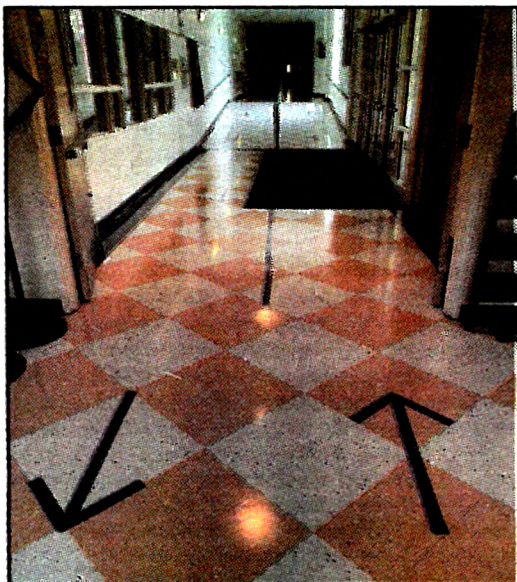

New desks due August 31st

BUCKSPORT -With arrows in place and special "hoof stickers" on the floors marking off and reminding all to stay at least '6 feet apart please', the first day of school is planned for September 8 for all students.

Superintendent of Schools, Jim Boothby, in an interview yesterday, said they have all the resources they need to keep them safe. "Of course, there are certain to be reorders for some items throughout the course of the year."

The 1,105 new desks, however, are still being

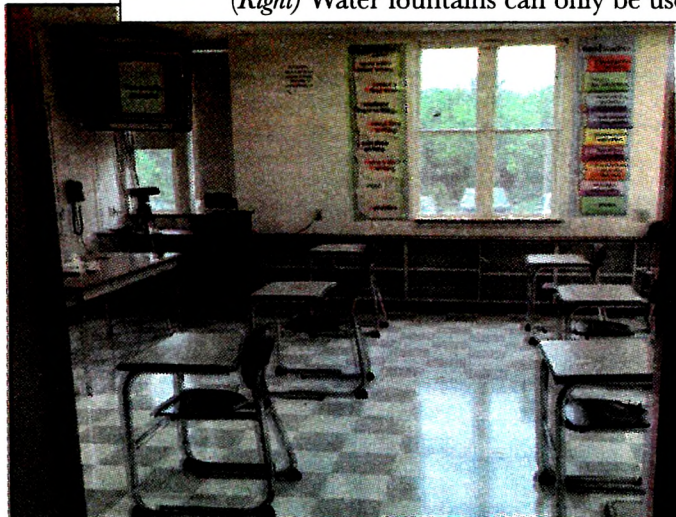
tracked and are expected to arrive on August 31st.

On Tuesday, September 8, PreK and Grades K-4 will start in class instruction. They will meet 4 1/2 days--Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Fridays will meet from 8 a.m. to noon.

Grades 5-12 will open with a hybrid model. There will be 2 groups: Purple and Gold. Purple will meet in person Mondays & Wednesdays. Gold will meet in person Tuesdays & Thursdays. Both groups will be taught remotely on Fridays.

POOL - Weather-permitting, town officials are trying to keep the recently refurbished Tim Emery Memorial Swimming Pool open through the middle of September. The nearly final tally shows the repairs cost some \$130,000, some \$870,000 less than the \$1 million in bonds the taxpayers were asked to authorize to repair it.

Much of the repair cost already was in the pool reserve account, so the long-term bonds that town officials got the town to authorize won't be needed. A panel headed by former Mayor David Keene worked out the lower cost repair plan.

VISTA VOLUNTEER - The Healthy Bay Community Coalition is about to hire a VISTA program volunteer to help coordinate its local activities and volunteers. The local group has been fairly dormant for a number of months. Town Manager Susan M. Lessard told the Town Council recently a new coordina-

tor has been recruited and an employment offer has been extended.

GETTING TO BOTTOM OF THINGS - A courtesy boat inspection system is in the works for those using the Silver Lake boat launch ramp. The inspections aimed at detecting milfoil or other invasive plant species clinging to watercraft is completely voluntary, and there are no penalties of any of the unwanted species are found.

The goal is strictly to educate voters and help safeguard the state's water bodies from plant growths that could damage the habitat and reduce the attractiveness of lakes and ponds to those who enjoy them just as they are.

LEANING WALLS - Add the retaining walls in front of the former United Methodist Church on Franklin Street to those which could pose safety hazards in the months ahead.

Richard Rotella, the town's economic devel-

opment director, will seek state money to supplement local cash to get the walls repaired or replaced. The town already has targeted walls on Main Street and U.S. Route 1. The downtown walls will be part of a more than \$500,000 repair project. Money also will be needed for the outfield wall at the baseball field off McDonald Street. The cost of the ballfield repairs was described as, "significant."

VIRTUAL MEETING The latest "guesstimate" for when the Town Council will return to "in-person" sessions from attending via the internet is "sometime in September."

ON THE AGENDA - The Council will take another look at the Recreation Department's rules that were set up earlier this year to see if they are need to be updated for any changes and regulations pertaining to COVID-19.

