

To the Citizens of Westport:

It doesn't seem possible that another year has gone by and it's time again for the Annual Town Meeting. Your school committee has been busy the last few months preparing a 1993/94 school budget. Last year's informational meeting on the school budget was a huge success, and the school committee is preparing to schedule another one for this year, to be held in March before the town meeting. We will send notices to each and every household in Westport, so look for this forthcoming notice and make plans to attend this meeting. This will be a good opportunity for you to get answers to any questions you may have relative to our educational costs.

Our school budget for 1993/94 will see a reduction in expenditures this year. However, at the present time I am not sure whether or not that will mean a reduction in the local share of the overall budget. The State Legislature will be meeting over the next several months to determine how much money the state will be supplying to towns for education, as well as how those funds will be distributed. As some of you may be aware, this year the school funding formula was not used to distribute subsidies as in the past. I urge you to join me in contacting your local legislative representatives to encourage them to support the use of the school funding formula for the 1993/94 school year. If the Governor's Task Force recommendation to use the formula is supported by the Legislature, Westport could see a tremendous increase in the state's share of their overall school cost. The increase could go from our current state subsidy of \$37,682.34 up to a possible high of \$102,331.55. Since so much is undecided, our 1993/94 budget presentation will be based on receiving the same subsidy for next year as we received this year. If the Legislature takes any action between now and the town meeting, I will be able to adjust that amount to reflect any possible decrease in local appropriation. As I mentioned, please

contact your legislative representatives and urge them to support the use of the school funding formula.

We are very excited about the acquisition of the new school bus. We want to thank the voters for supporting the use of the reserve fund to purchase a new school bus at last year's town meeting. The new bus has a diesel engine, which should help us hold down future fuel and maintenance costs.

I look forward to seeing all of you at the Annual Town Meeting, and again encourage you to attend the informational meeting on the school budget. I also want to extend a thank you to the community's elected officials who have continued to work cooperatively with the school committee and the Superintendent to provide an excellent education to the community's children at the most reasonable cost possible.

Comprehensive Planning Committee

One article in this years town warrant reads "to accept the 1992 revision of the Comprehensive Plan". The Comprehensive Planning Committee hopes that the town will accept this revision.

Although Governor McKernan abolished the Office of Comprehensive Planning, he did not do away with the law that says that each town must have an up-to-date Comprehensive Plan. He later re-opened the office but with only a skeleton crew and changed the date that Plans were due from the towns. While we do not have to have our plan State approved until 1998, the committee feels that the new revision should be in place.

The 1988 revision was done with few guidelines on how to go about the process. The plan that was generated reviewed past history and brought the town up to 1988. The big difference in planning now is that towns are being asked to survey and collect data on all the different facets that make up their town, housing, population, coastal management, historical data to name but a few. This material is compiled, then studied to see what trends are developing. More importantly, towns are being asked to try to guess where each of these trends will take our town over the next ten years. And finally, to make suggestions on what the town can do to make the transition of inevitable change as smooth as possible.

The six members of the committee have spent countless hours pulling together as much information as possible, to get all the different areas covered that needed to be covered. The plan includes a list of ideas the town should consider doing, however, please remember, that as in the 1988 plan, we can only make recommendations. Any recommendations followed up on must meet with town approval before becoming law.

Copies of the 1992 plan are at the Town Clerk's Office, the Office of the Town Treasurer, and at the Fire House.

Code Enforcement Officer

1992 has brought big changes to Westport and the job of your Code Enforcement Officer (CEO). A special Ad Hoc Ordinance Committee worked all Spring and Summer to revise Westport's Shoreland Zoning Ordinance and bring it into compliance with the state mandated guidelines. Then on August 20, 1992, at a special town meeting, this new ordinance was accepted by the town. The state Department of Environmental Protection approved the new ordinance on November 23, 1992, with the condition that development not be permitted on slopes greater than 20%. Therefore, the new ordinance is now in effect.

How this effects Westporters is that now most building permit applications are made to the CEO for approval. Those applications that result in land use changes, subdivisions or multiple family dwellings (more than 2) still must be approved by the planning board, and applications for docks are still made to the Selectmen (and the DEP).

Please be careful to obtain a permit before beginning work on any construction project. Your CEO is available most of the time by calling 882-9635. Please call if you have any questions. Applications are available from me or from Virginia Anderson.

This past year 38 permits were issued. They break down as follows:

Also, this past year, the state began its program to certify all Code Enforcement Officers in the state. This CEO attended several more training seminars, and I sat for and passed the certification examinations. Therefore, Westport met the January 1, 1993, deadline to have a certified Code Enforcement Officer. I continue to enjoy serving the town in this very interesting capacity even though the time demands continue to increase.

