## Superintendent of Schools Report

To the Citizens of Westport:

I am now more than a year and a half into the superintendency in School Union #48. I can honestly say that I have enjoyed working with the people of Westport. I think you have a responsible and representative school committee. I have had nothing but cooperation from your selectmen, especially Mr. Cromwell. I know that the cost of education keeps going up for Westport. There are some state workings that effect Westport and I'm in hopes that new legislation will make some improvements over time in the amount of help that Westport gets from the state. At present, it is minimal. Westport seems to be growing, at least as far as the number of children you are sending to school. You are getting good service for your dollar. Wiscasset spends a lot of money per pupil. Even at 75% of tuition you are paying more for K-8 students than most people in the state. You are paying 75% of the average of the state for high school students. This makes it a great deal for you, again, because Wiscasset spends above average amounts at the high school level but you pay based on the state average *and the state caps secondary tuition rates.*

Since I have been here we have been successful in employing a new high school principal, Bob Strong, and a new assistant principal, Andrew Dolloff. Bob and Andrew work well together and continue to work to accomodate various points of view about discipline, 80 minute periods, open campus, eligibility and many other issues. I feel very comfortable with the direction of the high school under their leadership. We also have a new director of special services, Nita Vautour. Nita is very experienced and has a great deal of knowledge in the special students' arena. She inherited a state site review report which asked us to make some changes in special education. She has been working at those changes this year. Sometimes teaching experienced teachers new tricks takes awhile.

Your school committee has worked for a tight 1996-1997 school budget and will be holding an informational meeting again this

year planned for the 21st of March at 7:00 PM in an effort to give every citizen of Westport an opportunity to ask questions about this proposed budget.

Our 1996-1997 school budget will see an increase in expenditures of over \$100,000 due in large part to increases in number of students and in tuition. We expect the final state share of Westport's costs to be approximately \$33,000. Our surplus that we can carry over will be significantly less than last year. The combination of effects on our budget will increase the local cost over \$120,000.

I appreciate the effort of our bus drivers in transporting our students in a safe manner during what has been a very treacherous winter. We have had some difficult calls and some have been wrong in hindsight. The drivers have always been very cautious in trying to make sure all students reach home safely. I do not have to tell you as citizens about the passage of a long bus on some of your very narrow and hilly back roads. We believe Mr. Swazey is considering retirement this year and we want to thank him for his years of reliable service and wish him well in the future.

In closing, I want to thank the school committee, selectmen and the community's other elected officials who continue to work cooperatively providing funding for an excellent education for Westport's children. If you think education is expensive, try ignorance! I look forward to seeing interested citizens at the informational meeting on the school budget and at the annual town meeting.

## Volunteer Fire Department Report

Dear Neighbors,

We at the Westport Volunteer Fire Department hope this year has been well with all of you. This winter has been a record setter as for the amount of snow in December and for the below normal temperatures. I am sure everyone is ready for spring.

During the past year we have had a total of 54 calls to the Fire Department. We had one major structure fire at the Fields home on Red Gate Lane. There was a great response from the Westport Department as well as Mutual aid from Wiscasset, Woolwich and Edgcomb, not to mention that other departments stood by the requested mutual aid departments in case they were needed in Westport or other parts of the county. The outcome of all the Departments working together as one was that the Fields home was saved and with some rebuilding they were able to move back in. I wish to deeply thank all involved for doing such a fine professional job.

Other fire calls that the department responded to were 1 chimney fire, 1 brush fire, 4 false alarms and 1 misc. We also had 6 traffic accidents, 1 medical aid assist with Wiscasset Ambulance service, and 11 calls for trees down, trees in power lines etc. We also performed to 2 controlled burns and 10 service calls, (i.e., filling wells, swimming pools, etc).

The Department had an average of 6 personnel responding to a call with the majority of calls being in the early evening. The Fire Department is constantly seeking dedicated personnel who with training, time and effort can and will make a difference in their community. The Fire Department meets the First Tuesday of every month for the monthly business meeting, and every Wednesday for vehicle maintenance and training.

