## **Superintendent of Schools Report**

To the Citizens of Westport:

I have enjoyed working with the people of Westport over four years. I think you have a responsible and representative school committee and selectmen. Westport is considered a low or non receiving town due to property valuation, therefore, the local property tax pays for the large majority of school funding. Preparing the 1998-1999 school budget has been made more difficult by the impact of the closing of Maine Yankee on Wiscasset. Wiscasset has indicated they will move from 75% of State allowable tuition to 85% of State allowable tuition for the 1998-1999 school year. Westport has had a slight decrease in student population which will aid us somewhat. The School Committee has been able to match this year's balance forward of \$100,000, but will have difficulty doing so for the 1999-2000 budget.

Your school committee has worked hard on a 1998-1999 school budget which will require an increase in taxes of \$66,696.49. They will be presenting the 1998-1999 proposed school budget at an informational meeting again this year planned for the 26th of March at 7:00 PM at the old town hall in an effort to give every citizen of Westport an opportunity to ask questions about this proposed budget.

Again this year, I want to acknowledge the effort of our bus drivers in transporting our students in a safe manner.

In closing, I want to thank the school committee, selectmen and the community's other elected officials who continue to work cooperatively providing funding for an excellent education for Westport's children. I look forward to seeing interested citizens at the informational meeting on the school budget and at the annual town meeting.

## **Volunteer Fire Department**

Dear Westporters,

Another year has passed without any out of control fires, that is no structure, chimney, or brush fires that we had to respond to. Everyone has done a great job remembering their fire safety. We at the fire department thank all of you. We did however have 22 medical aid calls, 10 accidents, 13 service calls, 2 false alarms, and 6 mutual aid calls for a total of 53 calls. This is 21 more calls than we had last year. Please remember to drive safely and practice safety all the time.

We here on Westport were very fortunate during Ice Storm '98. There were two roads that lost their power for a week. One was the Bay Shore Rd. and the other was Bakers Rd. the rest of us only lost power for about an hour. Please remember that we at the fire department are here to help YOU and you need to call us when you need help. The fire station will be set up as a shelter for those that need a place to wait out the storm or other emergency that should arise. This is why the emergency generator is so badly needed. So please call us with your needs.

I would like to thank the members of the department for their dedication of time and talent to the town. It gives me great pleasure to be a part of the department and they all deserve a huge THANKS for all they do. We have six members who are now qualified in CPR, and one that is taking an EMT course that will be qualified in late April or early May. They do this without pay except for the thanks they get from all of you.

We have worked on a couple of projects this year. One is the painting of the wooden portion of the station, which was done by D & D Lester. The other was the construction of the cement pad for the addition which will house the emergency generator we hope to purchase this year. Both of these projects were paid for by money raised by the department. The generator we are looking at will not only power the fire station but also the new town office building in the event of a power outage when there will be a need for a shelter for those who need to relocate. The fire station is already an emergency operation center, for which the generator is greatly needed. We hope to receive your support in this project.

We continue to meet the first Tuesday of every month for our monthly business meeting, and every Wednesday for training and equipment maintenance. New members are always needed and welcomed, not only for firefighting but the many other tasks that we perform.

Please remember that for any outside burning year round that a permit is required. These can be obtained by calling Rusty Robertson at 882-6385 or Alan & Cheryl Anderson at 882-5572. Please call and obtain a permit rather than burning without one and having the fire department respond to an out of control brush fire.

Remember that every time you change your clocks you should change the batteries in your smoke detectors. If you don't have smoke detectors get them, it's a proven fact they do save lives. We continue to welcome all to stop by the station when we are there and visit or even join us in the department.

Again I want to thank all the members of the department for all they do, and all of you for your support, THANKS!!!