Planning Board Report

1992 was again a relatively slow year for projects requiring a permit from the Planning Board.

A new Shoreland Zoning Ordinance was passed in August, 1992. The new ordinance provides for most permits to be issued by the Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) rather than the Planning Board. Citizens are reminded that if any activity is planned within the Shoreland Zone (within 250' of high water mark) they should consult the ordinance and confer with the CEO.

Also, the cutting in this zone must be done in accordance with the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. Outside the Shoreland Zone, a permit is required when a structure is going to be over 150 square feet in area. Permit applications may be obtained from the Code Enforcement Officer.

Applications for a permanent pier or float permit must still be obtained from the Planning Board. Permits for a temporary pier or float can be obtained from the CEO.

If you have any questions regarding the Town Ordinances, please call the Code Enforcement Officer or attend a Planning Board meeting before proceeding with construction. Planning Board meetings are held at the Town Hall on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7:00 p.m.

Zoning Board of Appeals

It is the duty of the Zoning Board of Appeals to interpret provisions of the State Shoreland Laws and Westport's Zoning Ordinances that are called into question; to hear administrative appeals; and to grant variances. The Planning Board reviews an owner's construction plan and will advise them when a variance is required.

1992 was a slow year for requests for variances—one commercial and one residential—both denied.

The Zoning Board of Appeals holds one regular meeting after March to elect its chairman and secretary and meetings are called only when there is a request from an applicant.

It should be noted that most of the requests received are related to the 75 foot setback from water, under the State Shoreland Zoning Laws; and the remainder are related to Westport's Zoning Section V D-1 that requires a land owner to build not closer than 75 feet from the right of way sideline of any road or street. The Board recommends changing what we perceive to be an overly restrictive requirement of 75 feet to the prior, longstanding 40 feet setback.

Well Committee Report

The Well Committee was appointed by the Selectmen in March of 1992 in order to expedite the cleanup process of the contaminated well at the Town Hall. Jan Brown, Bill Cooney and Betsy Forrest were appointed to this committee. The Well Committee found that ground water intrusion had been the source of trouble and made arrangements to place a seal in the well to prevent any further contamination. This measure was found to be highly effective.

Efforts to remodel the furnace room last Fall were initiated by this committee in order to meet basic building codes. After these renovations were complete, the Well Committee then arranged for the installation of a new well. We placed the new well so that the Town could share water access with the Community Association's Church. The new well will provide water for the Town's projected needs in addition to whatever the Church might require.

We deeply appreciate the cooperative spirit and interest of our Selectmen and the time and labor donated by those concerned contractors and Town volunteers to help solve the problems associated with a project of this duration. I am especially grateful to Jan Brown and Bill Cooney for the countless hours of time donated over a two-year period working on-site before this committee was formed, and then with the Selectmen and those involved with the process in order to successfully see this project to completion.

Report of Sheriff

Sheriff William C. Carter extends his greetings to the citizens of Lincoln County and offers the following report for 1992.

This year, the Department has received a grant from the Bureau of Justice to implement a Community Policing project in Lincoln County. The project will work on several different areas of concern. These include: improved communication with citizens through the information of several task forces, identification of problems in the coordination of services, and to conduct a needs assessment to clarify exactly what our citizens are concerned about.

Our Criminal Investigation Division investigates burglary, theft, fraud, child abuse, sex related and drug crimes. The Division has recently received specialized training in the use of the Ident-Kit. This kit allows a victim or witness to make an accurate composite of a suspect.

In 1992, the Department responded to over 7300 incidents within the borders of Lincoln County. These requests for help include assisting a stranded motorist or to the opposite extreme responding to violence in a family. According to the Uniform Crime Reporting System, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department handled 75% of all reported crimes and motor vehicle accidents in the County, excluding those covered by local police departments.

Our Patrol Division, which is headed by Lt. William L. Lewis, consists of five patrolmen, a corporal and a sergeant. The Patrol Division issued over 660 traffic tickets, 450 warnings and 140 defects this year. They also made 192 on-site arrests and executed 75 arrest warrants. Besides the required daily activities, they served 520 court papers and patrolled 245,075 miles of county roads.

This Department maintains two full-time K-9 units. These units are available 24 hours a day to aid any agency or citizen needing their assistance.

The center of our agency is the Communication Division. Besides dispatching for our personnel, they dispatch many fire departments, two ambulance services, three police departments

during the evening, as well as participate in Maine Yankee drills and activate sirens for fire departments and Maine Yankee.

