## SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS REPORT

To the Citizens of Westport:

I enjoy working with the people of Westport. I think you have a responsible and representative school committee and selectmen. Westport is considered a low or non receiver due to property valuation, therefore, the local property tax pays for the large majority of school funding. We have several things in our favor in preparing the 1997-1998 school budget. Wiscasset has not indicated they will go above the 75% of State allowable tuition, therefore we have no increase due to a Wiscasset increase. The State as a whole had little increase in secondary per pupil tuition rates in 1996-1997 and we expect little increase in the 1997-1998 rates. This is good news for Westport. Also, because we had budgeted for increases in the 1996-1997 budget that did not occur and we lost students from the number projected in the 1996-1997 budget, we will have a significant savings to carry forward as surplus to assist in paying for the 1997-1998 proposed budget. We also found a larger balance after the auditor's visit in the summer than we had carried forward in the 1996-1997 budget, therefore, we will have that extra surplus to carry forward as a balance to support the 1997-1998 proposed budget. Everything looks favorable at this time to allow the School Committee to present a budget that is actually less than last year and which carries less of a need to raise taxes. This is great news! The Westport School Committee has considered this an opportune time to budget for the purchase of another new school bus. There are many savings attached to an automatic, diesel bus in the long haul. This purchase at this time can be done within the framework of the budget described above.

Your school committee has worked for a 1997-1998 school budget will require no increase in taxes to support. They will be presenting the 1997-1998 proposed school budget at an informational meeting again this year planned for the 21st of March at 7:00 PM in an effort to give every citizen of Westport an opportunity to ask questions about this proposed budget.

Again, I appreciate the effort of our bus drivers in transporting our students in a safe manner.

In closing, I want to thank the school committee, selectmen and the community's other elected officials who continue to work cooperatively

providing funding for an excellent education for Westport's children. I look forward to seeing interested citizens at the informational meeting on the school budget and at the annual town meeting.

My Fellow Westporters,

Congratulations are in order for all of you. Due to your regard for fire safety this past year we did not have any structure fires, chimney fires, or other out of control fires. At least none were reported that we had to respond to. We did however respond to 3 traffic accidents, 17 medical aid calls with Wiscasset ambulance service and 2 false fire alarms. We also responded to 6 calls involving trees on wires, or trees in the road way. There were 2 service calls involving flooded basements, filling wells, and swimming pools. The Fire Dept. also had two mutual aid calls, one with Wiscasset and the other with Woolwich. This is a total of 32 calls which is a lot less than last year. Keep up the good work.

At this time I would like to thank the members of the Westport Vol. Fire Dept.. For their unselfish dedication of their time and talent. The members put in many hours training and performing maintenance on the equipment so that everything will be ready to go when and if the need should arise. It would mean a great deal to the members of the department when you saw them in a store or other place if you go up to them and just said THANKS!!!

The department would like to thank those of you that donated items for our auction this past summer and also those of you that purchased these items. The auction was a big success raising much needed funds to keep the department operating. We will be having another in the future so keep saving all your donations, remember ones man trash is another mans treasure. Once again thank you very much.

This past fall we changed our theme from a Hunters Breakfast to a Harvest Breakfast and raffled off cash instead of a gun and other items. We did O.K. but it could have been better. Not as many folks stopped by as we would have liked and more raffle tickets could have been sold. We will try again next fall so be watching for this up coming event.

The bottle and can bin continue to bring in funds to help with the day to day operating cost of the department Most of this money goes into coffee, soda, office and cleaning supplies, paint and parts for the trucks and equipment, and other things. Thank you to those of you that bring your returnables to the station.

We have a couple of projects that we are currently working on. One of which is a more up to date brush/rescue truck. We were able to get a truck from the government and have spent many hours repainting, cleaning, and repairing it to get in top shape. Hopefully this project will be completed by town meeting so everyone will be able to look it over. A big thanks goes out to Richard, and the others that have helped on the truck.

The other project is the installation of a generator that will power the whole station in the event of a power outage. That way we will be able to use the station not only for a emergency operation center but it will also serve as a shelter for anyone that needs to relocate here due to the lack of heat, the ability to prepare meals, or just need a warm friendly place to wait out the storm or incident. Once again everyone is welcome to stop by when we are here and look over the station, have some friendly conversation, or even join the department

We continue to meet the first Tuesday of every month for our business meeting and every Wednesday for training, and truck/equipment maintenance. Please do not forget that a burning permit is required for any outside burning that you may wish to do. The permits can be obtained from myself (Alan B. Anderson, Chief) Rusty Robertson, or Cheryl Anderson, who are deputy town wardens. Always remember that when you change your clock you should change the battery in your smoke detector. Its a proven fact smoke detectors do save lives, if you don't have any, get some!!

This will be our second year for our Westport Vol. Fire Dept. Scholarship fund. The members of the department contribute money from their own pocket to award a Westport senior with a check for \$100.00 to be used to further their education. All graduating seniors are asked to write an essay on a subject picked by the members then they are judged and the winner is awarded the prize. If you have a graduating senior please encourage them to enter.

