

Thomaston July 14th 1862

To His Excellency the Governor

Dear Sir

As there is a call for more Troops to take the field I would respectfully ask to be authorized to Recruit for one of the Regiments about to be raised and also to be appointed a Lieutenant in one of the Companies if they are ^{to be} appointed if not to take the chance of an Election — I herewith inclose a Letter from Mr Jinks and Mr Thomas under whom I have served as a Subordinate Officer for the last Eighteen Months and if you would like any further reference I think I can furnish you all that you would want from West County the place of my former Residence —

If you should see fit to grant
me the favour asked I should prefer
to be connected with the 16th or 18th
Regiment — I would also say
that there are some thirty young
men confined in this Prison many
of whom have served a large portion
of their sentence and I have no doubt
would make good Soldiers — If you should
see fit to transfer them to the Army
I should like to have them under
my Control as I think I could make
them of quite as much service to the
as ~~State~~ as they now are
