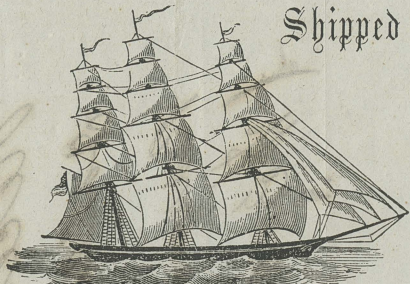

and bound for *Bucksport Maine* To say:

150 Barrels Flour
6775 1/2 Bushels yellow corn

(To go as near Bucksport as the
ice will permit)

Being marked and numbered as in the margin; to be delivered in the like good order and condition,
at the aforesaid Port of *Bucksport* (the dangers of the seas, only excepted,) unto *E. Boomer & Co for J. Mescott & Co of Blue Hills* Assigns,
he or they paying freight for the said Goods, at the rate of *fifty cents* on
Flour and *thirteen cents* per bushel on
corn with *utper* cent. prime and average accustomed.

In witness whereof, the Master or Purser of the said vessel hath affirmed to *four* Bills
of Lading, all of this tenor and date; one of which being accomplished, the others to stand void.
