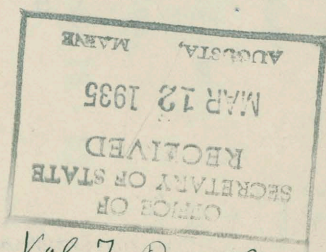

Certainly, there are no groups within the several communities of our State that have better opportunity to learn conditions first hand than our business women.

The business women of this day occupy an important and influential place in the social, business, and political life of the country.

Their participation in public affairs is of vast material assistance in the struggle to achieve economic security.

In addition, the age-recognized endowment of sympathetic and sensitive, if not instinctive understanding of women, make for the setting up of higher goals and enrich the new consciousness of an ancient responsibility--namely, that after all--life is too complex to be lived within one's own mental and physical borders, and that to be full and satisfying must take into account the problems and requirements of fellow men and women.
