ARBOR WEEK - Ken Stratton and Jim McMullen presented Tree City USA awards to Kennebunkport, Westbrook, Portland, South Portland, Yarmouth and Farmington during Arbor Week, May 20-26 and school children and Girl Scouts planted thousands of Forest Nursery produced seedlings throughout the State. Special tree planting ceremonies were conducted on Munjoy Hill in Portland and the University of Maine in Augusta.
