Camp of 5th maine Regiment, Avar Alexandria Va. Aug. 15th 1861. To his Excellency, Gov. Washburn: Dear Sir: It is with the deepest regiet that we, the undersigned, are inder the necessity of laying before you the con dition of the soldiers under our command; and the manner in which they have been neglected since the recent engagement at Bull Run; but our duty to them will not permit us longer to remain silent. A few days before the battle of Bull Rin, the Knapsacks, containing all everything bilonging to the soldiers except what they wore upon their backer, were sent to Fairfax C. H. and on our retreat fell into the hands of the rebelg. Thast of our Camp and cooking utencily shared the same fate. Requisitions were in due time made for such articles as were wanting, but week after week has passed, and we have received nothing except a partial supply of Campi and cooking utencilo, and blankely.

In consequence of this neglect the soldiers have been several weeks with no change of shints or stockings, and many are now without either one or the other or both. many are also without coaty, having colled them up in their blankets on their march to the battle field, which they were ordered to throw aside before going into action, and conse quently were lost. We have been promised from day to day that these wants should be supplied, but have waited untill forbrarance clases to be a virtue. You can imagine what must be the condition of our soldiers, with no change of shirts or stockings, many of them with none at all, some even without coats, and with not a half supply of camp and cooking atencilo and diskes to eas from. We have the material for an excellent Righ, as good as has left the state of maine, or any other State, but if the onen are used hereafter as they have been used heretofore, the work of demoralization al. ready begin will go on , until the Regh will become unfit for service. Having exhausted

all our patience in awaiting some action in regard to the matter by the authorities here, we humbly pray your Calling to see that those brave hearter, patriotic men, who have, all the comforts of home, and the society of families and friends at the call of their country, to engage in this florious struggle in defense of par Jobernment, be treated as men, as Lice & Ilsley Comey 5 Ry V May J, & Hamithin Lent Burbonk Spiller Serie Com Monnel Levit N.S.
