

It Has Been A Forty Year **Dream Come True**

Jes - dreams can come true. It began in 1973 when the Gee family f 1 moved to Belgrade Lakes, Maine, from New Jersey. The family included myself, my husband Bill, son Bill, daughter Carol, and a Beagle named Penny.

I had dreamed of owning a high-end gift shop that I could operate on my own from my residence. The dream became a viable option when Bill and I bought property on Lakeshore Drive that had been part of the Belgrade Hotel. The Belgrade was a very fashionable resort hotel with its own golf course, beach area on Long Pond, beautifully landscaped grounds, and much more - including great fishing on Long Pond and other area lakes.

The Belgrade was built in 1899 and burned to the ground in October of 1956. After the fire the considerable land acreage was divided into building lots that led to the development of both seasonal and year-round residences, and more.

Our choice of location had advantages well-suited to the dream. It had visibility, proximity to the village and enough space to provide parking. Bill, a man of many talents, built our home in sections with my eventual gift shop area part done last.

Thus, the dream became a reality. The Village Peddler was born.

Now, work began! Inventory had to be developed. That would entail trips to suppliers, invitations to creative people for consignment arrangements, and much more. It was also necessary for me to familiarize myself with sales tax regulations, record book strategies, etc. In short, I had to train myself - you might call it on the job training.

Wearisome work? Of course! Was it worth it! You bet! The business was modestly successful but the greatest benefit would be, without question, the friendships formed with permanent and summer folks alike.

So it has been a 40-year pursuit of my dream - The Village Peddler.

At the risk of sounding corny I will quote a star from the distant past, Bob Hope, who used to close his TV shows by singing "Thanks for the memories."

I do not sing but I do want you all to know how much you mean to me. And that comes right from the heart.

Legacies

Experience the heritage and culture of 19th -century Maine in a unique, rural setting and witness the humble beginnings of Livermore's Washburn Family, instrumental in changing the face of politics and business. Throughout July and August, the Washburn-Norlands Living History Center in Livermore will be open every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday between 11am and 4pm for "Living History Tours". It's best to arrive by 3pm to enjoy the full site.

Visitors to the site are engaged by people, dressed in period clothing, who portray a local person, someone you might have met had you visited in 1800s. It could be "Aunt Clara" cooking in the farmer's cottage, or a Washburn granddaughter, Ada Washburn, in the elegant 1867 mansion, or the school ma'am, Olive Fuller, in the District #7 one-room schoolhouse. Go back to the basics of reading, writing and 'rithmetic and use slates, quill pens and early readers.

"Thanks to our incredible team of volunteer interpreters, we are able to be open three days per week. We hope this allows more families the opportunity to experience this unique living history farm. Visitors will also see our new historic timber frame barn being built. It's an exciting time at the Norlands as our farm animals await their new home." said Jane Frost, Board of Trustees.

Visitors will also enjoy the impressive library, built of granite in 1883, see portraits of and artifacts belonging to the Washburn family, and learn about their contributions during the Civil War. The

Norlands Opens for the Summer Season on July 2



Norlands is the ancestral home of Maine's Civil War Governor, Israel Washburn, Jr. Three of his brothers also played significant roles during the war.

The oldest building on the site is the 1828 Universalist Meeting House. Israel Washburn Sr. and neighbor, Otis Pray, donated the land and raised money by selling pews. It is home to beautiful trompe l'oeil (painting to fool the eye) by 19th century Portland artist Valentine Keiler.


Between 1813 and 1833, Israel and Martha Washburn of Livermore gave birth to 11 children. Among them were: two state Governors, four Congressmen, one U.S. Senator, two Foreign Ministers, one Civil War General, one Navy Captain, one Secretary of State, the founder of Washburn-Crosby Gold Medal Flour, the inventor of a typewriter, President of the Soo Railroad, and three noted authors. All of them called the Norlands home.

