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In this manner affairs continued, the poor wretch struggling continually in a most determined manner to abstain from the vice, and on each occasion the delusion appearing to him, and standing motionless before him, gazed on him with its cold, expressive eye, all his past life flashed before him, he utterly numbbed, and a few months after he was left to rot in X— he occupied a grave in the city cemetery.


