

Hodgdon, and presented him a dedication plaque, a duplicate of which we have in our meeting room. The official dedication bronze plaque is affixed to the outside front of the station. We were all greatly saddened at the death of Chief Hodgdon on April 9, 1991.

During Fire Prevention Week the official ribbon cutting and dedication preceded the Open House. Phyllis Hodgdon cut the ribbon and State Senator Muriel Holloway presented us a State flag which had been flown over the State House. Representative Charlie Heino was also in attendance. Our heartfelt thanks to Senator Holloway for the flag and to Mr. and Mrs. Carl Hodgdon for the great picture of Paul which they had made up and framed for our meeting room.

The Auxiliary continues to raise funds to help the Department. During 1991 they gave us a considerable amount of money for turn-out gear and equipment, and a goodly sum toward tables, chairs and a radio for the station. We extend to them a most hearty "THANK YOU" for all their help.

Thanks to everyone for their continued donations to the bottle/can bin. We are able to purchase many needed items with these funds.

Fund raisers consisted of 3 bean suppers and 2 hunter's breakfasts which were not extremely well attended, but our thanks to those who did attend and support our efforts.

Our appreciation to Wiscasset for the used ambulance, which we have out-fitted as a rescue vehicle, and to Nobleboro for the 4x4 brush truck. We are most grateful for this support.

Thank you to the families of Robert Hodgdon and Roger Williams, who requested memorial donations be made to the Fire Department. These donations will be used toward a flag pole, which will be dedicated to their memory.

Please remember burning permits are required for any outside burning. These permits may be obtained from Chief Alan Anderson at 882-5572; Alan Ratcliffe at 882-6145; Rusty Robertson at 882-6385, or Gary Webber at 882-6034.

We wish to thank everyone for keeping their chimneys clean. PLEASE NOTE — If you have a chimney fire or any other fire, do not hesitate to call the Fire Department. That's what we are here for and there is no charge when we are called out .

During 1991 we responded to 4 brush fires, 8 car accidents, 3 calls for trees and/or wires down, 3 ambulance assists, 1 house alarm and 3 mutual aid calls to Wiscasset.

During Hurricane Bob we manned the Station as an evacuation center and patrolled town roads for trees down, etc. We notified everyone in low-lying areas of the danger of flooding and let them know the Station was open for evacuees.

Once again, Thank You to everyone for any and all support.

Superintendent of Schools Report

To the Citizens of Westport:

I am very pleased to report to you that we have good news relative to the long term educational plan for Westport's students. By now I am sure all of you are aware that the Wiscasset voters did approve a two million dollar addition project for the Wiscasset primary school last June. This project will allow the primary school to become a K-4 building, which will eliminate overcrowding at both the primary school and the middle school, which will now become a grade 5-8 building. The construction of this project is well underway and it appears that students will be receiving their educational program in this new addition by September 1992. The Wiscasset school board will still be looking at long range solutions to overcrowding that will eventually develop at the high school; however, the good news for Westport residents is that the two year tuition contract has been extended by the Wiscasset school board to a four year rollover program. I am sure that many of you are aware that the state has been experiencing some financial problems and the legislature has voted to reduce state aid to public school systems. This year, Westport's reduction in state aid was approximately \$11,000.00. On the other hand, the increase in the state allowable tuition rate was much less than anticipated, which means that the Westport school department will be able to get through the school year with a substantial balance for June 30, 1992.

It has been a difficult year to prepare revenue estimates for our 1992-93 budget, which you will vote on in March, due to a lack of information from the State. The school board and I will present our best guess at the amount of state help available, and we urge you to contact us if you have any questions before the town meeting. I hope that most of you were able to attend the public informational meeting which was held at the Town Hall on Thursday, February 27, and that the meeting helped you to understand the 1992-93 Westport School Budget.

I want to remind the community that I am always available to meet and discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding the education of Westport's children.

Planning Board Report

1991 was a relatively slow year for activities requiring permits from the Planning Board. The statistics nearly match those of 1990 with few exceptions.

The Planning Board wishes to stress that a permit is required for any type of structure to be placed in the Shoreland Zone and structures must comply with the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. Also, the cutting of vegetation in this zone must be done in accordance with the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. Outside the Shoreland Zone a permit is required when the structure is over 150 square feet in area.

If you have any questions regarding the Town Ordinances, please call the Code Enforcement Officer or attend a Planning Board meeting before proceeding with construction. Planning Board meetings are held at the Town Hall on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm.

Westport was among many towns that did not meet the initial date for enactment of the new model Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. The DEP has extended the due date to July 1, 1992. A committee is now working on this project and will have a public hearing before presenting it to the DEP for approval.

