I. Mark H. Dummell, Colonel
of 5th Regiment of M. V. M., do
depose and say that Captain
J. R. Brady of Co. F. of my Reg.
has repeatedly disregarded the
rules of discipline which I
have from time to time made
for the order and regulation of
Camp Preble -

One of the rules then dis-
played is "That no commissioned
officer shall leave said Camp
grounds without the consent of
the Colonel, or officer in command."
This rule he has repeatedly treated
with contempt and has in repeat-
ed instances left said grounds
without such permission - He
disobeyed this rule on Thursday
June 12th and also on Monday
June 17th -

Another rule of my Camp
is "that no private shall leave

the Camp without a printed
"pass" - This rule Captain Brady
has again and again violated.
I cannot fix the dates of
any of these latter violations,
but am positive that he
again and again has passed
the men of his command
by the guard in utter disrespect
and contempt of this salutary
and necessary order of a well
regulated camp -

The Morning
Company Reports show a
very large number of "absences
without leave" of men in this
command - their number
reaching in some instances
as high as twenty five on
a morning -