Once again I wish to thank the members of the Westport Vol. Fire Dept for their dedication, help and support that they have given in the past. It is a great pleasure and honor to be associated with them, they are a great bunch of people. During the past year the Conservation Commission has been involved in diverse, yet functional areas of service to the Town as we continually strive to enrich the quality of living and inform and direct our fellow neighbors in regard to their health and welfare. As a network for providing information to the town the Conservation Commission placed a hunting safety article and a rabies awareness article in the *Lincoln County News*. Additionally a Town wide newsletter in regard to conservation was produced and well received.

Out of the Conservation Commission budget, money was expended to sponsor a child to attend Bryant Pond Conservation Camp which seems to be a profitable learning experience for our young people.

Trails at Clough Point Park were tidied up once again this past spring. There is a consensus among all those who are aware of the natural beauty at Clough Point that improvements not be made in order to preserve the delicate natural ecosystems in existence uniquely found there. Yet, we would encourage the Town, after consulting Herb Hartman, Deputy Director of Maine State Parks and Recreation, to maintain the roadway which the Park abuts, and insure access to this public Trust.

Our Commission wishes to thank the many gracious friends who joined in the Town-wide annual spring cleanup . We can be proud of the natural beauty that surrounds us and this worthwhile effort is an encouragement to each of us to help keep Westport clean.

We hope to continue the Re-Leaf program on Westport each year and have appointed a licensed Tree Warden, at the request of Maine Municipal Association, to serve the Town and further assist in promoting the health of our ground water, air and enhancing the beauty of our Island through concerted tree management on Town property, insuring that trees that do not live will be replaced with quality stock and in maintaining the health of present specimens.

As pointed out in last year's report, avoid reading too much into the exact numbers. For instance ,when a permit is issued for a dwelling with a garage, it is only counted as a dwelling. The dollar figures are particularly interesting, and as you can plainly see, over 1 million dollars have been invested for the second time in 3 years. Pier permits do not collect cost information, so the total investment is actually higher than recorded here.

## ROAD COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

Maintenance of the roads of Westport continues, keeping within a reasonable budget, and it is necessary to continue this maintenance in the years to come. Resurfacing paved roads and doing shoulder work where needed should continue to be a priority.

Lord Road and the old part of East Shore Road were resurfaced in 1996. However, there needs to be shoulder work done on the Lord Road this coming year if the edge of the tar is to be preserved.

During the year it was necessary to replace several culverts including the big culvert on Baker Road which was done by the state. In replacing some of these, PVC culverts were used in place of metal ones wherever possible, due to the longer life expectancy of PVC.

The Town needs to repave Fowles Point Road and the hill on the Old Post Road in 1997, as well as resurface North End Road and the Lower South End. It is also necessary for the town to continue to upgrade the ditches and culverts on all the roads.

Careful scheduling of maintenance on the roads should insure that all roads get the attention they need within the confines of a reasonable budget.

## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

The Emergency Management Agency is chartered to provide assistance to the residents of the town of Westport in the event of a wide variety of situations. Our primary focus of training is in response to incidents at Maine Yankee that may require some action on our side of the river, but we are also prepared to provide assistance in the event of natural disasters, as well. Long term power outages, flooding, high winds, and severe winter storms can all present problems for the town and or individuals. We can help prevent damage, assess damage that has occurred, arrange for housing and other assistance, and organize recovery activities.

The past year was uneventful in terms of situations requiring the emergency operations center to be activated, or requiring our response to natural disasters. On June 19, we participated in an exercise in support of testing emergency organizations and planned personnel response to an incident at Maine Yankee. This federally mandated drill was part of a routine power plant evaluation which occurs every two years. Prior to the actual drill, fire department and emergency management volunteers received training by Maine Yankee and state specialists to keep our skills current.

Additionally, in May we participated in a dress rehearsal for the graded drill. As in the past, Westport performed well during the drill, and received good marks in our ability to react to given situations. My thanks goes out to the members of the Fire Department and the other volunteers who continue to make us look good each time that we are faced with a challenge. I would like to also thank Maine Yankee, the Lincoln County Office of Emergency Management, and the Maine Emergency Management Agency for fulfilling their obligations to keep us trained and equipped for situations which may arise.

In cooperation with the Fire Department, application was made to Lincoln County to receive a 55 kw generator which was being taken out of service and replaced by newer equipment. Although several other area agencies also applied, the generator was awarded to Westport. The generator will require some work and support infrastructure to make it viable at the fire station, but the investment in a generator is long overdue. An enclosure to house the generator is being added behind the fire station, and when completed, will allow the operation of the emergency and sheltering equipment in place there. This will certainly enable us to provide more

adequate services in the event of a power loss occurring on the island. It is important for residents to know, that in the event of a power loss requiring an extended period of time to repair, particularly during adverse weather conditions, that the fire station will act as an emergency shelter.

We continue to increase our skills through training and drills, and improve our equipment facilities and capabilities in order to provide the residents of Westport the best services available.

In the future, we hope to provide residents with more information on how to protect themselves. And mitigate the effects of disasters. Should damage occur from a storm, we are prepared to help. Assess the damage and find the resources to begin recovering from it. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of chief Alan Anderson, and the men and women of the Westport Volunteer Fire Department, who willingly give their time and effort, and hope that the Citizens of Westport will pledge their support in continuing to make this a safe place to live.
