## WARRANT

---

*To E. M. Crowell, a Constable in the Town of Orrington,*

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Orrington, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town, on Monday, the fourteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To elect a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act on the report of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor.

Art. 4. To act on the report of the Health Officer and Board of Health.

Art. 5. To act on the report of the Superintendent of Schools and the School Board.

Art. 6. To act on the report of the Building Committee of the South Orrington School Building.

Art. 7. To fix the compensation of the following town officers for the ensuing year: Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioner, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Health Officer, and of any others that may be deemed necessary.

Art. 8. To elect all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, including a Collector of Taxes.



Art. 9. To see what sums of money the town will vote to grant and raise for the following purposes: For the Support of Schools, Repair of School Property and Insurance, Support of Poor, Mothers' Aid, Repairs of Roads and Bridges, Pay of Snow Bills, Purchase of Snow Fence, Patrol Maintenance, Pay of Town Officers, Pay of North Orrington Schoolhouse Note and Interest due in 1932, Pay of South Orrington Schoolhouse Notes and Interest due in 1932, Miscellaneous Expenses, and any other town charges that may be deemed necessary.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Memorial Purposes.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$532.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of Third Class Roads, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 43 to 47 inclusive, of Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, as amended by Chapter 151, Public Laws, 1931.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Pest House and lot located at South Orrington, to Oliver Nason.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the King Schoolhouse, so-called, located in the King District, and the Corner Schoolhouse, so-called, located at Orrington Corner.

Art. 14. To see what action the town will take regarding better fire protection, and raise money for same.

Art. 15. To see what action the town will take, if any, regarding the Joe Clark blacksmith shop, so-called, it being considered a menace to adjoining property.

Art. 16. To see if the town will accept a list of jurors as prepared by the municipal officers, clerk and treasurer.



Art. 17. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to grant and raise for the use of Bangor Public Library for one year.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the services of the County Nurse.

Art. 19. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to transfer to Norris L. Hillier that lot known as the Snow's Corner Schoolhouse lot.

Art. 20. To see what action, if any, the town will take regarding the taxes on Union Hall at South Orrington.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 22. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 22, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 23. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Treasurer, subject to the approval of the Selectmen, to loan



the credit of the town, if necessary to defray town charges, for an amount or amounts not to exceed in the aggregate, the sum of \$15,000.00, and to make, execute and deliver, negotiable note or notes of the town therefor, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to cancel the following tax deeds:

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Superintending School Committee to contract with the City of Brewer for all secondary school privileges for the Orrington students attending secondary schools, or take any action thereon.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising the list of voters.

## REPORT OF BUDGET COMMITTEE

FEBRUARY 22, 1932

*To the Citizens of the Town of Orrington:*

We, the members of your Budget Committee, in offering for your approval the following articles, wish it understood that as a committee we do not condemn the efficiency or ability of our town officials or employees. We do feel, however, that under the present economic conditions, that a reduction should be made in all salaries and appropriations as follows, viz:

### Article 7.

Voted to make a 15% reduction in the salaries of our Selectmen, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, and all minor town officials. Road Commissioner, \$3.00 per day; Sealer of Weights and Measures, \$10.00 per year.

Voted to raise \$10,384.00 for School Fund.

Voted to raise 600.00 for Repair of Schools and Insurance.

Voted to raise 2,500.00 for Support of Poor.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

*To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of  
Orrington:*

I hereby submit my annual report of the public schools of Orrington for the year ending February 1, 1932.

It is a pleasure to report that the program of improvement, outlined seven years ago, is nearly completed. Orrington has made rapid progress in her educational system. The results are evident not only to those directly connected with the schools, but to many outside of the town. Many of our students attending high schools are on the honor rolls and the majority are doing creditable work. The foundation received in the elementary schools is of utmost importance in high school.

This year special emphasis is being placed on English. It is highly important that every child form correct language habits, also be able to express his thoughts in a clear and concise manner. It is our aim to have every child master the requirements, as outlined in the new State Elementary School Curriculum, before being promoted to high school. The results thus far are very gratifying due to the splendid co-operation of the teachers.

There are at present sixty-two students attending secondary schools. This is the largest number since my connection with your schools. This increase in number, also the increased cost of tuition in some of the schools, has greatly increased the total expense to the town. I still feel that the town should authorize the Superintending School Committee to contract with Brewer for the schooling of all of their high school students. This would provide every child the privilege of attending a good school at a financial saving to the town. It would be advisable to allow those



already attending some other school to complete their four year course in that school. Only those entering high school after the contract was made, would be effected.

In one of my previous reports your attention has been called to the need of public school music in our schools. We had planned to offer for your consideration this year a definite program of music in all of the schools. Due to the industrial situation and the necessity of strictest measures of economy, it seems advisable to wait until conditions improve.

During this year a thoroughly modern building has been erected to care for the children at South Orrington. The main floor of the building has three modern, attractive class rooms with the Chicago type of wardrobe for each room. The basement contains toilets, two playrooms, a garage for the bus, and the boiler and fuel room. This is the first school building in the State to have a heated garage for a bus. Both playrooms open in the garage, thus allowing the boys and girls to go directly to the bus without leaving the building. The building is heated by steam with a gravity system of ventilation. The total cost was more than was anticipated due to several factors. The ceilings of the old rooms were raised to conform to standard requirements and the garage added. The sewage disposal was expensive, also the grading of the lot. The building is well constructed throughout and only good serviceable material used. Your committee felt that to use inferior material or to install an inferior heating, lighting or plumbing system would be false economy. The building should not require any major repairs for years.

The janitoring of this building and the driving of the bus should be combined another year. One full time man could do both, also do all of the minor repair work in the building, and on the bus. This is being done in some towns with very good results and a financial saving.