This Division has acquired a new recording system which records all telephone lines coming into the dispatch area and all radio traffic. This computerized system can, when necessary, retrieve a pre-recorded phone or radio message. The Department is now working with Selectmen and emergency service personnel to design and implement a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system for all County towns as soon as possible.

The Detention Division has been recognized by the Maine State Legislature as having one of the highest ratings of the County Jails in the State of Maine. This has been maintained through the dedication of the staff and an attitude of concern for the inmates well-being. The Department through the detention division, operates a community corrections program funded through a state grant that sends trusted inmates into towns to help with public works projects such as painting, cutting brush or assorted needed tasks.

The Youth Aid Division offers many programs to families and has become more proactive rather than reactive. The main focus of this Division is the D.A.R.E. program, which is taught in eleven out of thirteen county schools, but still provided is parent support and education, crisis intervention, alcohol and drug prevention, seatbelt safety, and a fingerprint program to aid in the recovery of missing children.

Lastly, the Administrative Division provides management of civil process, distribution of court papers, typing of all documents, answering the administrative telephone line, public relations, assisting citizens with recovering their losses from non-negotiable checks.

Your support and the continued assistance of my very professional staff enables us to continue to strive for a safe and secure County.

My sincere thanks and appreciation to all of you.

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Westport, as of December 31, 1991, and for the year then ended. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the town's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentations. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

The general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Assets Account Group, which should be included in order to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the preceding paragraph, the general

purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Westport, as of December 31, 1991, and the results of its operations and the cash flows of its proprietary and similar trust fund types for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying financial information listed as supporting schedules in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements of the Town of Westport. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Beginning fund balances have been restated as described in note seven (7) to the general purpose financial statements.

(I) a topographic plan of the construction site with intervals of not more than five feet (5') and showing the slopes on the construction site.

(II) a plan to prevent erosion or sedimentation.

b. Clearing shall be limited to those areas needed for construction of any approved structure, driveways or parking areas.

c. Any driveway or road construction shall be done in conformance with the provisions of Section 15 (H) of this ordinance.

d. The proposed use conforms with all other standards and review criteria contained in this ordinance.

12. Any new Residential, Commercial or Industrial structures and uses are prohibited in any undeveloped shoreland area consisting of two or more contiguous acres with sustained slopes of 35% or greater.

ART. 52. Shall the ordinance entitled "Shoreland Zoning Ordinance" be amended as follows:

Section 15 (8) Set Back is amended by deleting "one hundred (100) feet" in line two and inserting the words "seventy five (75) feet" and by deleting the words "seventy five (75) feet" in line two and inserting the words "forty (40) feet".

ART. 53. Shall the ordinance entitled "Building Code" be amended as follows:

Section 8, Set Back, the words "seventy five (75) feet" are deleted and the words "forty (40) feet" are inserted.

ART. 54. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey to Ross A. and Terri L. Norton, on such terms as the Selectmen deem just and proper, the 33' wide strip on the easterly side of Old Rt. 144, which strip abuts land of Ross A. and Terri L. Norton.

The registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open, on Friday, March 26, 1993 to correct any error in or change

a name or address on the voting list; and to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

The Selectmen and the Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 27, 1993 at 8:30 o'clock a.m. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Westport Raises \$827,000 At Town Meeting

By CANDACE LAWSON

Voters in Westport Saturday approved an \$827,000 (approximate) town budget, taking a gamble that the state legislature will arrive at a compromise in education funding that will give Westport more state funds than last year. The overall budget

resulted in only a slight increase in spending over last year's figure of \$743,000.

Westport residents voted to spend \$337,000 for town purposes and \$486,700 for tuition, transportation, special education and administration costs for schooling Westport's children.

Townpeople voted 63-4 to

amend their warrant and reduce the local tax appropriation for school purposes from \$439,000 to \$410,000. Selectmen recommended adjusting the figure because the reduction would eliminate the need to raise the tax rate this year from 6.8 to 6.95. The gamble will pay off if the state legislature manages to increase