## Emergency Management Director

The biggest news to report concerns the great Ice Storm of '98, of course. Westport was very fortunate and somehow missed the brunt of the storm, but we did report some damage and had some extended power outages at a few of the homes. Most importantly, no major damage was incurred, and lessons were learned that we will apply to our preparations for future events. Other activities during the past year included some problems related to high winds and high tides, but most were handled quickly and efficiently.

The Fire Station remains the sheltering facility on Westport should anyone be faced with needing someplace to go during severe winter storms, extended power outages, and other circumstances where it is unsafe to remain at home. To facilitate providing adequate shelter, as well as the ability to conduct fire and rescue operations, the Fire Department is progressing with its plans to install a backup generator with sufficient capacity to power the majority of the station. As Emergency Management Director, I will be asking that the small amount of funds in the town EMA account be applied to that project, because of the benefits it can provide to the Town. I will keep you posted on the progress of the generator project, but you should know that the Fire Station has been, and still is, available for temporary sheltering.

The association between the Fire Department and Emergency Management functions remains as close as ever. While the Emergency Management charter applies to responding to natural disasters and nuclear events, and the Fire Department medical calls, fires, and traffic accidents, the two functions coexist very well, and we share facilities, training opportunities, and most significantly, assets. As always, I would like to thank the men and women of the Westport Volunteer Fire Department, under the leadership of Chief Alan Anderson, for their assistance throughout the year. There is substantial material and equipment to maintain, as well as some training to endure, and they lend a hand without hesitation.

I encourage everyone to learn and practice standard precautions to prevent damage during unusual weather events that may potentially involve this area of the coast. Being prepared well in advance, paying

attention to radio and television broadcasts, and reacting appropriately to changing situations can possibly prevent inconvenience, personal injury, property loss, and worse. Information is available at the Fire Station with regard to disaster preparedness; stop by and ask questions. We would also appreciate anyone wishing to take a more proactive role in the safety and well-being of themselves and their neighbors to become active members of the Fire Department/EMA team. The need is increasing to have trained responders available; if you are 18 years old or older, we would like to discuss the opportunities available to serve your community.

## **Wiscasset Solid Waste Transfer and Recycling Station 1997 Annual Report**

We are approaching our seventh year of operation and it looks like it is going to be the year with the most changes of operation we have ever had.

With the tax structure changing in Wiscasset, all departments have been asked to do whatever they can to reduce their budgets for 1998, therefore the changes start. We are losing two of our attendants to other departments as one way of reduction. With two people short, we can no longer be open seven days a week so we will be closing two of them. The days chosen to be closed are Sundays and Mondays. We realize that this poses a hardship on some people as far as bringing waste to the station but there are other ways of accomplishing the task. You can use commercial haulers or we will be open Wednesday nights 'till 8 P.M. We hope that people will understand the situation and realize that it is not the doing of the station attendants so we ask that you not blame them for the shutdowns.

Another big change is that we will be charging a fee for all tires brought to the station. Over the past two or three years we have accepted over 12,000 tires at the station and feel that the town cannot bear the expense of disposal anymore. We do know that many tires are coming in from dealers so we know that many of the tires are from cars and trucks that are not associated with any of the towns contracting to use the transfer station.

Probably the biggest change will be the ability of the attendants to help people as much as we have in the past. The remaining attendants will be quite busy keeping recyclables picked up and taken care of in the recycling area. We ask that you help by flattening cardboard, removing caps from milk jugs, removing covers from jars and most of all, if your items have not been rinsed out please do not put them in the recycling bins as when they start to smell they draw rodents.

We ask that you bear with us with patience and try to realize that things are changing.

With the new recycling bins that the citizens of Wiscasset built for us, it looks like we will have reached our goal and the Maine State mandate of 50% recycling by January 1998.

Thank you for your cooperation the past seven years. We hope our relationship with you can continue and we will do what we can to help you through these transitions.

