Tidbits from week's news

PAINT & POLISH – The Town Council tonight (9/8) is expected to give its final approval to distribute up to \$100,000 to downtown building owners to encourage them to spiff up the facades of their properties. Each owner can seek up to \$10,000, but must match each town dollar with one of their own. The cash is coming from the town's unallocated funds account.

OUT STRAIGHT – The deputy fire chief this month continued to sound the alarm about his department's staffing needs.

After reporting a record 165 calls for service last month - 11 in a single 24-hour period, Deputy Chief Michael W. Denning said, "these numbers cannot be sustained for long with the current number of on-duty personnel." He said, "fatigue is slowly wearing down our personnel." The department handled 995 calls during the past eight months.

PASSED INSPECTION – A program operated by the Toddy Pond Association to reduce or eliminate milfoil and other invasive plant species from entering that pond was replicated by the group at Silver Lake. Underwritten by the Town of Bucksport and the local water company, two inspectors were at the lake two days a week from June 18 to Sept. 4. They conducted 223 inspections, 86 percent of them on motorized craft. Almost two thirds (62 percent) were returning to Silver Lake. Thirteen percent were bringing boats from lakes more than 25 miles away, and only four were last used on a lake known to be impacted by milfoil.

WARM & DRY – The warming house at the municipal skating rink off Miles Lane is getting a new roof.

The old one developed a leak and some water damage occurred. Maguire's Roofing, the lowest of the three bidders at \$6,000, is expected to get the job.

Local ballot takes shape

BUCKSPORT – While candidates have until 5 p.m. tonight (9/8) to take out and then file nomination papers, the Nov. 8 municipal ballot appears virtually complete.

Two candidates - Tracey A. Hair of 16 Franklin Street, and incumbent Councilor Edward A. Rankin Jr. of 150 State Route 46 - are vying for the one open Town Council seat.

And Keith H. Kneeland Jr. of 149 Mast Hill Road, who ran unsuccessfully against Scott Frazier in the last RSU 25 School Board election, this year is challenging incumbent Peter W. Clair of 16 Mast Hill Road. They're competing for the lone opening among the four Bucksport slots on the eight-member, four-town panel.

All of the seats up are for

three-year terms.

All of the Bucksport candidates are being invited to participate in a Candidates' Forum on Tuesday, Oct. 18, in Brown Hall on Elm Street.

The candidates for the state Senate - Republican Peter A. Lyford of Eddington and Democrat Ralph Cammack of Brewer, and the Maine House of Representatives seats - Democrat Ronald Russell of Verona Island and Republican incumbent Sherman Hutchins of Penobscot - will be at a similar forum a week later on Tuesday, Oct. 25.

Both sessions are being sponsored by The Bucksport Enterprise, and each will run from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Don Houghton, the editor of the newspaper, will moderate the first session and Dr. Stephen

York, the minister of the Elm Street Congregational Church, will be the moderator for the second.

The public can submit questions for the candidates by e-mail at: theenterpr@aol.com or by mail to: The Bucksport Enterprise, Post Office Box 829, Bucksport, ME 04416. Attendees also can arrive early at either forum and submit their suggested questions in writing.

The goal of the forums is to encourage a free and civil exchange of ideas. "Gotcha"-style questions will not be encouraged. The goal of the moderators is to use the 90-minute format to explore as broad a range of topics as possible, and not engage in airing any personal views.

Shaking tree for back taxes

BUCKSPORT – While current taxes are flowing into Bucksport's coffers just fine, officials are making certain everyone is paying their share.

As a result, the town manager has added six more properties to the list of those whose owners have not been making regular payments on their overdue tax bills. They include two properties on the Cross Road, two on the River Road, one on the Duck Cove Road and one on the Millvale Road.

At the top of the list is an estate handling a property on the River Road and now owes the town \$14,300. While the estate paid the town \$500 last month, no contact has been made by anyone about the

large overdue balance.

- A certified letter seeking over \$5,400 on the Duck Cove Road property was signed for but there has been no response. The last tax payment on that property was made in July of 2018.

- An estate owning a property on the Cross Road reportedly owes over \$3,500, not having made a payment since December of 2017. A second estate owning property on that road owes over \$5,500. A payment was made in September of last year, but a recent certified letter, while signed for, drew no response.

- Some \$9,400 is owed on a River Road site, as nothing has

been paid since June of 2017. Again, a certified letter brought no response.

- An estate with property on the Millvale Road owes over \$9,750. There's been no response since the last payment was made in December, 2019.

Compounding the problem is the fact some of properties are in deteriorated condition and have vacant rental units. None of the half dozen sites is owner-occupied. The town routinely works with property owners to arrange payment schedules aimed at keeping residents in their homes. This is especially true during periods of economic distress.

Three projects backed

Housing, cafe, industrial park plans endorsed

BUCKSPORT – They had to work their way through two hours of rigmarole, but the Planning Board on Tuesday liked what they saw and unanimously green-lighted:

- An upscale subdivision off the Bucks Mills Road;
- A 29-seat cafe/event center in the now-empty storefront at Main and Elm streets, a space formerly occupied by the Huckleberries before the gift shop was relocated further down Main Street.
- A two-building shop and storage center in the town's industrial park to serve a small electrical supplies contractor.