Step back into the 19th century and enjoy an after-

noon of history and fun at Maine's oldest living history farm. Living History Tours are an engaging way, for all ages, to learn what rural Maine life was like in the 1800s. Bring your imagination and ask all the questions you want. Enjoy the quality of place. A short walk from the Norlands is the Waters Hill Cemetery, where several Civil War veterans and Washburn descendants are laid to rest. A short trail takes you to the Pools of Simeon, reflecting pools designed by William Drew Washburn in 1903. Maps are available in the gift shop. You can bring a picnic lunch and enjoy the beautiful 445 acres of fields, forests, and working farmland.

Admission is \$10 adult/\$6 age 12 and under. \$25 family rate (2 adults and 2-3 children). No appointments necessary. The Norlands is located at 290 Norlands Road in Livermore. FMI: Visit www.NORLANDS.org or call 207-897-4366.

The Belgrade Purple Martin Project

People and Purple Martins have a long history of getting along well. Indeed, John James Audubon, traveling the "United States" back in the 1830s, commented that almost every country inn had a "martin box" outside, and the better the bird houses, the better the inn was apt to be!

It's not known if the early inns of Belgrade had martin houses, but the town does have a long history of cooperation between its human residents and these large, handsome swallows. One case in point occurred recently when a small band of Maine bird enthusiasts teamed up with landowners and residents to upgrade the accommodations of a martin colony which has been present since at least 1909.

It seems that the martin houses of the old Guy Yeaton farm had deteriorated. Long-time owners of the place, Maggie and the late Carl Yeaton, had gone above and beyond the call of duty in maintaining the bird houses, and some years ago Carl had even made and erected, with the help of Hammond Lumber Company workers, new multi-apartment martin dwellings. Now though, even the newer houses were showing their age, and some of the many birders who traveled long distances annually to see the birds were becoming concerned that the colony might "wink out" as had been the case with many others this far north.

Enter Derek Lovitch of Pownal, a professional birding guide and co-owner of Freeport Wild



Bird Supply. Derek had often brought clients to see the Belgrade martins, and one of those clients (John Alexander of Sheffield, Massachusetts), on viewing the condition of the houses, had offered substantial financial support to any effort to ensure the continued survival of the Belgrade colony.

As the wheels began to turn, Derek contacted three local birding friends, Bob Lewis and Don Mairs of Belgrade and Ed Slattery of Rome, who in turn got in touch with the new owners of the property, Don and Mary Hammond and their

tenants, Norm and Lena Beaudoin and Jason and Cathy Carey. With everyone on board and the promised donation in hand, Derek was able to get, at his wholesale price, two new arrays of plastic gourds (now preferred martin housing) with sturdy steel poles and pulley systems to facilitate cleaning.

After a trip to Gagne's for cement, the intrepid quartet of birders managed to dig the requisite hole, battle through arcane instructions, and get the new "digs" firmly in place. It's probably too late for nesters this year, but the idea is to give the inhabitants of the old houses a chance to check out the new array, which they're already doing.

And what of the other new gourd array? The plan was for that to be placed in a different but nearby location in hopes that martins travelling out to feed would spy it and perhaps be inspired to establish a new "suburb," thereby decreasing the chance of a catastrophic event eliminating the entire population.

After consultation with Librarian Janet Patterson ad her Board, and President Mike Barrett of the Friends of the Library Board, it was decided to put the other gourds in the open space behind the library. This pleasant and bird-friendly location has the advantage of proximity to Belgrade Central School, with obvious potential for collaboration.

So far, so good. Now, it's up to the birds!

Organ Concert at Readfield Union Meeting House

n July 11th the ReadfieldUnion Meeting House will present a program of organ music to mark the restoration of the building's historic organ. Dennis Leight of Tenants Harbor and Christina Misner Rao of Manchester will present a variety of music that will challenge the organ's rich and full sound. Open to the public, the program will start at 7 p.m. and admission is free although a donation would be welcome.

After years of not having been played, the organ needed a thorough restoration to bring it back to its original condition Mr. Leight took the air chamber, reeds and keyboard to his studio in Tenants Harbor during the winter and completely overhauled them. He said the instrument was a fine one and encouraged that it be played regularly. With that in mind, the Board of the UMH decided to present the first concert on July 11th.