### WATERWAYS AND HARBORS ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF WESTPORT WESTPORT ISLAND, MAINE

#### I. PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

- A. The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the just and orderly operation of; marine activities on Westport waterways. It is intended to promote public safety, enjoyment, convenience on the waterways, and to provide for effective use and control of mooring areas and public facilities appurtenant thereto.
- B. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the Home Rule Authority as defined by statute, and 38 M.R.S.A. 1 et seq. among others.

#### II. DEFINITIONS

- A. "Owner" means the owner of a vessel and/or the owner of a mooring, as the context requires.
- B. "Resident" shall have its ordinary meaning and shall include persons owning or renting residential real property in Westport who use that property for their year-round or seasonal home, with a minimum of four (4) weeks continuous annual occupancy.

- C. "Vessel" means any type of vessel, or boat, barge, float or craft used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water other than a sea plane.

### III. MOORING PERMITS

No mooring shall be placed, moved, or removed except under the direction of and with a permit from the Harbor Master. "Permits" apply only to the assigned vessel and are not transferable to another owner. Any mooring without a permit is subject to removal by the Harbor Master at the owner's expense (See Section VII, below). Any change of vessel requires a new permit and may require relocation of the mooring at the direction of the Harbor Master. Each owner shall be given a copy of this Ordinance when the permit is issued.

### IV. IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS

The Harbor Master shall assign an identification number to each mooring to be placed by the owner on the mooring buoy. Identification numbers must be at least three inches high and clearly visible at all times. Any mooring not having an identification number is subject to removal by the Harbor Master at the owners expense. (See Section VII, below).

### V. REGISTER AND MOORING CHART

The Harbor Master shall maintain a public register listing for each permitted mooring: (a) owners' name, residency status, address, and telephone number, (b) the name, length, type and registration of the vessel, and whether it is commercial or non-commercial, (c) the type of mooring and (d) the date of issuance of the mooring permit. The Harbor Master shall also maintain a mooring chart for each mooring area on which the location of each mooring is indicated by its identification number.

### VI. FEES

The one-time mooring fee shall be \$10.00 for residents: \$50.00 for non-residents.

### VI-

#### I. REMOVAL OF IMPROPER MOORINGS

If the Harbor Master determines that a mooring is unregistered, improperly located, hazard to navigation, or otherwise improper, the Harbor Master shall first notify the owner, if the owner can be readily determined. The notice shall be sent by regular First Class U.S. Mail to the owner's last known address and shall state: (a) the nature of the problem, (b) that the mooring and/or buoy must be removed, moved, or replaced or other action taken to the satisfaction of the Harbor Master within thirty (30) days of the date the notice was mailed, and (c) that if the matter is not resolved within the time-period, the Harbor Master may cause the entire mooring to be removed or the buoy removed and the chain dropped to the bottom, and the owner shall be liable to the town in the amount of \$100.00 plus the necessary expenses related to the service, if the Harbor Master takes such action with respect to the mooring.

### VI-

#### II. OWNER RESPONSIBILITY FOR BOATS

Responsibility for the safety of each mooring and boat in the harbor lies with its owner or master or his representative. Unless otherwise provided by law, the town shall not be responsible for the safety of any moorings or boats, in, on or under Town waters, and shall not be responsible for (a) any injury to persons or (b) damage to boats moving, drifting, anchored or moored in the harbor or using the town landing facility or launching facility.

### **PROTECTION**

**ART. 35.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend the balance of the Maine Yankee Alarm Maintenance Fund (approximately \$1,303.35) and the Emergency Communications Fund (approximately \$4,407.53) for the purposes of purchasing an emergency generator to power the fire station in the event of a power outage and to assist in the cost of constructing a shelter to house the generator.

Recommended by the Selectmen that this action be taken.

- ART. 36.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend the balance of the Civil Emergency Preparedness fund (approximately \$489.76) for the purposes of purchasing an emergency generator to power the fire station in the event of a power outage and to assist in the cost of constructing a shelter to house the generator.

Recommended by the Selectmen that this action be taken.

