THE RAILROAD TAX.—Messrs. Dowd, Lind, and Mason, of the Executive Council, with Mr. Mark Haden, Messenger of that body, as clerk, were in session at the Preble House, on Wednesday, for the purpose of considering a system of laying a tax upon the railroad stocks of the State pursuant to act of the last Legislature.

The subject is naturally attended with much difficulty, and it is quite probable that several railroads will resist it. Indeed, the Maine Central has already given notice that it will not consent to pay any State tax if it can be avoided. Only those roads will be considered as coming within the limits of the law whose stocks have a marketable value.

This clause of the law has already been passed by the Maine Central, Grand Trunk, the St. Croix & Penobscot. The committee will continue in session to-day at the Preble House for the purpose of consulting the attorneys of several roads.
