I have just recd notice
from the Capt of Co D. 9th Maine
Regt that he cannot send me
my final statements of pay,
& clothing for reasons that he
has not recd an official notice
of my discharge or promotion
& if Major Gardin has neglected
his duty in this matter why ^{not} have
it attended to at once, it seems
as though there had been sufficient
time for its accomplishment. will
you be kind enough to see that all
is made right on that matter &
oblige. also I wish to say to you
that I have not recd one cent
for the transportation, Board or
other expenses paid out by

me as for bills left in Major
Garman's office, he putting me
off on acct of money being short,
while I was there, & since I left
he refuses or pleads off on acct
of some reasons which are trivial
& seem only to create a delay of
fact - my bills & statements are
all correct & the money I have
actually paid out, & is rightfully
due me & I wish to call your
attention to it, as you said you
would make an extra statement
& recommendation of it & that it
would be paid, I have given Albion
Johnson of the Central House an
order for it to be paid to him,
whom I have had correspondence
with on acct of it, since I came
out here, and as it comes
under your administration
as Governor of our state, you
would know better the true

letter
merits of the matter than an
other, if it is your pleasure I
would be glad to hear from
you on the matter - I have
not yet succeeded in the transfer
of my son which I so much
desire. Col Nichols will not give
know up till the War Department
authorizes it, his Capt is willing
for him to come - Our Regt have
just recd their knapsacks and
our Coats & they are very much
improved in spirits on acct
of it. We are very anxious for the
return of Col Wilder, Capt Ayer
is suspended for 2 months it is
said, Capt Huletting is not well
or Lieut Eustis of Co D, excuse me
for troubling you with so long a
letter written in haste - and
I remain as ever your friend
