Concerts at Maranacook Lake's Norcross Point will close the weekend festival with music from Simons and Goodwin.







ast week a friend of mine from MA rented a camp on Long Pond for a week's vacation with his family. Paul is a professional nature photographer and I took him out one morning at sunrise to get some wildlife photos. We found loons with newborn chicks and he and I each got some good pictures although based on the size of his lens compared to mine, I suspect his were much better. Later that morning I called him to see if he and his family wanted to hike one of the local trails. Coincidentally, they were just packing a picnic lunch and getting ready to head out. I packed a quick lunch and we met ten minutes later at the Sanders Hill trailhead on Watson Pond Road. The Sanders Hill loop is perfect for a lunch time hike as the Maine Conservation Corps has recently constructed a picnic table on an island in the Beaver Brook roughly half way around the loop. It is a very scenic spot and the brook babbling over the rocks on either side makes it very peaceful and cool, even on a hot day.


Along the way, we ran into numerous hikers, including Chris and Mike from Hawaii and MA, respectively, who were running along the trail. They didn't stop long because they were afraid their families who were walking along behind them would catch them, AGAIN. Shortly after Chris and Mike got on their way we met the rest of the family, including Grandpa from Pittsburgh who was hiking at a pretty good clip. When we stopped for a water break at the top of Sanders Hill, we met Bob, a retired Pfizer executive and avid hiker from Stonington, CT, who was in the area to attend the dedication of the new, fully accessible playground at Pine Tree Camp on North Pond. Bob was actually on his third hike of the day, having already done Mount Phillip and French Mountain before tackling Sanders Hill. He was profusive in his praise of the variety and overall quality of the local trails he had hiked in the last couple of days.

I also managed to get out for some crepuscular fishing this week when the lake was dead calm either early in the morning or late in the day. I had good success spotting schools of baitfish and casting my trusty white zonker streamer into the mix. I caught quite a few nice bass and the photo below shows how well that fly "matches the hatch" when compared to an alewife regurgitated in the bottom of my boat by one of the fish I caught. Because of the way the fly is weighted it rides with the hook up, which reduces snags when fished deep near the bottom where the larger fish hang out.






Maine Agriculture is "Up" in More Ways than One

culture using statistics derived from the 2012 Census of Agriculture, the words "up" and "increase" appear quite often. Our state's agriculture and farm-related demographics are growing and diversifying each year.

Both the number of farms and of farmland acres in Maine increased since the last Census of Agriculture in 2007. In fact, we have the most farms of the New England states, and the farmland acres are up eight percent from 2007. In addition, the average size of a Maine farm is 178 acres, up seven percent since 2007. Organic production and aquaculture sales increased between 2007 and 2012 as well: the value of aquaculture sales increased from \$26.3 million to \$75.1 million (ranking us eighth nationally) and organic products increased from \$23.3 million to \$36.4 million. Lastly, since the 2007 Census, the total market value of agriculture sales increased 24 percent, the average value of sales per farm increased 23 percent, and the value of crops, including nursery and greenhouse, went up 46 percent.

There are even more examples of increases on the demographic side of Maine's agriculture. For instance, in 2012, the average age of a principal farm operator was 57 years old, up from 56.4 in 2007. However, this is still younger than the national average of 58.3 years for principal operators. Additionally, the number of female operators increased 17 percent and the percent of principal farm operators who were women in 2012 increased to 29 percent from 25 percent in 2007. Nationally, women make up about 14 percent of all principal operators. Finally, although the percent of principal operators in Maine who were beginning farmers (those who have been

7 Then examining the status of Maine's agrious their current operation 10 years or fewer) did not change from 2007 to 2012, the number of those who had been on their present farm two years or fewer increased 23 percent.

> In addition to its general upward momentum, Maine agriculture is unique in other ways. In the 16 Maine counties there are 1,133 farms turning out forest products totaling \$8.6 million in sales. We also have 2,311 operations with direct market sales, placing us fifth nationally for direct market sales measured in percent farms. Five percent of Maine farms participate in a community supported agriculture (CSA) arrangement, placing us third nationally, and we have three counties in the top twenty nationwide for the number of farms practicing a CSA arrangement. We rank fifth nationally for potato acreage, second nationally for land in berries and first nationally for wild blueberry (our state fruit) acreage. We have 264 farms that have their own renewable energy producing systems, with solar panels being the most popular, followed by wind turbines. Lastly, Somerset County ranks first nationally for the number of maple taps and the gallons of maple syrup produced and Aroostook County ranks first for oat acreage and oat production.

> The rapid increases and diversification of Maine's agriculture reflects the dynamic nature of agriculture and farm-related demographics in our country, and it's clear that our state will remain a key player.

Maine Farm Days

Wednesday and Thursday; August 26th & 27th from 9 to 4 each day

The cows at the Misty Meadow Farm each produce 10 gallons of milk each day! With 600-650 "milkers", that is a lot of milk! That could be used to produce 3,200 lbs. of cheese, with approximately 20% of that cheese is used on pizzas. Come and visit the entire operation. See where the cheese for your pizza, and the ice cream, and the yogurt, and many other dairy products come from.

Maine Farm Days is an Agricultural Trade Show held on a working farm. Open to the public, admission is free. Farm Days, Inc. joins the host families, John & Belinda Stoughton and Tom & Kimberly Wright in addition to others in order to sponsor this agricultural exhibition. The Stoughton family opens their farm up to the public but they do not stop farming. You have a chance to see how it works. They just allow the public to come in and join the operation and see what is involved in the operation of a large dairy farm. If you joined us in previous years, come and see the changes.