Mr. Leight is a talented organist/pianist, as well as restorer of those two instruments. He has performed at a wide variety of performance venues, including classical concerts, theater pipe organs and piano entertainments. He began his studies on the piano 62 years ago under the late Dr. George Powers, organist at St. Mark's in the Bowery, New York City. He is a member of the Piano Technical Guild, has been affiliated with the Austin Organ Co. of Hartford, Ct., and has specialized in the restoration of pipe organ, reed organs, pianos and other pneumatic player action devices.

Mrs. Rao is currently the organist and choir director at the Wayne Community Church. She is the daughter of Rev. Dr. Peter and Susan Misner, grew up in Kents Hill and Manchester and graduated from Winthrop High School. She furthered her musical students at Ohio Wesleyan University and has had a varied career in music. For many years he was substitute organist and handbell choir director at the Jesse Lee United Methodist Church in Easton, Ct., before moving back to Maine.

The concert program will be varied. Both Mrs. Rao and Mr. Leight explained the reed organ such as at the UMH is best suited of the performance of hymns, ballads, marches and processional types of music. Thus, that evening's selections will sample these types of compositions drawn from the historical period of the instrumen'ts popularity, roughly from the 1850s through the pre-World War II era, as well as some earlier classical pieces. -

extended period of time. But, you get the picture.


Over the past few years we have had rainstorms of up to 8" reported. Consider how much water flows off your parking lot. It has damaging effects. So far this year we have had very little rain. But those "rain events" will come. Plan for them. See the extreme exam-

ple of a field cleared just before a storm in 2013. This erosion caused a delta to form in Torsey Pond.

Take the opportunity now to use some of those BMP's [Best Management Practices]. Focus on how to manage your yard and property. Control the water runoff. Look for places that have been damaged in past storms. It will happen again unless you do something.

A good buffer planting if well established does a good job of intercepting water runoff and filtering it before it gets to the lake. Control the water runoff from your buildings or driveway and parking by diverting that water into the woods or otherwise filter it so it doesn't concentrate and transport soil, chemicals, or other toxics into the water. Make sure roadways and parking is designed and maintained to collect the rainwater and divert it into either filter ponds or a vegetative area where the water is filtered before it gets to the lake. Check the road surface, the ditches and the culverts to see that they are not simply channeling soil particles and other pollutants into the lake.

Remember, there is a lot to do in order to protect water quality.



Tadpole Patrol is an "On the Water Adventure"!



here's no better way to spend a Maine summer than out on the lakes! So why not learn about the lakes at the same time? The Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed is once again offering the Tadpole Patrol program, an educational, FUN, interactive and hands-on experience aboard the Friends' 22' pontoon boat "floating classroom" the OTTER II. Children and families will enjoy the experience with five different options offered to learn about watershed protection and water quality.


The first level is Tadpole Patrol for children entering grades 2-3-4 where they are introduced to lake ecology, observing wildlife, and learning the basics of water quality testing. TP-II Lake Science Investigators (LSI!) is for children entering grades 4-5-6 where participants become "science investigators" as they observe the lake ecosystem, conduct water quality tests, and record data in their own keepsake journal. The third level offered is TP3-Junior Lake Monitors for youth entering grades 6 and up. TP3 participants are educated in proper water quality data measurement techniques, conduct precise measurements themselves, then analyze and compare their results with data recorded by the Cobbossee Watershed District from the past 30+ years.

The fun continues on the water with our Family Tadpole Patrol and Spotter's Amphibious Adventures. Get the whole family involved in our Family Tadpole Patrol adventure! Kids and adults of all ages can board the OTTER II for an hour and half long session to observe wildlife, learn and share the human and natural history of the lake, and experience water monitoring with professional equipment. Spotter's Amphibious Adventures explore and learn about aquatic and terrestrial habitats. Participants cruise aboard the OTTER II to a private island in the middle of the lake where we will explore, learn about the importance of riparian areas for wildlife, the benefits of preserving wild spaces, and the basics of the "Leave No Trace" method of enjoying nature. 