Please remember that a permit is required by state law for any outside burning you wish to do, including the use of incinerators. Also, anytime you see a power line down, stay away and call the Fire Department or 911, as we all know "*No Line Is Safe to Touch, Ever*". Also, if there is any doubt about a situation feel free to call us. It is better to be safe than dead wrong.

As a lot of you know, the Department has recently purchased

a new to us 1981 Ford 1000/1000 gallon per minute pumper to better serve the community. We will be working on getting the ISO insurance rating down during the next year and this piece of equipment will help greatly.

The hunter's breakfast, raffle and bottle bin continue to help us raise much needed funds for the department. The monies from these things go towards training classes, equipment and general operating expenses that the department has in order to provide the protection that we do.

By now most of you have seen the new road signs on the roads of Westport. This is part of the new 911 system that is being put into effect in all of Lincoln County. Along with the new names of some roads we will be getting new addresses as well. This is a very time consuming project that the Department and selectmen have put a lot of effort into to make the system better for you the resident. The Fire Department volunteered their time to put up the signs, saving the town a great deal of money. A special thanks goes to Charlie Howe and Kennebec Rental for the donation of the compressor and hammer to install the sign posts.

Due to the great success of our last auction, the Fire Department will be holding another this coming July 20th. As before when doing your spring cleaning and something is no longer needed or wanted, call the Fire Department to take it off your hands or drop it by the station. Remember, your trash may be another's treasure. We look forward to having a bigger and better auction than last time, and all of you can help with donations or purchases. We look forward to seeing you there.

I would like to extend a very special thanks to those who responded to the letter that was sent out by the Department. It is your generosity and support that make organizations such as ours work. Once again thank you very much.

The membership of the Westport Volunteer Fire Department have taken it upon themselves to establish a grant for graduating seniors from Westport. This will be a one hundred dollar check given to an individual to help with their continuing education. These funds will come from each member giving ten dollars from their own pocket at each annual meeting. Other funds will be raised at specific functions for the sole purpose of this account.

In closing, I would like to give the members of the Westport

Volunteer Fire Department my deepest and heartfelt thanks for the many hours that they have dedicated to the department. It does not matter what time of day or night the call comes in they are there ready to lend a hand to help someone in need. As Fire Chief, I am very proud to be part of such a dedicated and caring group of individuals. I salute you all.

One last request in closing. On 27 January 1996 the Fire Department had a pair of horses tethered at either end of the North End Road. It seems as though one of them has wandered off. If anyone has seen our horse or knows its whereabouts, please feed him and make sure he is warm on these cold winter nights. When you are done with him please bring him home as he is sadly missed.

## Shellfish Conservation Committee

Since the Shellfish Conservation Committee has been established we have set and met many goals. First of all, we have established what seems to be a fair and conservative ordinance to preserve the clams on what flats are open. Secondly we have all worked very hard with our state biologist Ron Aho to have more of a diverse area(s) to dig. We have in the past year gotten a large area of flats open for digging. This area has been closed for several years because of lack of water samples and updated shoreline surveys. This has meant many hours of hiking through the woods and across several acres of mud flats to get water samples and to map out the shoreline for our surveys. As a result of these efforts, we have now opened (with the blessing of Mr. Aho) a large area of flats extending from Fowles Point southward to McCarty Cove. If you want to dig and aren't sure where or when you can, contact your shellfish committee or the Maine Department of Marine Resources,

Also, during our survey we discovered a non-conforming septic system which has and/or is being dealt with by the CEO, Plumbing Inspector, and landowner. This matter will be watched closely by all those involved.

Last, but not least, is the enforcement of our ordinance. I feel that Dana Cromwell, our 'clam cop', has done a good job of patrolling the flats for illegal digging. Dana has been checking the flats as often as his work schedule permits. He has given warnings to several different clammers, he made them dump out what clams they had and ushered them off the flats. After having checked the flats myself in the recent past, I believe that word has gotten out that our flats are being patrolled.

