots, gloves, etc. have been purchased and we have received some from other Fire Departments. We appreciate these donated items.

We have developed a library of training films. Much thanks to Mort and Patti Mendes for the TV and VCR. We have training sessions prior to each meeting.

We participated in the Maine Yankee Drill in June and received a letter of commendation and appreciation from Maine Yankee. We have held drills by way of brush burning, truck operation, etc. The Department also took part in a mutual aid drill in Wiscasset.

Volunteers scraped paint, re-shingled the roof and re-painted the whole fire house the last of July and first of August. Many hands made the work go faster and it was a great group effort with great looking results.

Fund raising activities have been:

Coffee, donuts and sandwiches sold at Town Meeting 1987; sandwiches, chips, cold drinks and desserts sold at the Community Association sponsored meeting of the Maine Old Cemeteries Association meeting in July (thanks to the Community Ass'n. for inviting us to take part); a chemical-free dance was held; a horseshoe tournament and dunk tank at Heritage Day (thanks to the Recreation Committee for inviting us to participate); a public Ham and Bean Supper was put on in August; and the bottle/can redemption box, which was installed at the Fire

House has brought great financial returns. Thanks to all who continue to donate their returnable cans and bottles. Thanks to Gil Thomas for building the box and to Cheryl Anderson, who spends a lot of time and effort sorting the cans and bottles and delivering them to the redemption center. Letters were sent out and the response was great. Thank you to all our faithful supporters.

We assisted the Rec Committee on the Bike Race on June 13 by having a lead vehicle, a follow-up vehicle with a nurse, and guards along the route.

A map of Westport with all roads marked and numbered as "FIRE LANES" has been developed and all roads will be receiving reflective numbered signs, as soon as they are made up and weather (thawed ground) permits. Copies of these "Fire Lane" maps will be at our Fire House, in each truck, at Wiscasset Fire Department and Wiscasset Ambulance Station. By being able to tell emergency personnel which Fire Lane you are located on will speed response of fire trucks, police assistance and/or ambulances.

We will host the May 1988 meeting of the Lincoln County Fire Chief's Association.

During 1987 we responded to 2 woods/brush fires; 1 smoke-filled house (no fire); 1 structure fire; 1 out-side bonfire without a permit; and assisted at a brush fire on an island off Georgetown in August (mutual aid call). We appreciate the care people are taking by keeping their chimneys clean and would remind everyone that a permit is required for any out-side fire any time of the year. Chimfex for use in chimney fires are available at the Westport Barn and from Fire Department members. Burning permits can be obtained from Fire Chief Alan Anderson at 882-5572; Alan Ratcliffe at 882-6145, and Gary Webber at 882-6034.

Thank you to everyone who has donated money, merchandise, food and time to make our Department a better one to serve you all.

## **Superintendent of Schools Report**

To the Citizens of Westport:

In the preparation of the 1988-89 school budget there are several areas which I would like to explain.

The state aid for education for Westport does not change much whether the present law is continued or the legislature acts to adopt the recommendation of the Governor and Commissioner of Education. There is a move to consider the ability to pay along with state property values to establish funding for education. This concept has been around for some time, and I would not expect to see it implemented for a couple of years, if ever.

The 1988-89 school budget will request the town to raise less than what was raised from local monies last year. The reason for this is due to less expenditures for special education and a sizable balance in the tuition account.

The Westport School Department has approval from the State Department of Education to purchase a new school bus. If this is done, it will need a vote of the town to purchase and to take funds from the bus reserve account or include funds within the budget to do so.

I'd like to thank the Westport School Committee for its support and assistance during my time serving as acting Superintendent of Schools. Mr. James Ashe will begin his service to School Union #48 on April 4, 1988. I'm confident he will do a fine job for you.