- ART. 37.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Westport Volunteer Fire Department.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$2,236.82 be carried forward and the sum of \$4,263.18 raised; \$1,000.00 for direct payment to the Department and \$5,500.00 for direct purchases for the Department.

- ART. 38.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the third and final annual payment of principal and interest on the Damariscotta Bank & Trust note used for the purchase of a fire truck in 1995.

Recommended by Selectmen that \$12,641.25 be raised.

- ART. 39.** To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to take out insurance to cover injuries to Town Employees under the Workman's Compensation act and raise and appropriate money for same.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$3,000.00 be transferred from Undesignated Funds (Surplus).

### **HEALTH AND SANITATION**

- ART. 40.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town's share of the Wiscasset Transfer Station operating expenses, and to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate and enter into a contract with the Town of Wiscasset on such terms as they deem to be in the best interest of the Town.

Recommended that the sum of \$32,103.00 be raised.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE/SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS**

- ART. 41.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Support of the Poor.

Recommended by Selectmen that the sum of \$85.60 be carried forward and the sum of \$1,714.40 be transferred from miscellaneous receipts.

- ART. 42.** To see what, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate for each of the following service organizations:

- ART. 43.** To see what action the Town will take in regard to the 1998 State Allocation for roads.

Recommended by Selectmen that it be put in a reserve fund for roads and voted on at the next Annual Meeting.

- ART. 44.** To see what action the Town will take in regards to the 1998 Excise Taxes.

Recommended by Selectmen that necessary funds be transferred to Snow Removal Account and the balance be transferred to the Town Highways and Bridges Account.

- ART. 45.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize Selectmen to let out for bid snow removal and winter maintenance as they deem in the best interest of the Town.

- ART. 46.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Snow Removal.

Recommended by Selectmen that necessary funds be transferred from Excise Tax Receipts.

- ART. 47.** To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the paving upgrades and maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.

Recommended by Selectmen that the balance of \$38,350.36 be carried forward, the balance of the 1998 Excise Tax receipts after the transfer authorized in ART. 46 be transferred, and the sum of \$25,000.00 be transferred from the State Highway Account.

- ART. 48.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize Selectmen to let out for bid, any road construction or repairs as they deem in the best interest of the Town.

## MISCELLANEOUS

- ART. 49.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the tax year 1998.
- ART. 50.** To see if the Town will vote to set a date when taxes shall be payable and to set an interest rate due thereafter.  
Recommended that taxes be due and payable on November 1, 1998 and that interest shall be due on taxes paid after November 1, 1998 at the statutory rate.
- ART. 51.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of tax acquired property by bid process following advertisement in the Lincoln and Sagadahoc newspapers for three consecutive weeks and posting at the Town Hall for the same period of time at a price not less than unpaid tax, interest and costs with further authority to reject any and all bids, but the Selectmen shall sell the property to the prior owner for the amount of any unpaid taxes, interest and costs due.
- ART. 52.** To see if the Town will vote to set a specified time for the Treasurer to pay Selectmen's warrants.
- ART. 53.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector or Treasurer to accept prepayments of taxes not yet committed pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. section 506.
- ART. 54.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, at their discretion, to lease or rent the Town Hall facilities under terms and conditions voted under Article 39 at the 1977 Town Meeting, March 26, 1977.
- ART. 55.** To see if the Town will vote to accept, from time to time, gifts from the Dorothy Q. Doggett Trust and to authorize the Selectmen to expend funds received from that Trust in accordance with its terms.

The registrar of voters will hold office hours while the polls are open, on Friday, March 27, 1998 to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; and to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

The Selectmen and the Registrar will be in session at the Town Hall in Westport on Saturday, March 28, 1998 at 8:30 o'clock A.M. for the purpose of correcting the voting list. You are hereby directed to serve this by posting at the Town Hall at least seven days before said meeting.

Therefore, fail not, and have the Warrant with your doings thereon at the above place and time.