Code Enforcement Officer

1991 has been another active year for your Code Enforcement Officer (CEO). Professional training has continued and Westporters have been busy with various building and remodeling projects.

All Code Enforcement Officers in the state must be certified by January 1, 1993. This involves having attended all pertinent training workshops offered by Department of Economic and Community Development's Office of Comprehensive Planning and passing the certification exam. This past year your CEO attended a two-day workshop on wetlands identification and management. Another two-day workshop is scheduled for Spring 1992 to cover floodplain management. Then your CEO should be ready to sit for the certification exam.

The CEO wishes to remind all Westport residents of the need to obtain a building permit **PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION** whenever **ANY** permanent structure is constructed, altered, or moved in the shoreline zone (within 250 feet of the water). Structures include decks, piers, ramps, buildings, fences and signs. This is not to create a hardship for residents but merely to ascertain that the town's ordinances are being followed, and **IT IS STATE LAW**. Please do not force town officials to be "bad guys" by just doing by their state mandated jobs.

On another issue, the CEO wishes to inform all residents that it is illegal to dispose of brush and similar cuttings by dumping them into the water. Not only is it polluting and a hazard to navigation, but lobstermen find that brush so disposed has the nasty habit of tangling up their gear so much it has to be cut free. Please use a more environmentally conscious and legal brush disposal method.

Even though the time necessary to carry out the job of being your CEO continues to go up, I still find this a rewarding and challenging way to serve the town. Please do not hesitate to call should you have any concerns or questions.

Comprehensive Planning Committee

Since this time last year, much has happened. The Committee completed its revision of the 1988 plan and sent it off to the State for review. In late September, we received the State Comments.

For the most part, the State was well pleased with our plan making note that we, like Edgecomb, had chosen to do the work ourselves rather than to go the route of a professional consultant. The State did say we needed to do more work on affordable housing, land use and fiscal capacity. At the time (October) land use and affordable housing were mandated items that most towns were having trouble with.

We held a public meeting in October and those who attended made some excellent suggestions to the committee. Strong feeling prevailed that we should make our plan acceptable to Westport and not bend too much to the State's wishes.

After the meeting, effort was made to revise these parts using new data in some instances plus the suggestions that were received at the public meeting. As this work went on, budget problems assailed Maine and in the end, Governor McKernan closed the Office of Comprehensive Planning, the only such office in the country to be abolished. Therefore, we no longer needed to go to the State for final (State) approval of our plan.

Although the Office of Comprehensive Planning has been closed, the original law on the need for towns to have Comprehensive Plans and to have ordinances on these plans is still on the books.

While a great deal of blood, sweat and tears went into the gathering of information, analysis and writing, I'm glad we did it. We have compiled from many sources, a great deal of valuable information. We have had to take a long look at where the town is, and different from the 1988 plan, we had to look ten (10) years into the

future to see where the region in general, and Westport in particular, will be.

In closing, I would like to thank all the members of the Comprehensive Plan Committee, the Selectmen and the many other people who gave of their time to make the plan come about. I have enjoyed my 5 years on the Committee and wish it well in the future.

During the past year the Conservation Committee sponsored a "Spring Cleanup Day" and a "Fall Cleanup Day". These days were designed to have residents pick up litter that accumulates along the roadsides of Westport. Those persons that participated picked up an appreciable volume of litter. All residents are encouraged to participate in these "Cleanup Day" efforts, as the result is an improved appearance to Westport and the promotion of a community spirit.

The Conservation Committee was able to publish two newsletters and a flyer. These were principally directed to a recycling effort on Westport. This effort in conjunction with the support and backing of the Board of Selectmen resulted in the opening of a recycling station on Westport in May, 1991. The recycling effort is modest, yet has been generally well supported. It has saved several tons of cardboard, paper, glass and plastic from going to the Landfill or Transfer Station. We would like to "THANK" all the residents who use the recycling station. We would also like to encourage all those who are presently not taking advantage of the recycling station to please do so.

During the Fall of 1991, members of the Conservation Committee assisted the Selectmen in trying to improve the quality of water from the well at the Town Hall. This effort included removing contaminated soil from the utility room at the Town Hall, installing a sump pump and operating a flushing system. This is a long term effort where results can only be evaluated after several months.

The Conservation Committee looks forward to projects that will assist the Selectmen where needed, providing the residents of Westport with information related to the environment, water quality and wildlife and promoting an increased consciousness of our community.

I am hoping by spring to be able to take tin cans and magazines for recycling.

ART. 45. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the tax year 1992.