In closing, I would like to say that our efforts will be rewarded with better clamming in the future. It would be nice to see a little more involvement from people that like to dig clams, however. We hear a lot of gripes, but have seen little participation so far in our venture. Help and support would be greatly appreciated by any and all who are interested.

Just a reminder, if you want to dig clams you need to get a permit from the town clerk, Phyllis Hodgdon.

## Zoning Board of Appeals

The Zoning Board of Appeals functions to allow exceptions to the Town Zoning Ordinances and the State Shoreland Zoning Laws and to grant variances if all necessary criteria are met, or decline to grant variances if any of the criteria are not met. These appeals are usually made by property owners who have been denied a permit by the Planning Board.

The Zoning Board of Appeals also hears administrative appeals, or requests by individuals to interpret the Town Zoning Ordinances and the State Shoreland Zoning Laws when they are called into question.

1995 saw one appeal. An administrative appeal was filed asking the Zoning Board of Appeals to review and overturn a permit granted by the Planning Board. Several reasons were cited, some alleging that the Planning Board failed to apply town ordinances correctly.

This was the most challenging, lengthy and costly Board of Appeals action undertaken by this committee and complicated further by the timing of the appeal, a highly adversarial atmosphere, intense community interest, and both parties being represented by legal counsel. The appeal was denied.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow volunteer Board members for their diligent efforts in 1995.

## Emergency Management Agency

The Emergency Management Agency is chartered to provide assistance to residents of the Town of Westport in the event of a wide variety of situations. Our primary focus of training is in response to incidents at Maine Yankee that may require some action on our side of the river, but we are also prepared to provide assistance in the event of natural disasters as well. Long term power outages, flooding, high winds, and severe winter storms can all present problems for the Town and for individuals. We can help prevent damage, assess damage that has occurred, arrange for housing and other assistance, and organize recovery activities.

During 1995 we attended a hurricane seminar sponsored by the Lincoln and Waldo County Emergency Management Agencies. This seminar provided insight into how hurricanes form, why it is so difficult to predict their track, how to react when a hurricane is forecast for our area, how to mitigate damage, and how to assess damage and request assistance from other agencies. I also attended refresher training as a State Certified Radiological Monitor. Training is also provided on a variety of issues by the Maine Emergency Management Agency (MEMA), Lincoln County EMA, and Maine Yankee Atomic Power Company throughout the year.

Our emergency management equipment is housed at the fire station. The members of the Fire Department provide the majority of the manpower necessary to conduct the drills and training exercises, as well as actual emergency services, and members subject themselves to the additional training required to support EMA activities beyond their fire training. The fire station is also used for short-term sheltering of residents should it become unsafe or too uncomfortable to remain in their homes, and this year town EMA funds procured some items to make the stay a bit more comfortable. We would like to thank Chief Anderson and the Westport Volunteer Fire Department for their support of the EMA effort.

Should the need arise for emergency management activities because of natural disaster or other incident, we are prepared to do everything within our abilities to minimize the amount of damage sustained, identify sources of relief, and coordinate post-incident activities. If you have any questions relative to the preparedness of the Town, or if you would like to be involved in EMA activities, please feel free to give us a call. Have a safe year.

## The Maine Senate 117th Legislature

By the time you read this, the Second Session of the Maine Legislature will be in progress. As Senate Chair of the Labor Committee, and, as a member of the Appropriations Committee, I'm looking forward to working on issues specific to those areas. However, the Maine Legislature will once again address serious issues concerning the direction of State Government. The basic questions are: How can government best serve Mainers? How can we pay for that government without diminishing productivity in Maine's economy?

Key issues in the Second Session of the Maine Legislature are: health care, education, State government, and the State budget. Here's a short summary of each:

The Legislature will consider a bill to improve our health care system step-by-step, and another to provide protection to patients in managed health care plans.

Three items will likely dominate debate on education: school choice, the Education Commissioner's downsizing ideas presented to the Productivity Realization Task Force, and the establishment of Statewide long-range education goals and measurable standards for school/student performance.