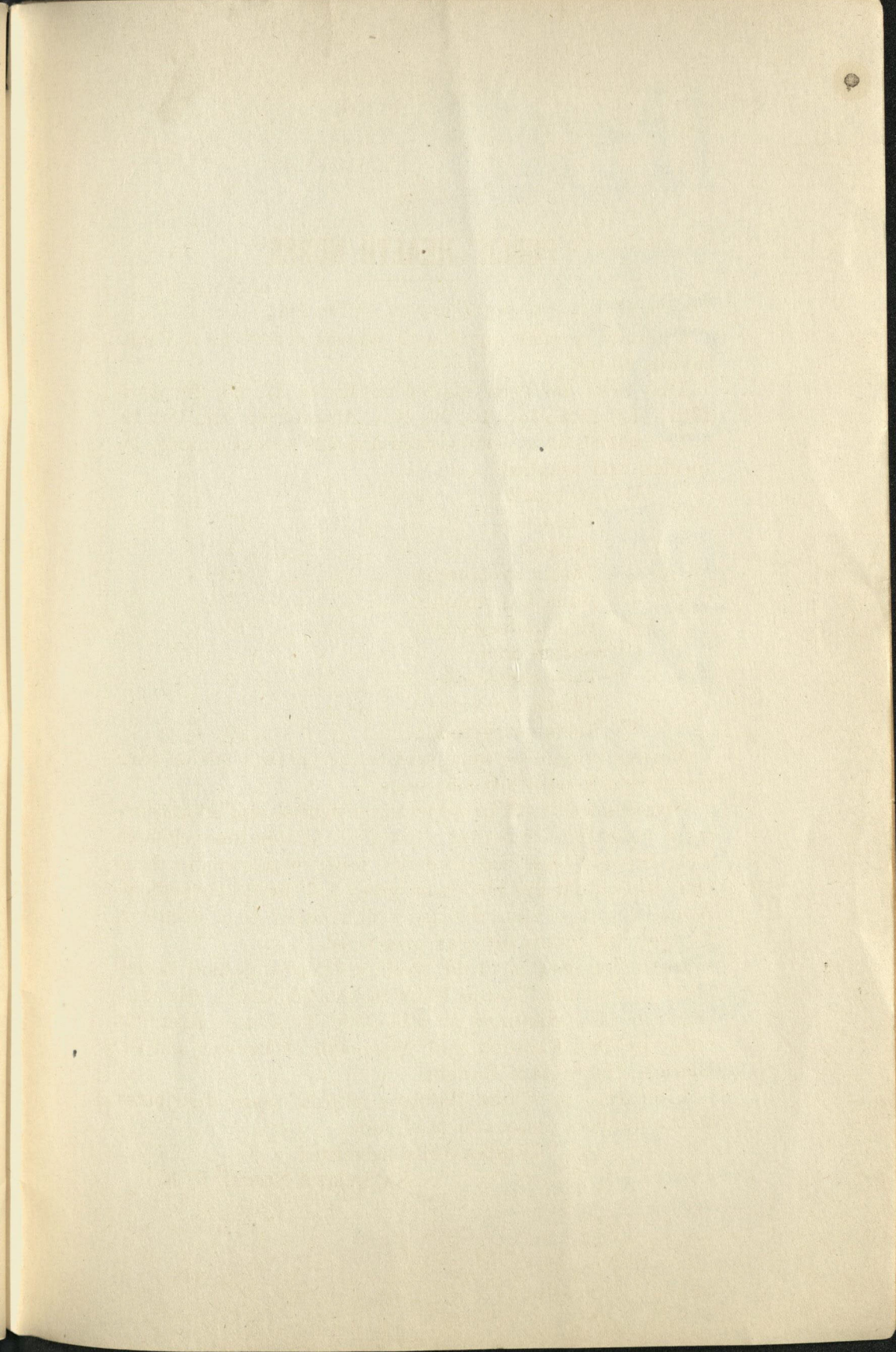

# C. K. Hatfield Reelected As Orrington Selectman

## Town Officers' Salaries Are Reduced 15 Per Cent At Meeting.

Orrington town meeting held in the Town Hall at Orrington Corner Monday was the largest attended gathering of the voters ever recorded in the annals of the town. Many contests developed and the interest was keen. So spirited was the contest for town officers that the voters found themselves unable to transact the business and an adjourned session will be held today, to finish the remaining articles of the warrant.

The annual report of the town, of which every voter in town had a copy was one of the most comprehensive documents ever submitted to the voters. The booklet contains 78 pages, many more than last year, and notwithstanding this, cost less than the previous year's report. This was one of the most noticeable savings effected by the selectmen of which there are many to be found throughout the several reports.

William V. Phillips was elected moderator after a spirited contest.

Clifford K. Hatfield was unopposed for first selectman and was chosen the secretary casting the vote of the town for him. Will B. Smith was unopposed for second selectman. Four candidates were in the contest for third selectman. Arthur W. Smith was candidate for re-election. He was opposed by F. Elmer King, William V. Phillips, and Harold Dockam, F. Elmer King was elected.

Ethel B. Baker was elected town clerk, a position she has filled very acceptably the past year, over Thomas M. Simpson. F. H. Wiswell was chosen treasurer and S. J. Williams, collector of taxes. E. F. Bowden, Charles Perkins and J. G. Kent were candidates for road commissioner and the first named was elected after two ballots.

Preston W. Gray was elected a member of the school board for 1932.

### SALARIES REDUCED

It was voted to make a 15 per cent reduction in the salaries of the selectmen, treasurer, collector of taxes and other officials. It was voted to pay road commissioner \$3 per day,

As the report of the town treasurer indicates the selectmen have made an excellent showing the past year, although some things came up which they had not anticipated. They will doubtless make an even finer financial record the coming year.