Take It Outside –

The Belgrade Lakes Watershed is a special L place to live or visit. The lakes, hills, and forests provide four season recreational opportunities for all. Whether you enjoy hunting, fishing, hiking, sailing, kayaking, biking, skiing, or birdwatching, it's all here and "for everything there is a season." This week I have been fishing, hiking, and canoeing. The windy afternoon weather has made for very pleasant, bug free hiking conditions. The scheduled Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance (BRCA) weekend geology hike got rained out but during the week I got out on the Sanders Hill Loop in the Kennebec Highlands, BRCA's Mount Phillip Trail, and The Mountain.

The Sanders Hill Loop has been significantly enhanced by a recent rerouting. The old trail used to run for over half a mile along the Kennebec Highlands Trail, an old gravel road. That section of trail has been rerouted through the woods and now meanders along parallel to the Beaver Brook, a very scenic stream with cascading waterfalls. Along that section, a new picnic table has been constructed on an island with the brook passing by on both sides- a very soothing and scenic place to stop for a snack or trail lunch. If you haven't hiked that trail for a while, I highly recommend it. You are in for a treat. Stop into the BRCA Office at the Maine Lakes Resource Center (MLRC) and pick up the latest hiking map. The trailhead is on the west side of Watson Pond Road about a mile south of Rt 27.

I run into lots of friends and families hiking the trails. If I meet someone new, I usually ask them where they are from and how they found out about the trail. This week I ran into lots of people who have been coming to the Belgrades for multiple generations. On Mount Phillip, I ran into two generations of the Embrees from Texas.



- Conservation Too -

So far this year we haven't had one of those 5-8" rainstorms. That is called a serious "rain event". We were fortunate to have less rain than normal and none of it has yet arrived as a deluge. But it will....

We have talked about stormwater runoff before, but what does that mean? What is "stormwater" and what do we care? Sure the ditch next to your driveway may have a lot of water in it during and soon after a rainstorm or the culvert beneath your driveway will run full. But, what's the big deal? The pond level may rise a bit and waves might lap against the shoreline. Isn't that just nature doing what nature does? What can we do about that?

Like anything else in our life, if we anticipate it and make informed decisions, we can affect its impact. In the case of a rainstorm, we can design our landscape and manage our property in a manner so that the rainwater's impact on water quality is moderated. Where we put our roadways, buildings, lawns, patios and other structures effects how the water runs across the landscape. And we have all seen how the stormwater flow can generate erosion and silt as it heads towards the nearby wetland, stream or pond. Designers and engineers as well as municipal officials, road managers and the Maine DEP refer to this as "stormwater control". It may be

an overstatement to assume "control", but how we place and manage our structures on the landscape can mitigate their impact on water quality.

Let's start with some numbers :-{). We measure rainfall as so many "inches of rain". Given that most of us measure liquids in gallons or liters, it's hard to translate what an inch of rain is.

If you have a parking area or a building that is near the shoreline, all the rain falling on that surface is diverted to the lowest point and then leaves that surface into a runoff area. How much water gets focused to that area? If you have a 25' x 40' building or parking area, you have 1,000 square feet of area that the rain doesn't soak into. A square foot is 144 square inches. One inch of rain on that surface translates into 144,000 cubic inches [83 ft3] or about 625 gallons of water. Now consider your property. How much impervious surface do you have? An impervious surface doesn't soak up the rain but carries it off to another location. If you have a home, garage, storage shed, deck, driveway and parking area, you may have as much as 10,000 square feet of impervious area. So... for every inch of rain that falls on those surfaces, your property needs to deal with an additional ≈70,000 gallons of water in addition to the rain that has already fallen on the property. Depending upon how your structures are designed, that additional water is all being directed towards a few specific points on your property. That concentration of water can do a lot of damage.

And how much is 70,000 gallons? That would be the water in a 5 foot 'above ground pool' that is 48 feet in diameter. What would the effect be if you cut the side out of that and allowed all that water to go streaming across your yard and into the lake? Yes, my numbers may be only estimates and an inch of rain may fall over an
