Messalonskee on Milfoil: "We Can Control"

Removing milfoil by the bagful

s one of the first and the most heavily invaded aquatic plant (variable milfoil) infested lakes in Maine, Lake Messalonkee, also known as Snow Pond, has searched over a decade for a viable solution...until now.

With a small budget, a lot of volunteers and a plan, the Friends of Messalonskee Lake are forging ahead with the milfoil management goals of: eradicate new colonies, prevent spread and control and confine.





To achieve this they have successfully applied for and received grants, they have two DASH (diver-assisted suction harvesting) boats working on the lake every day, they are conducting a composting experiment, they have on staff a Milfoil Director, they have a slide show presentation for pitching potential grants and they have received an internship grant for 8 people.

of the stream where it passes under Route 27, has been completed this summer and mapping of Messalonskee Stream to the Kennebec River is scheduled for this fall. Messalonskee's maps of invasives will be linked to their website soon.

Additionally, there's the current plan of laying benthic barriers, developing Cove Patrols and maintaining CBIs (courtesy boat inspectors) at boat launches; the Outreach Program of holding workshops with area high schools and partnering with the Goodwill-Hinckley Academy of Natural Sciences; and the "clam-shell" benthic barrier program available to landowners.

Aside from a large contingent of volunteers and help and support from the Department of Environmental Protection, the Friends of Messalonskee Lake have benefited from their first year of writing grants. The total budget this year of \$85,000 breaks down into roughly \$45,000 from DEP grants, \$30,000 from a combination of small grants and generous contributions from the Towns of Belgrade, Oakland and Sidney, and \$9,000 from memberships that currently number around 500 of a potential 1100.

The Friends' membership also has a roster of 30 Business Friends, including New England Music Camp and the new Snow Pond Center For The Arts that offers year-round music programs and has in development plans for incorporating lake studies and a lakes resource section in one of the recital halls.

While writing grants, building membership




and laying benthic barriers are ongoing projects of the Friends of Messalonskee Lake, removing milfoil is the immediate focus. Following the success this summer of clearing part of the Belgrade Stream in the vicinity of the Route 27 bridge near the former (now closed) boat landing, the organization would like to open channels and inhibit spreading upstream, especially around the Wings Mills Dam which is all that separates the milfoil from Long Pond.

But in addition to progressing upstream through 7 miles of heavily infested water, the project faces a safety issue in that two unofficial boat landings on the stream are in use and at this point the Friends are seeking temporarily closure of the landings in order to have a "work window" to more safely send DASH boats, divers and volunteers to remove milfoil.

With most people who live along the stream supportive (why not, they remember when it was clear of vegetation), and the Department of Environmental Protection "incredibly helpful," the Friends of Messalonskee Lake report that so far representatives of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife have not been receptive.

Nonetheless, the Friends of Messalonskee ended their recent annual meeting on two very positive notes: water quality is the best in the Belgrades and the annual loon count revealed 30 adults and 5 chicks.

Belgrade Lakes: Village With A Friends' Vision



No place for a pram!!

Hearken back to the Grand Old Days of Belgrade Lakes Village. The days when the Belgrade Hotel was the Belle of the town with the Lakeshore Hotel and the Locust House bustling a little farther down the street. In those days folks came to stay on the American Plan with all meals included. The men were drawn to the fishing and the nine hole golf course at the Belgrade. The ladies came for fresh air with nannies to keep the kids occupied. In those days, folks often strolled after their dinner meal from

one end of the town to the other...and even stopped at the Brass Knocker Gift Shop as late as 9:30 at night to do some evening shopping.

In those days the sidewalks were smooth and maintained. Children could be pushed in prams and ladies would not trip as they walked leisurely along. There was even a water system that ran from a water tower on the West Road to the hotel and down to the spillway at the dam and back again. The Remains today of those sidewalks are downright dangerous and you need an all-terrain stroller to walk your little ones up to the Grill and back.

But change is happening! The State of Maine DOT has determined the .3 mile of roadway through the village needs to be rebuilt....from the ground up. They will dig down over three feet and install a new foundation and drainage system. Funds for the project will be a combination of state and federal funds with the Town of Belgrade being responsible for 20% of the cost of new asphalt sidewalks. The SelectBoard has approved the project that is now scheduled for spring 2018 (construction will be paused during July and August) and has money put aside for their share of the cost.

We have a once in a lifetime chance to make substantial improvements to the basic plan. The Friends of Belgrade Lakes Village is a newly formed 501©3 organization that includes volunteers from neighboring towns who consider Belgrade Lakes as their downtown. They are tasked with raising the funds to pay for major enhancements. These include upgrading the sidewalk from asphalt to brick, installing pedestrian lighting, benches, bike racks and flower containers along Main Street. The sidewalks will all be ADA compliant and include properly marked crosswalks and a Heartwalk with be included with strategically placed benches for resting.

The new road will include lined parking spaces and granite curbing that will result in a loss of approximately 16 "spaces" based on our current close parking on both sides of the road. It is hoped that enough money can be raised to purchase land for a parking lot that will include public handicapped accessible restrooms. The Friends would also like to continue the sidewalks from the bridge up over the hill in to Rome and install a sidewalk from the Union Church past the Catholic Church.

