Superintendent of Schools Report

To the Citizens of Westport:

My message to you this year is very similar to that of last year's in that coastal communities continue to see their state valuation increase. This year Westport's has increased by 37.4% which, in turn, means less financial help from the state than expected. The state allowable tuition rates continue to increase in double digit percentages, requiring us to budget regular tuition rate increases of 13% and special education at 15%. Our cost of special education, as in most communities, continues to increase, especially regarding services purchased, which is our private transportation of special ed students to school systems outside of Wiscasset; the private method still is the most cost effective. The school committee and I will work diligently to find ways of reducing this cost by sharing expenses with other area school systems.

I have no new information regarding long term placement of Westport students in the Wiscasset school system. As I'm sure you are all aware, the Wiscasset voters turned down the referendum last March for a new high school and, at this time, we have no date for a future referendum, although we are guaranteed placement of Westport students in Wiscasset from now until July of 1993. We will keep you informed of events as they occur, and I would personally like to encourage you to share concerns about the future educational placement of your children with the school committee or myself. Even though the school budget, if approved, represents a 34.57% increase for local taxes in education, our per pupil expenditures are still some of the lowest in the state due to the 50% tuition rate we are currently being charged by Wiscasset.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the community for its support and hope that you continue to show that support at the town meeting in March. As always, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at any time.

Comprehensive Plan Report

THE TOWN'S PROBLEM

During the past decade Maine, most particularly the Coastal area, has experienced unprecedented growth. The results have been crowded highways, rapidly rising real estate values and shrinking land availability as individuals and corporate developers hastened to exploit the demand for the qualities that make Maine attractive - seashore, uncrowded land areas, reasonable property prices and a less hurried tempo of life.

The reaction of many to the invasion was a cry to the legislature: "Do something, they're taking Maine away from us!"

THE LEGISLATURE'S REPLY

Recognizing the problem, the legislature enacted the Comprehensive Planning and Land Use Regulation Act (30 MRSA 4960) which set out 10 goals:

1. To encourage orderly growth - in appropriate areas - while protecting the state's rural character and preventing development sprawl.
2. To promote an economic climate which increases job opportunities.
3. To plan, finance, and develop a system of public facilities to accommodate growth.
4. To encourage and promote affordable, decent housing for all Maine citizens.
5. To protect the quality and manage the quantity of the state's water resources.
6. To protect the state's other critical natural resources.
7. To protect the state's marine resources industry - ports and harbors - from incompatible development.
8. To safeguard the state's agricultural and forest resources from development which threatens those resources.
9. To preserve the state's historic and archaeological resources.
10. To promote and protect the availability of outdoor recreation opportunities - including the access to surface waters.

To meet these goals the act mandates that each town, not the state, will develop its own Comprehensive Plan showing how it proposes to achieve these goals in relation to its particular situation and desire for

its future development. The Westport Selectmen set up the Comprehensive Planning Board and gave it the responsibility of developing Westport's plan.

COMPREHENSIVE PLANS - THE PAST

Comprehensive plans are not new to Westport. In 1974 the first Comprehensive Plan was drawn up by the Planning Board. A brief excerpt from it sounds very much as though it could have been written today:

It is evident from this study that the Town of Westport is primarily rural-residential and should remain so. The Planning Board is impressed with the need for immediate action to insure that 25 years from now the Town will still be a pleasant place to live. We are fortunate that until now the town has been largely bypassed by developers and by the pressures of ever-expanding suburbia. The Town of Westport is a sort of oasis of wild undeveloped land in an area where tremendous development has been going on for many years. It is only a matter of time before the great beauty and natural resources which we enjoy will be in an even greater demand than they are now.

In anticipation of this, much needs to be done to protect the interest of the inhabitants, guarantee conservation of our natural resources and provide for wise use of our land area. The metamorphosis from quiet country town to thickly settled suburb has occurred in so many small towns exactly like ours, it would be nothing short of negligence if we failed to benefit from their mistakes and experiences in planning for the orderly, non-destructive growth of Westport.

In 1988 a revised Comprehensive Plan was adopted by the town. It was far more reaching than the 1974 effort, identified many problems and led in part to town ordinances addressed at solving some of the problems. However, it was much less thorough than the plan now required. The new plan asks the town to assess real and perceived problems both local and regional over the next ten year period.

THE NEW COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Work has generally been completed on gathering the data needed for preparation of the new plan. Its scope may be seen by the brief listing of topic headings shown following:

1. Community Character
2. Population
3. Land Use
4. Transportation Systems
5. Public Facilities and Services

6. Fiscal Capacity
7. Local Economy
8. Housing
9. Natural Resources
10. Marine Resources
11. Cultural Resources
12. Coastal Management

However, much remains to be done and anyone wishing to contribute time and energy to this work is needed and welcome. Meetings are held each Monday night at the Town Hall, starting at 7:30.

