Getting a Feel For Life On The Farm

ere in the land of lakes, woods and fields, it is the fields, so often devoted to livestock or gardens or orchards and beehives, that have their day on Sunday, July 26, when farming gets a little bit closer to the public and the public gets a lot closer to farming.

Sunday, July 26 is Open Farm Day statewide. It's the day when the gates are ajar and it's ok to drive in, to park, to look around, to pet the farm

animals, to take pictures, to ask questions and to discover.

Now in its 26th year, Maine's Annual Open Farm Day is both educational and fun, appealing to all ages, offering a true glimpse of living history, giving a close-up of the farming way of life and opening new doors for lifestyles and livelihoods among the younger or the retirement generations

On July 26th, 60 farms will be open statewide, usually from 10 am-3 pm, and over a dozen are close to the Belgrade Lakes region. Many farms have extended hours for special events such as milking or to accommodate other chores on the farm

Activities may include visiting barns and riding on wagon tours, following nature trails, sam-



pling homemade products, participating in children's projects such as felting, and watching demonstrations.

In almost all visits owners and families, managers and other employees and neighbors and volunteers will be available to guide visitors, answer questions, and describe the work of the farm.

Some visitors spend all day on one farm, some drive to two or three. There will be plenty of visitors with children to share the experience with



and plenty of old-timers tagging along nostalgically. Many farms are handicapped accessible, have restrooms and can handle large groups.

Refreshments are often available and in most cases farm and craft products will be for sale.


To find a farm go to getrealmaine.com and click on agricultural events. Farms are listed by county; Kennebec, Franklin and Aroostook are the closest to the Belgrade area. The farms also are described by specialty, i.e. type of livestock such as goat, rabbit, alpaca or type of produce such as blueberries, apples.

Finally, each farm describes the program of the day, such as gathering eggs or pony rides or swimming in the pond.

Sunday, July 26. Visit a farm! What a great way to spend a day.





What is iMap?

Map is a free Web-based map and database that **⊥**shows where invasive species are on Maine's landscape.

Anyone in Maine can use iMap for information about invasive plants and animals in our state. A distribution map of invasive species by county or watershed is available to anyone, including non-registered users.

Please note that iMapInvasives works best in Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox.

iMap can be an effective tool for citizen groups, landowners, and land managers. Registered users can use iMap to:

- map invasive plant infestations;
- facilitate early detection and rapid response to new invasive species and infestations;
- track invasive species control efforts to help improve best practices and outcomes over time;
- records;
- search to see which invasive species have been reported in your town, watershed, or ting up a user account?
- set up an e-mail alert to be notified of new infestations in your area;
- create an assessment polygon to outline an area of infestation, and record the severity of and other information about the infestation;
- record areas where you have searched and whether or not you found anything; and/or
 - note treatments you have done.

Can I report an invasive species without set-

Yes, you can report invasives without an account here. You will be asked for your contact information so a follow-up can be made if the species is new to the area or if it is an early detection species for the State -- these are good candidates for rapid response eradication efforts.

Paddle Trek Connects Local Lakes

The 30 Mile River Watershed Association will host its 7th Annual Paddle Trek on Saturday, August 1, 2015. This event offers paddlers an opportunity to experience the watershed from a new perspective as they travel by canoe and kayak through many of the lakes that form the "30 Mile River." This daylong, guided trip goes from Mt. Vernon Village to Wayne Village, along 15 miles of connected lakes and streams, with varying lengths and ending points for those wanting a shorter trip.



The Trek begins at Minnehonk Lake in Mt. Vernon at 7:30 a.m. The trip route proceeds down Hopkins Pond, Hopkins Stream, Taylor Pond, Echo Lake and its Mill Pond, Lovejoy Pond, Pickerel Pond, and Pocasset Lake, ending in Wayne at approximately 3:00 p.m. Through this once-a-year opportunity, participants will be permitted to travel a continuous route, thanks to the generous landowners that grant permission to portage across their property for this event.

The trip is split into four parts – with the option of paddling one, two, three or all four parts. Some parts require a person to portage their boat because of a dam or other impasse. Paddlers may join the group at any of the four meeting points, and return shuttles will be available at three locations. People of all ages and skill level enjoy this yearly event.





One More Week of Free Classical Concerts at Colby

If you enjoyed the cinematic "rediscoveries" at the Maine International Film Festival, you may also enjoy a musical rediscovery at the Atlantic Music Festival's concert on Saturday, July 25. Conducted by Jonathan Schiffman, the AMF Orchestra will present the modern première of Prométhée Enchainé ("Prometheus Bound") by French composer Fromental Halévy (1799-1862). This concert begins the final week of AMF performances at Colby College, all of which are free and open to the public.

In Greek mythology, Prometheus, a Titan, stole fire from Mt. Olympus to give to man. Zeus, the king of the gods, punished Prometheus by having him chained to a rock for all time. Using a libretto adapted from Aeschylus' play based on the legend, Halévy premièred his cantata in Paris in 1849. The work was ahead of its time in that one of its movements used microtones, intervals of less than a half step.