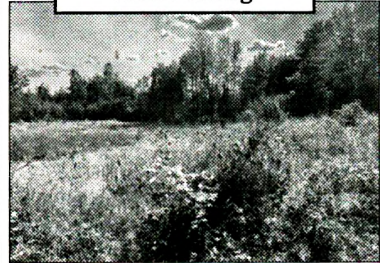

No apology needed

A couple of meetings ago the town manager and some Town Council members appeared to be a mite perplexed when they gathered to take the final vote on whether small cruise ships would be allowed at the Town Dock during the current pandemic.

While the council initially appeared in general agreement that the cruise line's request was reasonable, they quite rightly invited public comment while they pondered the idea. That turned out to be a swift kick into a beehive.

EDITORIALS Their offer sparked a lot of very strong reactions, ranging from dumb and dangerous to sure, go ahead - and other fervently written and spoken comments in between.

Some councilors and the town manager reacted to the onslaught. (There were enough comments to more than fill an entire page of the *Enterprise*), and officials tried to calm the public's concerns.

Making it much easier was the cruise line's last-minute withdrawal of its request and shutdown of all of its Maine cruises for the rest of this year. Still, Town Manager Susan M. Lessard thought it important to note the cruise ship issue was "a topic that deserves to be discussed" even though she sometimes, "is uncomfortable talking about controversial subjects."

Still, she added, "talking is not advocacy; it's just discussion."

Neither the manager nor the councilors who seemed surprised at the passion of the responses, have anything to be concerned about. Open discussion and even passionate debate based on logic and honest differences of opinion always are good. It is what fuels our wonderful republic.

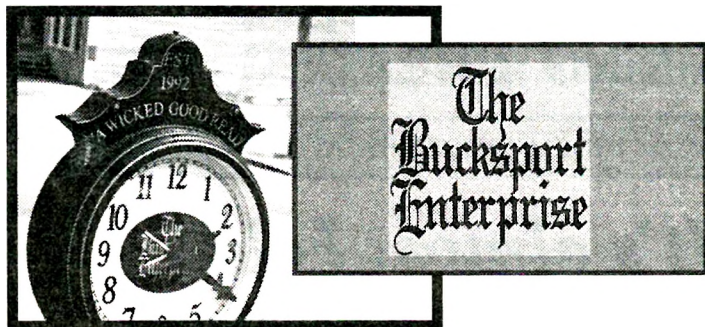
And a postscript . . . The cruise ship issue is likely to surface again late this winter or early next spring. We're holding onto that page of public comments if, as is like, COVID-19 remains with us next spring. When it does, the councilors will have the benefit of those thoughtful opinions. They need not vote with the majority, but neither side should be ignored when the issue is aired again. That, too, is a keystone to our republic.

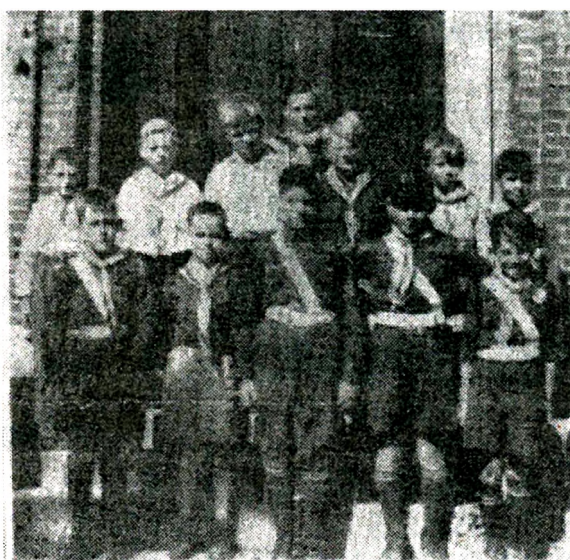
Then, another brief pause in our new-found friendship, this time caused by his hesitation, not some electronic device glitch.

Senior Center Menus

BUCKSPORT - Now that the free meals program for Bucksport residents has ended as a result of the money that suppoirted it running out, the daily delivered mails effort has been reduced about in half.

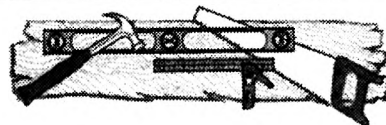

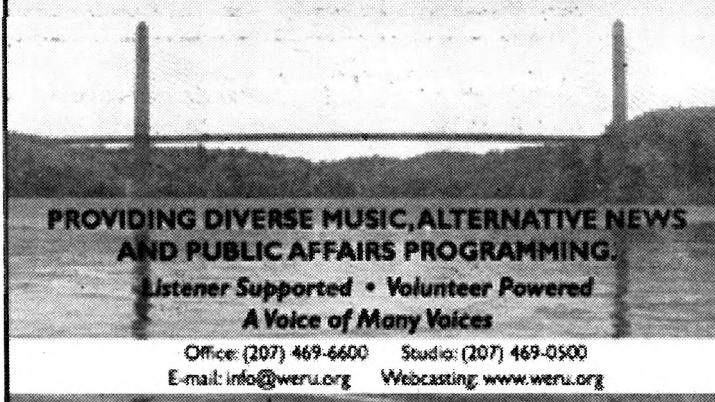