WHAT A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN DOES - DOESN'T

A Comprehensive Plan provides a blueprint of the direction in which the citizens of Westport want to direct the town's development. It is not an unchanging document. It can be changed at any time by vote of the town in the same manner in which it was adopted. In fact, the act requires that towns review and make appropriate changes to their Comprehensive Plans every five years, looking ahead 10 years each time.

A Comprehensive Plan gives direction in broad terms. It does not represent an ordinance which imposes any control on anyone. Ordinances implementing the Comprehensive Plan can only become effective when they are enacted by the town as it deems appropriate.

However the State does mandate that ordinances pertaining to Land Use must be in place by July of 1992, and all other ordinances generated by the plan need to be designed and voted upon by July 1994.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FORMAT

There are four basic interlocking areas to be covered in the new plan.

The first is inventory. The committee has collected as much data as possible in the areas to be covered. Much information was available from different state agencies, 1980 and 1990 census figures, town office and the 1988 town survey. After the data was collected different graphs, charts and lists were made up.

The second step is analysis. In general this refers to taking the pieces of information in the data-inventory section and writing short statements that interpret the data and indicate areas of concern for the town projected over the next ten years.

In the third section, policy, the committee makes suggestions and recommendations as to what the town needs to do in order to address the concerns expressed in the analysis section.

Finally, found in the fourth section is implementation, a time line for completing work on the recommendations made in the policy section and who will be responsible for doing the work.

In summary, every policy offered must be shown to be needed via the analysis, and there must be sufficient data in the inventory section to support the analysis.

TIME LINE

By July 1, 1991 the revised plan must be submitted to the State for review. The State has 60 days in which to do this. When they have completed their review a letter will be sent to the town with recommendations, suggestions and objections. The town may react to the first two but must address any objections the State may raise. Between Sept. of 91 and Dec. of 91 the town will hold one or more public meetings, and by Jan. of 92 the plan needs to be accepted by the Town.

LAND USE

One major change the State is mandating requires that all towns in Maine "must adopt land use policies and ordinances to discourage incompatible development." The act requires that towns identify and designate at least two types of geographic areas in town: "growth areas" and "rural areas."

The act defines the growth areas as "those areas suitable for orderly residential, commercial and industrial development forecast over the next ten years." "Rural areas" are defined as "those areas where protection should be provided for agriculture, forest, deer yards, ponds, wet lands, floodlines, open space and scenic lands within the town."

Currently the committee is making up a map showing the different land use areas in town.

Hopefully this overview will give everyone a good idea of what the Comprehensive Plan Board is and has been doing.

Septage Committee Report

SUBJECT: Septage Committee Report

In 1976, the STATE DEP mandated that each town had responsibility for developing and implementing a disposal plan for it's own septage, sewerage and/or sludge from it's residences and businesses. The period from 1976 to 1989 was one of "no pressure" for the towns to meet this mandate. However, with the rapidly increasing problems of human waste in all forms, the period of "waiting" has ended.

The DEP has requested that each town make an official response giving a time-table for when they will comply with the mandate. To respond to this, a regional study was initiated by representatives from Edgecomb, Dresden, Alna and Westport. Other communities were invited but they declined. Since the meetings began, Dresden dropped out, preferring to pursue other options.

After abundant review and evaluation of alternatives, the concept of a "regional" solution was abandoned since no town was receptive to accepting the septage, sewerage or sludge from another town. Therefore, each town is left with the following options:

1. Build a sewage treatment plant
2. Find and purchase a suitable piece of land for spreading septage within our own town. Approximately 1-2 acres of properly draining field with a wooded buffer zone would be sufficient for Westport.
3. Negotiate with a private land-owner to use their land for spreading, and offer compensation through payment of fees or through reduction in taxes.
4. Install a 10,000 gallon holding tank on town property from which we would transfer to an out-of-town facility willing to accept it. This tank is also a requirement for option 2 and option 3.
5. Enter into an annual agreement with a private septage pumping, hauling, storing, and spreading contractor.

Septage is currently accepted by nearby sewage treatment plants during certain slow periods of the year. The storage tank is necessary to hold the septage during the months when the sewage treatment plants are not able to accept it. Also, the time is coming when the sludge

generated by the town septage must be taken back by the town and spread on it's own field.

We were made aware that most municipal treatment plants are having their own problems with increasing volume and correspondingly greater scrutiny from the DEP. They will eventually be too overloaded to accept waste from other towns.