Legislators will continue to address the size, scope, and efficiency of State government. This will be in part, through the work of the Productivity Realization Task Force, and, the recommendations of the Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring.

Overshadowing all these issues is the State budget. Revenue projections, as of this writing, are below the Administration's predictions. The Legislature will most likely have to deal with a budget gap in the Second Session.

As always, I encourage your thoughts and questions on these or any other issues. Please feel free to contact me any time.

Dear Ms. Forrest:

As previously mentioned the results of lab analysis on water sampled at Westport on 2-9-95, indicated "non-detect" for volatile (gasoline) hydrocarbons. Semi-volatile (fuel oil) analysis indicates the presence of heavier hydrocarbons at a concentration estimated at 137 ppb (parts per billion) in the "old" town hall well; most of this is due to the presence of one compound (di(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate, or DEHP) which is not usually associated with petroleum contamination. The "new" town hall well indicates the *possible* presence of organic material at concentrations near the detection limit (about 30 ppb) of the laboratory equipment. I don't feel there is cause for undue alarm at this point but I would like to sample the "new" well (preferably after a period of heavy use) to ascertain whether or not anything (hydrocarbons) is really there. Please remember that hydrocarbon "contamination" is often the result of naturally occurring organic matter.

I've enclosed copies of the analytical print-outs of the two town hall wells. I've also included some information on the compound DEHP; DEP chemist Stan Johnson (287-2651) would be better able to answer any questions you might have about DEHP.

I'm still of the opinion that contamination remaining at the "old" well does not represent a health threat provided it does not migrate to nearby wells. I anticipate reclaiming the carbon filter sometime during the summer of 1995 (following resampling of the "new well") unless new evidence comes to light that changes this opinion; it may be beneficial to run the filtration system until then.

Section 4. Naming System. All roads in the Town of Westport that serve two or more addresses shall be named regardless of whether ownership is public or private. A road name assigned by the selectmen shall not constitute or imply acceptance of the road as a public way. The following criteria shall govern the naming system:

- a. Similar names — no two roads shall be given the same or similar sounding names.
  - b. Each Road shall have the same name throughout its entire length.
- ART. 56. It was voted to accept this article as written.

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town's share of the Wiscasset Transfer Station operating expenses, and to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate and enter into a contract with the Town of Wiscasset on such terms as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town.

Recommended that the sum of 25,700.00 be raised.

ART. 38. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay for an attendant and other expenses necessary to maintain Westport's recycling program, located behind the Westport Fire House.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of 287.50 be carried forward and the sum of 212.50 be raised.

## **HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES & SNOW REMOVAL**

ART. 41. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the 1996 State Allocation for roads.

Recommended by Selectmen that it be put in a reserve fund

for roads and voted on at the next Annual Meeting.

ART. 42. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the 1996 Excise Taxes.

Recommended by Selectmen that 46,020.00 be transferred to Snow Removal Account and the balance be transferred to the Town Highways and Bridges Account.

ART. 43. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Snow Removal.

Recommended by Selectmen that 46,020.00 be transferred from Excise Tax Receipts.

ART. 44. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the paving upgrades and maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of 11,305.98 be carried forward, the balance of the 1996 Excise Tax receipts, after the transfer authorized in Article 43 (28,980.00 estimated) be transferred, and the sum of 25,000.00 be transferred from the State Highway Account.

ART. 50. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.

ART. 51. To see if the Town will vote to accept, from time to time, gifts from the Dorothy Q. Doggett Trust and to authorize the Selectmen to expend funds received from that Trust in accordance with its terms.

ART. 52 Shall the ordinance titled "Minimum Lot Size Ordinance" be amended to adopt the revisions which were presented at a public hearing on January 25, 1996 and subsequently revised. Copies are available from the Town Clerk.

ART. 54 Shall the ordinance titled "Shoreland Zoning Ordinance" be amended to adopt the revisions which were presented at a public hearing on January 25, 1996. Copies are available from the Town Clerk.