Despite plaudits from Halévy's better known contemporary Hector Berlioz, Prométhée Enchainé has not been performed since its première and has remained out of print. The orchestra will perform the entire cantata, with chorus and soloists. The concert will also feature two works by festival's founder and artistic director, Solbong Kim. They are his Ash Tree Song (2002) and "When Spring Comes" from his War Requiem (2007). Finally, the orchestra will present Mozart's ever popular Symphony No. 40.

Sunday will bring two very different performances: a chamber music matinée at 2:00 p.m. in the lobby of the art museum and an informal "salon" concert at 7:00 in Lorimer Chapel. The program for neither concert had been set at press time, but the latter will feature soloists, duets, and other small groups of AMF musician performing anything from baroque to folk to jazz, including works that they themselves have composed or are composing.

No performance has been scheduled for Monday night, but on Tuesday artists from the AMF's Piano Institute will play solo keyboard masterworks. Details of this program have yet to be announced.

Wednesday night will see a double bill. At 7:00, one can hear chamber works in the chapel

by two French impressionists, Maurice Ravel and Claude Debussy, as well as by two living American composers, Eric Ewazen and Stephen Cabell. At 9:00, "future music" will fill the Ostrove Auditorium in the Diamond Building. In this performance, fellows in AMF's Future Music Lab will use interactive computer technology to augment and play back in real time sounds produced by traditional instruments.

On the final Thursday of each festival, members of AMF's Opera Workshop take over Strider Theater to present semi-staged scenes from famous operas, using costumes, props, and a few set pieces. This year, they will sing and act excerpts from Mozart's Die Zauberflöte ("The Magic Flute.").

Friday will see the AMF's final chamber music concert, with works by Beethoven, Stravinsky, Shostakovich, and Seyfried. That last composer, Sheridan Seyfried, is a returning AMF faculty member and the work performed will be his Sextet for Clarinet, Strings, and Piano (2010), which is performed every year at the festival.

At 2:00 on Saturday, August 1, the AMF Contemporary Ensemble will perform new music by AMF's resident composers; and at 7:00 that evening, Maestro David Amado and AMF's conductors-in-training will lead the AMF Orchestra in Robert Paterson's Dark Mountains (2011) and Ludwig van Beethoven's Symphony 7. That latter concert will also include a piano concerto starring the winner of the AMF Piano Concerto Competition. The concerto and the winner are yet to be determined.

Admission to all AMF performances is free, but donations are encouraged. Except where otherwise noted, concerts take place in Lorimer Chapel and begin at 7:00. Program details are current as of press time, but are subject to change.







Check out Maine Farm Days Visit a Large Working Dairy Farm

Most of those who read this may not realize that Kennebec County still has a great deal of farming. Not just that in your back yard, but large producers of milk and beef. Kennebec County is the "Dairy Capitol of Maine". Kennebec County, like the rest of Maine, has also been adding farms and farmers rather than losing them. Many of the new farms are smaller. Fewer of them are dairy farms, but the mix of farming in Maine has become more and more diverse over the past ten years. Support your local farms and farmers.

The Maine Farm Days Exposition in Clinton is on Wednesday and Thursday, August 26th and 27th. On those two days the public is invited to visit a large local farm as part of the Maine Farm Days Agricultural Exposition. The Misty Meadows Farm in Clinton, Maine is a large dairy farm that grows hundreds of acres of their own feed, mostly corn, and raises many of their own replacement cows. They harvest truck loads of feed for their animals and they milk over 650 cows. Add to that the 600 head of young stock and they manage a herd of over 1,200. All of this work is on display for the public to visit during the two days of Maine Farm Days.

In addition to the actual farm operation of Misty Meadows Farm there will be three large tents filled with displays and people to answer



questions about farming operations and display products. Workshops and demonstrations occur through the day. While this Exposition is visited by a number of other farmers from around the region, it is seen as an opportunity for the farm to be a good neighbor and show the public where their food comes from and how that food is produced. There is an entire tent set up for children's activities and displays. While that tent is primarily for kids, it always generates a great deal of adult interest! There will be contests for Whoopie Pies and Apple Pies, a milking contest, ice cream making, demonstrations of ag harvesting methods, a giant corn maze and an entire series of workshops presented by the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Service. It is a full two days. This year's will devote the Thursday to the 2015 Maine Soils Conference "[Soil: Know Your

Roots". The entire sequence of workshops will be focused on how to improve and protect soil health.

The milking, harvesting activities and animal care are going on all day at the farm. You are invited to wander around, take the guided tours and check out the various displays. It is a big event. The guided wagon tours happen throughout the day and are sponsored by the Natural Resource Conservation Services. Thanks go out to the Stoughton family as they open up their farm to the public. Did you know that the milk produced at this farm could produce nearly 3,000 gallons of ice cream??? It is an 'up close and personal' experience. There are product displays, a kid's tent, a corn maze, equipment displays, alternative energy demonstrations, a wagon tour and many other activities. ... And it is all free to the public.

Plan to visit for any part of the two days. Come and join us anytime from 9 a.m until 4 p.m. Bring your family and friends and stay as long as you want. If you are there for lunch there is food available. Check out more information at their website www.mainefarmdays.com or our website at www.kcswcd.org and select the Maine Farm Days tab.