Because of our island soils, Options 2 and 3 seem unlikely. Option 1 is financially out of the question. Therefore Options 4 and 5 are probably all we can consider.

Edgecomb is currently negotiating with other towns who have created their own "spreading fields" in the hope that one of these fields will be sufficient to accept septage from more than one town. So far I have received no news on results from these negotiations.

In my last conversation with Pat Jackson, this company is trying to make arrangements which will put them in a position to offer a contract arrangement to Westport for consideration.

In conclusion, towns may eventually be required to keep records on the septage tank pumping frequency of its residents, in order to protect the town from possible areas of water contamination. By having our own storage tank or by contracting with a septage pumping company we will be able to assemble those records.

Conservation Committee Report

The Conservation Committee began having regular monthly meetings in June, 1989. William Cooney, Joyce Cayia and Betsy Forrest were new members appointed to the Committee.

In October the Conservation Committee sponsored a Westport "Cleanup Day". This was felt to be very successful as a considerable volume of litter was picked up from the roadsides of Westport. It is hoped that this "Cleanup Day" can become at least an annual event.

The Committee has considerable interest in recycling efforts and has been involved with the Selectmen in their efforts to locate a recycling bin on Westport as part of the Lincoln County Recycling Program. This represents a great opportunity for the residents of Westport to minimize the costs of disposal fees to the Wiscasset Transfer Station. It is hoped that all residents will utilize the recycling bin located at the Westport Fire House.

The Conservation Committee continues to evolve and develop both projects and goals. The Committee hopes to function as a doer of projects and a catalyst for others to do projects.

The Conservation Committee looks forward to working with other Town Committees and elected Officials in projects related to conservation on Westport.

Time & Tide Resource Conservation and Development Area Report

It is with pleasure that we submit to you our report of our activities for 1990.

The Time & Tide Resource Conservation & Development (RC&D) Area was approved and funded for operations by the USDA, Soil Conservation Service on April 12, 1974.

Our area of operations now includes all of the following counties: Androscoggin, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc and Waldo. This includes 115 towns, cities and plantations with almost one third of the population of Maine.

In 1990 we accepted the following measures from communities and sponsoring organizations as projects to work on. Some will require more time and effort than others and may require several years' worth of input. They are as follows: Leadership Development Training Workshop, Wetland Identification Workshop, Citizens Guide to Assessing Non-Point Sources of Pollution, Medomak River Pollution Clean Up, Assist with Preparation of Video on the Cedar Shingle Industry in Maine, Dam Inventorying for Several Communities, Fire Pond Development Technical Assistance, Animal Waste Utilization Proposal, Septage Waste Disposal Assistance, Grain Feasibility Study to assist the livestock farmers in Maine use more Maine-grown grains from Aroostook County, and a measure to work with the Land Improvement Contractors of America and the Small Contractors of Maine in erosion control training.

All of our council members are volunteers who serve with the intent of helping to make the Time & Tide Area a better place to live, work and play.

We have two full-time staff to help us implement our projects by locating funding and technical assistance and with coordination.

We have recently activated two resource committees, one on Marine Resources issues and the other on Environmental Education. This will allow us to involve more interested citizens in these issues with their time, talents and ideas.

ART. 52. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Building Code as follows:

Section 7 (a) (ii) - change 3 to 2.

Section 7 (b) (ii) - change three to one and one-half

ART. 53. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Section V (B) (2) - change 3 to 2.

ART. 54. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance by deleting Section V (D) (2) and inserting the following in its place:

2. No new principal and accessory structures and substantial expansions of such structures except structures which required direct access to the water as an operational necessity, such as piers, docks and retaining walls shall be placed within seventy-five (75) feet of normal high water line at an elevation of not less than 10 feet above mean sea level. For purposes of this subsection, a substantial expansion of a building shall be an expansion which increased either the volume or floor area by 30% or more. This subsection is not intended to prohibit a municipal board of appeals from granting a variance, subject to the requirements of this articles and Title 30, section 49631, nor is it intended to prohibit a less than substantial expansion of an accessory structure attached to a legally existing nonconforming structure, provided that the expansion does not create further nonconformity with the water setback requirement.

ART. 55. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$200.00 for the Mid State United Cerebral Palsy, Inc.

ART. 56. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$780.00 to pay for an attendant at the Lincoln Recycling bin, located at the Westport Fire House. This would allow an attendant to open the bin for deposits three (3) hours per week at \$5.00 per hour.

ART. 57. To see what action, if any, the Town wishes to take with regard to the relocation of the Town Offices and to see what sums the Town wishes to raise and appropriate for such purposes.

The registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open, Friday, March 22, 1991, to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

The Selectmen and Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 23, 1991 at 8:30 o'clock a.m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not, and have the Warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