This is a huge project and the Friends are finalizing plans and preparing their fundraising efforts. It is hoped the sidewalks and bike racks will encourage healthy habits and the lighting will signal motorists to "SLOW DOWN" as they come in to the Village. They are exploring green alternatives for the new "Comfort Station." DOT and DEP are working closely to make sure best practices are utilized during the planning and construction phases. They are exploring porous pavers, storm drains, rain gardens and other environmentally friendly ideas.


ast week was a mixed bag weather-wise. We had a bit of hot and humid with no wind and a bit of intermittent thunderstorms with rain and wind. A couple of times I got out on the lake when it was dead calm flat early in the morning and could see schools of baitfish at the surface being chased by larger fish underneath. Some of drift up on these schools and cast a streamer fly that looks like an alewife into and around the That almost always produces quick strikes from hungry bass or brown trout. Now that the surface water is above 70 degrees the brown trout have gone deep (about 25 to 30-ft in Long Pond and Great Pond) but the bass are still up at the surface. A small silver crankbait such as a Rapala or a swimbait on a light spinning rig also produces well under these circumstances.

My grandkids came to visit this week and we spent a couple of days fishing and exploring the lake. It was hot in the sun so every hour or two the kids wanted to jump in the lake to cool off. We swam in "The Graveyard" in lower Long Pond and near Loon Island in upper Long Pond. After climbing back into the boat near Loon Island, my favorite fishing is when I cut the motor and Maddy picked up her pole and cast out a silver medium-running Rapala. I told the kids they had to put their PFDs back on once they were in the boat so Maddy put her rod into the rod holder while she began to don her PFD as I engaged the motor and we started moving. Just as she picked up her life jacket, her rod bent over and line started streaming out. She grabbed the rod and in a few minutes brought in a 3-pound plus bass about 18-inches long. Nathan caught several nice

bass on his flyrod but none quite as big as Maddy's. She also caught a nice yellow perch that we took home and cooked up for lunch. Along the way we spent some time watching a mother loon teaching her brand new chick how to swim and spotted an osprey catching a fish and carrying it off to a tree to eat it. All in all, a good time had by all, especially Grandpa





as the artists who make them. Formats include traditional structures, altered books, inventive structures, flags, accordions, pamphlets, and stars. Artists' books "read" in their own way. They may or may not include words or images, but you will find they always have something to say.

Demystifying Mulch

Mulching is one of the most effective and cost efficient Best Management Practices (BMP's) we have to work with. For stabilizing construction sites, eroded banks, and topdressing buffer plantings, mulch is great in protecting water quality. First a short discussion on why mulch is such an effective BMP. When bare soil is exposed to the elements, erosion begins to occur. Rain and wind can remove topsoil very quickly and deposit soil particles in the water. As these particles are transported in stormwater, they act like little magnets picking up pollutants and nutrients along the way. Once in the lake (or river or stream) these pollutants are deposited. Result - problems including algae blooms and elevated levels of toxins.

Mulch applied to an exposed site in the right amounts will serve several functions. A primary function is to protect the underlying soil from erosion and keep soil out of a water body. A secondary function occurs when a mulched area is located on the down side of a slope towards the water. The mulch will filter out most soil particles, fertilizers or toxins found in storm water runoff. In some cases, a mulch berm between a driveway, lawn or parking lot and the water can be added to provide this filtration even if there is no exposed soil to cover. Another major benefit to mulching is the moisture holding capabilities of this product. Mulching landscaped areas with tree and shrub plantings ensures that water, either from rain or from a hose, will percolate to the roots and keep the soil cool and moist.

While this seems simple enough the confusion begins when you start shopping for the right type of mulch for a specific kind of job. Mulch comes in many textures and colors. Sorting out the differences between "conservation mulch", "erosion control mulch", "bark mulch" and "wood chips" can become a daunting task. I will try to sort some of these names out.


"Wood chips" are simply trees or brush that have been run through a chipper. There are several reasons why wood chips are not the best choice to protect against soil erosion. These chips are generally 1-2 inches square and have not yet been exposed to the elements or begun to decompose. Because of their shape, chips do not weave together or hold much water. Some mulch is sold as "conservation mulch" at nurseries or by landscaping or contracting companies. Usually these mulches are standard pine or cedar bark mulch just like that used for landscaping flower or shrub plantings in your yard. This mulch holds soil in place in fairly flat areas and retains moisture well. Because this type of mulch is often used for landscaping and around plantings, 3-4" is recommended. Because it is referred to as "conservation mulch" people may THINK this product would be suitable for steep slopes and heavy runoff areas. Other products will perform better!

Erosion control mulch (ECM) was developed to

protect soil from erosion in areas that receive high traffic, exposure to the elements or occur on steep slopes. ECM, sometimes called slope stabilizer, is not your standard landscape bark mulch. The best way to describe ECM is "chunky". While regular bark mulch is fairly fine with strands of bark no longer than 6", ECM has larger pieces of woody material, bark and small stones. These small rocks mixed in with the bark provide additional structure to the product and add weight for keeping slopes intact. One key to the effectiveness of ECM is the size and shape of the bark material. When applied, the long and fairly thin material essentially weaves itself together and creates a kind of blanket over the soil. ECM traps plenty of moisture, similar to standard bark mulch. Thickness of application can vary depending upon several factors but 4-6" is average. Sites with extreme exposure to wind and water may need more while mulch berms may be 18-24" tall.

Buffer plantings are ideal sites for ECM. When the District installs a watershed buffer planting, ECM is what we mulch with. One important thing to remember is that 4" is too much mulch around the trunk of a tree or shrub. Remember to pull back the top 2" of material leaving 1-2" around plants. If the look of the ECM is too chunky for your taste, topdressing with an inch of standard landscaping bark mulch is fine.