## **Time & Tide Resource Conservation & Development Area Annual Report**

Time & Tide RC & D is a non-profit organization revolving around volunteers active on projects that benefit the social and economic conditions through better utilization and management of natural resources. Time & Tide covers all of Waldo, Knox, Lincoln, and Sagadahoc Counties. The area is directed by council members representing each of the county commissions and each of the Soil Conservation Districts.

Time & Tide has been involved in several interesting projects in the past year. The compost demonstration using fish by-products and sawdust received much attention during the summer. Over 500 tons of material was composted and will be used next summer by area farmers, the Dept. of Transportation, the town of Waldoboro, the Waldoboro Garden Club, and many more individuals. The project is continuing with a market survey and a feasibility report which is expected to be completed in June 1988.

Forum '87 was a full-day seminar on growth management co-sponsored with the Waldoboro Business Women. The seminar was attended by concerned citizens, planning boards, selectmen, and others from throughout the mid-coast area. Continued workshops are planned for 1988 to provide greater detail on specific growth management tools.

Several changes have taken place around the RC & D office. Dawn Genes became the new Coordinator in June. Several new council positions have been filled, and a few more volunteers are needed to serve on key committees.

Time & Tide can accomplish remarkable goals but only through active citizen participation. If you have an idea or suggestion or would like to work with others on a project, contact the Time & Tide office at 832-5348. The office is located on Route 1 in Waldoboro.

Time & Tide is a equal opportunity organization.

The Recreation Committee is appointed by the Board of Selectmen and is independent of any other organization serving Westport.

## **Auditor's Report**

Board of Selectmen  
Town of Westport  
Westport, Maine

We have examined the financial statements of the Town of Westport as of and for the year ended December 31, 1987, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

The town's financial statements do not include the general fixed assets group of accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The effect of this departure is that an incomplete financial presentation results. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed assets account group is not known, but would include the cost of all land, buildings and equipment owned by the town.

The town has adopted the net budget method for the general fund, which does not conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The net budget method of budgeting and accounting results in dedicated or earmarked funds being recorded in the general fund. Generally accepted accounting principles require that dedicated or earmarked revenues be budgeted and accounted for in special revenue funds and not in the general fund. The amounts that should be removed from the general fund and recorded in special revenue funds are not known.

In our opinion, except for the effects of not recording general fixed assets and not recording dedicated or earmarked revenues in special revenue funds as discussed in the preceding two paragraphs, the financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly the financial position of the Town of Westport at December 31, 1987, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The accompanying supplemental information is not necessary for a fair presentation of the financial statements, but is presented per

statutory requirements and as additional analytical data. The information has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements mentioned above and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
DECEMBER 31, 1987**

**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The accounting policies of the Town of Westport conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units, except that the town does not record the general fixed assets group of accounts and uses the net budget method of budgeting and accounting for the general fund.

**A. Basis of Presentation**

The accounts of the town are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The various funds are grouped by type in the financial statements.

**Governmental Funds**

**General Fund** - The general fund is the general operating fund of the town. All general tax revenues and other receipts that are not allocated by law or contractual agreement to another fund are accounted for in this fund. From the fund are paid the general operating expenditures, the fixed charges and the capital improvement costs that are not paid through other funds.

**Special Revenue Fund** - Special revenue funds are used to account for revenue derived from specific taxes or other earmarked revenue sources, including federal revenue sharing funds.

**Fiduciary Funds**

**Trust Funds** - Trust funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the town for others.

**B. Basis of Accounting**

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed by the governmental funds. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when received in cash except for property tax revenues which are recorded as deferred tax revenues unless collectible within sixty days following the year end. Expenditures, other than interest on long-term debt, are recorded when the liability is incurred. The accrual basis of accounting is followed by nonexpendable trust funds.

### **C. General Fixed Assets**

The town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets. Expenditures for property and equipment are charged against departmental operations whenever such items are purchased.

#### **2. Property Tax**

The town's property tax for the current year was levied October 21, 1987 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 1987 for all real and personal property located in the town. Taxes were due November 1, 1987 and interest charged at the rate of 11% per year.