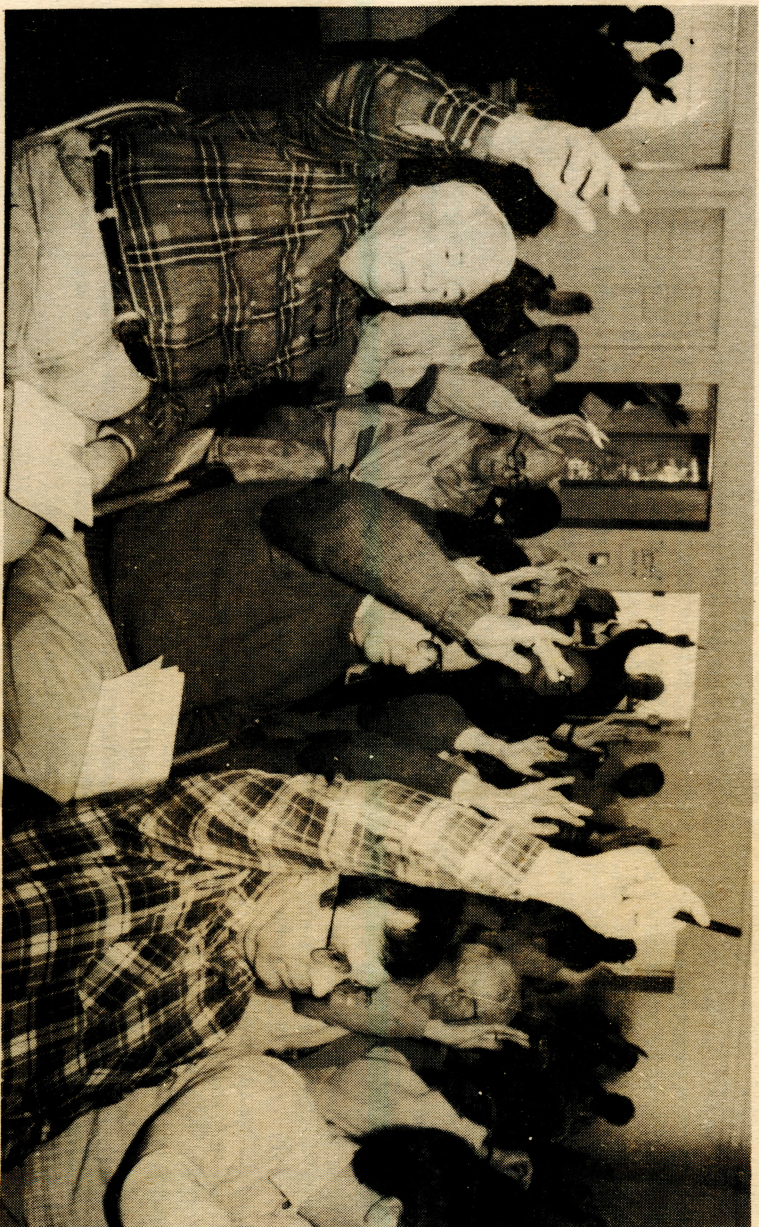
state education funding from current levels. The state currently spends \$504 million on education. Governor McKernan would like to pare that figure to \$487 million, while the legislature is putting its weight behind a \$524 million package. Legislators have until July to settle the final numbers. Westport received \$37,682 last year from the state.

Some Westport residents felt that raising the higher amount for education was the wiser move, thus avoiding a special meeting at a later date. "This is our town meeting, and special town meetings don't draw this big a crowd," one woman said. "If we end up with money at the end of the year, what does it matter?"

But other citizens stated there was no sense in raising money that wasn't needed, especially since the interest rate on the unused funds would be only three percent.

Overall, Westport's 1993-94 school budget of \$486,692 shows a slight reduction of \$2,605 from last year's spending, even though the number of students has increased from 105 to 113 and Westport will be paying a greater percentage of allowable tuition rate.

Last year Wiscasset charged Westport 55 percent of the tuition rate.

have found adequate shelter in tree cavities, in shrubby thickets, dense evergreen foliage, even under porches. However, they were more than usually vulnerable to raids from predatory birds. Cooper's and Redtailed Hawks and Kestrels were reported as attacking feeder-birds, sometimes successfully. Tom remarks that the hawks' more customary targets are mice--but these little rodents were snugly covered by the snow-blanket. The predators were desperately hungry!

I agree with Tom that the earliest migrants much suffer most from such a storm. Woodcock, for instance, often arriving even in Maine in mid-March, depend upon earthworms for which they probe soft soil with their long bills. There would have been no earthworms available to a woodcock during the "Blizzard of '93". Some birds, robins for example, settle for other food--but not the woodcock!

Sometimes migrating insect-eaters move northward earlier than

is safe. The resident woodpeckers and nuthatches choose an insect diet--but they scour tree trunks and branches for eggs, cocoons, etc. and when even that fare is locked away from them by ice and snow, they'll switch to seeds and suet. Before the storm Tom Fegely had seen bluebirds in the Lehigh Valley. These thrushes can adjust their diet and they are known to solve the shelter problem by gathering in large cavities, "sitting wing to wing to conserve precious heat energy". A bit later, insect-eating early migrants (the phoebe for instance) are often victims of April rainstorms--during which no insects fly and the birds are hard-pressed to obtain food.