Subdivision:

The first portion of the planned two-phase development of building lots by Osborne will be along a new private road that eventually may be accepted by the town.

While questions were raised about preserving open space for recreation and the possibility of having underground utility service, the board took no action on either idea. The board did work out an arrangement to swap one lot in the initial phase for one previously planned to be developed later. That will allow an abuttor to continue to use part of his property for shooting sports, at least until the second phase is submitted at least five years from now.

Cafe:

An Orrington couple - M. Billings and Bill Sturrock - will open their newly renovated cafe initially on Sundays through Wednesdays. They plan to feature light luncheon fare and occasional dinner menus.

The baked goods and some other ingredients will be prepared elsewhere but the specialty sandwich fare will be made in-house.

Called Crumpets, the space also will be offered for meetings and meals for small groups.

The couple have owned the property for about five years, and have nurtured their idea of a small tea room-like experience.

Industrial park:

The Redmond Electrical Corp., operated by S.L. Redmond of Bucksport, was given permission to erect two small wood-frame buildings at 95 Heritage Park Road. Redmond acquired the site for free from the Town of Bucksport, which offers the sites as inducements to grow taxes and jobs.

Thinking ahead

Mayor Peter Stewart is on the right track, suggesting that most Town Council business can be conducted at a single meeting each month. The idea of meeting more frequently just for the sake of meeting makes no sense.

With a strong town manager form of government, most of the day-to-day management duties long ago were delegated to the manager, leaving the councilors to concentrate on setting and adjusting policies and long-term strategizing.

A better use of the councilors' time would be to convert the current second meeting each month to the discussion of a single topic, one that falls into either the policy-setting or planning strategies categories.

Each month the councilors would devote their attention solely to topics such as:

- What the town can or should do to encourage growth,
- Planning for the staffing of the public safety departments over the next five years,

• Review the major equipment needs of the various departments over the next five years.
• Consider ways to better use existing resources, both staff and equipment,
• Encourage a single-person, county-wide purchasing department to serve all of the municipalities and school districts. This could include shared services such as contracting out payroll or other common services. Such an operation would expand the current one offering shared bidding for some high-way products.

Currently, too many good ideas are brought up— and then ignored. (Remember the community garden that was to be growing here this summer?)

Invite the public to participate in at least a portion of each of these strategizing sessions, either in-person or via phone.

Most importantly, delegate each agreed-upon task to a single person with a deadline to produce a detailed proposal or, at the least, a status report. After all, talk is cheap, but accomplishments can be priceless.


Your hometown?





CROSS COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Hileman goes back to back at the Ellsworth Invitational Coach Jones

While almost all fall sports team have had opportunities to compete in preseason games during the last three weeks, the Bucks XC team finally got their opportunity to compete after three weeks of preseason at one of the oldest annual XC meets in the state of Maine at the Ellsworth Invitational. The course features two of the toughest hills in Eastern Maine which runners have to converge over twice, but thankfully the course is a shy short of 3 miles at 2.84 miles.

The Bucks top runner Will Hileman entered the race as the defending champion even though he had put in solid summer of training he was still slightly nervous. He had nothing to worry about as he cruised to a 22 second personal best just missing the course record by one second. His time of 15:44 a hair short of the all-time record 15:43 set by Ellsworth great

Dan Curts, back in 2014. His closest competitor Caleb Colson took the lead early but by the first half mile Will took the lead and kept extending it over the remaining part of the two-loop course finishing 50 seconds ahead of him. The Bucks second runner was Michael Johnson, continuing the Bucks personal best parade, had an improvement of 1:36 seconds, placing 30th in the 80-runner field. The remaining 3 Buck runners all freshman had all raced on the course during their middle school career, however they only ran the challenging loop once instead of twice. Marlin Orcutt led the freshman trio with a time of 23:52 finishing 65th. Two spots behind in 67th place was Zach Havey-Chambers just 47 seconds behind with a time of 24:39. Cameron Orcutt would round out the trio one spot later in 68th and in a time of 25:02. The boys team finished 9th overall out of 11 teams, but the Bucks were missing their number two runner who was out with a leg injury.

The girls started the last race as they will for the entire

season. Unfortunately for the girls they would not be able to score as a team as of now they only have three runners. Leading the way for the Bucks was newcomer and former soccer player Abby Hunt. In her first ever XC meet she finished 29th in a field of 53 runners, traversing the course in 25:16. Following her and four spots behind was Christina Degiso who had the biggest PR of the day, running 27:55 a decrease of 4:45 seconds from last year's race. She placed 33rd. Abby Farricker the last of the three girls also ran faster than last year on the course as well. Her time of 28:33 was an improvement of 29 seconds and put her in 38th place. Coach Jones is hoping to recruit a few more girls to fill out the team so they can score at meets as a team in the future.

On Saturday the Bucks will host their only home meet The Golden Bucks Invitational starting at 11AM. The meet will feature only Class C teams and both of last year's individual winners including Will Hileman will be looking to be repeat as champions.