#### **3. Deferred Tax Revenues**

The National Council on Governmental Accounting (N.C.G.A.) Interpretation No. 3 requires that property tax revenue be recognized to the extent it will be collected within sixty days following the year end.

At December 31, 1987, deferred tax revenues amounted to \$17,515.00 an increase of \$5,365.00 of the prior year's balance.

#### **4. Deferred Credits**

Deferred credits represent items received during the current accounting period that are to be used as revenue in the subsequent year. These accounts were as follows at December 31, 1987:

#### **5. General Fund Budget**

The town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles, on which amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or the Budget Committee.

#### **6. Designated for Special Reserves**

Special reserve accounts for various purposes have been established in the past by vote of the townspeople. These accounts were invested

in savings accounts and a certificate of deposit at year end.

### **7. Designated for Subsequent Year's Expenditures**

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances and/or overdrafts forward to the following year for expenditure. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

### **9. Vacation/Sick Leave Accruals**

The accruals for the Town of Westport are not material and need not be disclosed.

### **10. Departmental Operations**

Title 30, Section 5253, M.R.S.A. of 1964, as amended, requires that the audit report contain a statement of departmental operations. The revised Exhibit C fulfills this requirement.

## **11. Recommendations**

The Following recommendations are believed worthy of consideration:

### **General Fixed Assets**

We noted that the town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets and does not include a statement of general fixed assets in its financial statements. Generally accepted accounting principles require that the town maintain a record of its general fixed assets.

We recommend that the town maintain a record of its general fixed assets. This record should be of a perpetual nature and include at actual cost or historical cost if actual cost is not available, all capital items, land and buildings. Deletions should be at actual or historical cost as a result of sale, trade-in or discard. In addition, a town official should be designated to perform periodic inventory checks to ascertain that the items are properly accounted for and adequately safeguarded.

### **Net Budget Method of Budgeting and Accounting**

We noted that the town has adopted the net budget method of budgeting and accounting, which results in dedicated or earmarked funds being recorded in the general fund. Generally accepted accounting principles require that dedicated or earmarked funds be budgeted and accounted for in special revenue funds and not the general fund.

We recommend that the town consider adopting the gross method of budgeting and accounting under which dedicated or earmarked funds are recorded in special revenue funds and not the general fund.

Recommended by the Selectmen that the sum of \$3,000.00 be raised and the balance of \$5,766.95 be carried forward.

ART. 16. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for an audit for the fiscal year December 31, 1987.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$950.00 be raised.

ART. 17. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Tax Maps.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$1,200.00 be raised and the balance of \$1,854.00 be carried forward.

ART. 22. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Civil Emergency Preparedness.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$559.76 be carried forward.

ART. 23. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town's share of the Wiscasset dump operating expenses.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$3,000.00 be raised and that \$3,000.00 be transferred from the Surplus Account and the balance of \$3,190.00 be carried forward.

ART. 24. To see what Action the Town will take in regard to the 1988 State Allocation for roads.

Recommended by Selectmen that it be put in a reserve fund for roads and voted on at the next annual meeting.

ART. 25. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$12,000.00 from the State money to the Town Highways and Bridges Account.

ART. 43. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the tax year of 1988.

ART. 44. To see if the Town will vote to set a date when taxes shall be payable and to set an interest rate due thereafter.

Recommended that taxes be due and payable on November 1, 1988 and that interest shall be due on taxes paid after November 1, 1988 at the rate of 11% per annum and shall be computed from the date of commitment.

ART. 45. Recommended by Selectmen that \$40,000.00 be raised.

ART. 49. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a gift, a lot of land from Mr. & Mrs. Elford Richardson, for a Senior Citizen and Town Office Building.

ART. 50. To see if the Town will accept the guidelines as set forth by the Planning Board and the Comprehensive Plan Committee in their revision of the Comprehensive Plan.