The "Focus on Nature" column of March 7 includes a photo of a Great Blue Heron which a reader had snapped. The bird was "wading in snow" (this was before the blizzard) near the intersection of two busy roads. The heron had just pounced upon a mouse (proba-

bly a deer mouse) which, in the photo, dangles haplessly from the Great Blue Heron's long bill. Rudi George explains, "I missed the actual catch. I thought the bird stumbled in the snow but as I lifted the camera he had the mouse in its mouth. He played with it and finally swallowed it but then he regurgitated it before he finally ate it."

Some years a few Great Blue Herons remain throughout the winter even here in Maine. But I surmise that any that do stay after ponds and marshes freeze would find sufficient food in sand during a receding tide, and in rockweed.

Our ponds and marshes will soon be hosting those beautiful herons--and how welcome a sight that will be! In Peter Vickery's "Annotated Checklist of Maine Birds" it is shown as common beginning with the first week of April. I'll be glad to hear of your first sightings this spring. It will probably be standing in shallow water near shore or in a mud flat or

marsh, with muscles tense, on-the-ready. Its yellow eyes provide it with bifocal vision--even with the bill pointed upward the heron can see beneath him. Having spotted his meal he may advance a step or two, very stealthily, and then--lunge so rapidly that we can't follow the action. The aim is accurate and the heron is generally successful in securing his food. Sometimes we see the Great blue flying across a pond or bay, its sinuous neck crooked back until it rests between the shoulders, and the long, slim legs held so that they extend stiffly behind the tail. No other bird flies with this silhouette. The wingbeat is slow and rhythmic. When the bird alights on a bed of rockweed it is a wonderful and graceful landing.

Keep a keen eye out for our early herons!

tion rate the state allows. This year the rate will be 60 percent and next year 65 percent. Thus tuition went up this year by \$68,500, but decreases in special education (-\$61,000) and transportation (-\$10,000) improved the bottom line. Administration costs went up by just \$501.

In other action, the townspeople voted to:

- *Raise \$19,365 for town officer's salaries with no raises given this year;

- *Hire a part-time computer operator, clerical and bookkeeping assistant for \$3,000;

- *Appropriate \$8,000 for Westport's Volunteer Fire Department, and \$3,000 for the fire truck reserve account;

- *Pay-off in full a 10-year loan for improvements to the fire department building with a \$76,080 appropriation;

- *Provide \$20,500 to pay Westport's share of the Wiscasset Transfer Station operating expenses;

- *Allocate approximately \$75,000 in excise taxes and state highway funds for road and bridge maintenance;

- *Appropriate \$41,792 in excise tax receipts for snow removal on 24 miles of town roads and at the town hall, the fire station and a church; This year's contract increased by \$60 per mile - from \$1,720 to \$1,780 per mile.

- *Raise \$4,749 for community service organizations such as The Parent Resource Center, the Boothbay Region Humane Society and the Wiscasset Library; Westport increased its support of the library from \$800 last year to \$1,200 this year.

Townspeople also adopted their 1992 Comprehensive Plan and made several changes to zoning ordinances.

The citizens voted to adopt

guidelines which require homeowners to provide the planning board with a topographic plan of construction, an erosion prevention plan and evidence that the soils at the construction site can sustain development when proposing to build new structures on a slope greater than 20 percent within the shoreland zone. The guidelines will supplant a Department of Environmental Protection prohibition on any building on a 20 percent slope or greater. Under the new guidelines, the steepest slope that can now be built upon is 34 percent.

Townspeople also voted to reduce the mandatory distances that new structures must be set back from roads and easements in the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. The set backs were reduced from 100 to 75 feet and from 75 to 40 feet. They also reduced set backs in the town's building code from 75 to 40 feet. Board of Appeals Chair Laurel Ann Spear said that decreasing the set backs would save residents the \$50 fee of applying for a variance and would return the town to its former, less restrictive set back policies.

Westport residents Ross and Terri Norton also won their bid to be allowed to purchase from the town a 33 foot wide strip of land on the easterly side of Old Route 144, which abuts their land. Loren Arford, whose property abuts a similar strip of land, proposed to amend the warrant to allow other abutters to purchase strips of the Old Route 144. The amendment was ruled out of order by moderator Daniel Bradford because it made too substantial a change to the original article, but selectmen promised to bring the issue to the town for a vote again at next year's meeting.
