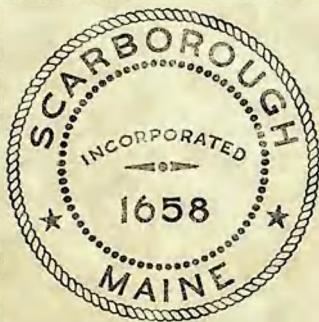

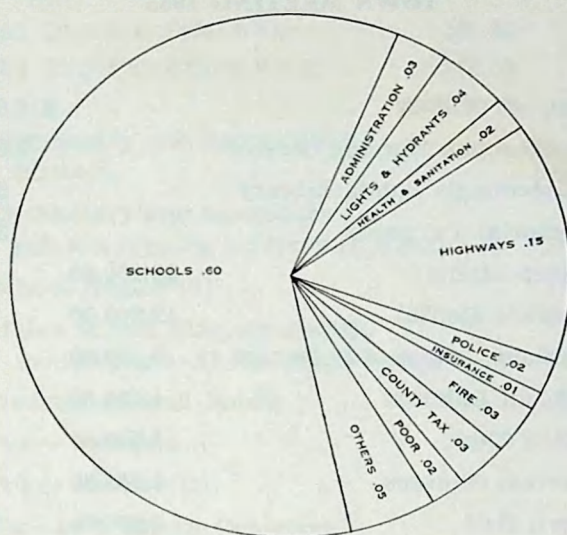

Report of the Scarborough Fire Department

To the Selectmen and Citizens of the
Town of Scarborough:

During 1955 our hearts have been saddened by the passing of five prominent members of the Fire Department, Ex-chief Ralph K. Bennett, Ex-chief Benjamin F. Roberts, former Commissioners Roswell S. Googins and Charles L. Homer, and a member of Engine 1, Donald M. Richardson. These men served many years and will be deeply missed by all members of the Department.

The past year 158 alarms were sounded, 123 for fire plus 3 second alarms, 35 for rescue, 1 air raid alert, 2 Portland airport alerts.

Plans are being drawn for a new Fire Station in the Dunstan area. This, we hope will be in line with a replacement program covering new stations and apparatus as recommended by The New England Rating Association.

Fire Prevention Week, Oct. 9 to 15 was observed with a school and poster program.

The Muscular Dystrophy Drive was participated in by members of this Department under the chairmanship of Neil Leighton.

All apparatus, hose, pumps, etc. of the Fire Department were tested in November and found to be in good condition.

Again I wish to thank the Selectmen, Ass't Chief Eldred Harmon, Commissioners, Fire Alarm Operators, and all Personnel for their cooperation during 1955.

Report of Chief of Police

To the Citizens of the Town of Scarborough:

I hereby submit the second annual report as Chief of Police of the Town of Scarborough.

At the annual Town Meeting the voters of Scarborough wisely voted to rent a police cruiser car and provide it with a two-way radio. With the fine cooperation of Chief Marx of the Maine State Police, our radio was tied in on the State Police wave length and all our calls were dispatched from the Barracks at Dunstan. This was a very satisfactory arrangement and I believe that the people of Scarborough were provided with the best police service we have ever enjoyed.

The Scarborough Police Cruiser became a familiar sight throughout the entire Town and the people living in the outlying sections of town realized that they were getting police protection for the first time.

This year the officers' fees in arrests were paid to the Town and not to the officers. A police file was established and a complete record of all cases are on file.

Your Police Department investigated 104 cases that did not involve arrests such as breaking and entering, accidents, suicide, transporting patients to Augusta State Hospital, State Police calls, drunken disturbances, etc. There were 242 arrests and convictions for traffic violations. A total of 346 cases for the year.

This increase in police cases over 1954 indicates the need for increased police coverage for our rapidly growing town. (1956 will see the Town's population pass 6,000). I sincerely hope the voters of Scarborough will provide the Police Department with an adequate budget for the next fiscal year.

In closing, I wish to thank the Officers and men of the Department for a job well done.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE
of the Town of Scarborough

This is your superintendent's eighth annual report of the condition and progress of the Scarborough School Department. This report deals principally with the events of the year ending January 31, 1956. The accompanying financial statement is to be found in another section of the annual town report, and the plans for the school year 1956-1957 are reflected in the annual budget message distributed separately by the school department.

Enrollments

As has been the case for the past ten years, the greater part of the town's educational problems arise from the increasing population and the constantly growing school enrollments. The table below indicates this enrollment trend for the ten-year period.

The figures above show that enrollments have nearly doubled in ten years, causing a continuing demand for increase in faculty and in classrooms.

Study of the enrollment as of January 1, 1956, shown below, will indicate the problem trend for the coming years. It will be noted that, with some exceptions, the lower grades are largest. As time goes on, these larger classes progress upward through the grades. Smaller classes are graduated, and their places are taken by the larger classes. Because of this there has been, and will continue to be, the demand for added teachers and classrooms each year.

School Plant

Since the size of the school plant depends upon the enrollments it is called upon to house, this division would seem to follow the enrollment report logically.

The new Scarborough High School, now in use for a year and one-half has met secondary housing needs well, and will continue to do so for at least three years more. The Elwood G. Bessey School, formerly the high school, now houses 335 pupils in grades six through eight, and is at capacity. It is planned to partition the long room in the basement, formerly the high school

shop, next summer, thus adding one more classroom. At that point ultimate expansion, except for the building of an addition, will have been attained.

All other buildings, as may be seen from the current enrollment table, are filled to capacity, in most cases exceeding the number of pupils for which they were originally planned. Beginning in September, 1955, it became necessary to put two room assignments of the Junior Primary in the K. of P. Hall, once before used for this purpose. With the need for two added elementary classrooms in September, 1956, and the only feasible expansion being the one room in the Bessey School mentioned above, it appears that your school department will have to find outside quarters for one more classroom next fall.

The Town Planning Board has met twice in recent months with the School Committee. The two groups are studying the growth of various sections of the town with view to charting the most advantageous location of new construction which should be available for use in 1957.

The physical condition of all buildings has been maintained at as high a level as budget limitations has permitted. The buildings are basically sound, and the year by year deterioration has been substantially offset by many minor repairs. Among the more expensive during the past year has been a complete overhaul of the Dunstan Heating system. While it would have been possible to expend twice as much in repairs as was spent, without waste, the buildings are in reasonably good condition, ensuring the health and safety of their occupants.

Academic Progress

The fight to secure and maintain a reasonable ratio of pupils to teachers has been unremitting for the past six years, and will be continued. There are no longer any classes of 45 to 50 pupils, as was the case even three

years ago. The reduction of class size, to a present average of just under 30, has resulted in improved accomplishment in all subjects. This improvement has shown most in the lower grades which were not subjected to the too-large classes as long as were the pupils of the upper grades.

One of the problems met by Scarborough teachers much more than by those of the average town is the unusually high rate of moving in and out of pupils. This makes necessary a program which will correlate effectively with those of other systems all over the country from which pupils are received. It also requires an adaptability on the part of the teaching and supervisory staff which will facilitate placing new pupils in the system to best advantage and helping them to become adjusted.

An unusual percentage of Scarborough teachers is working through summer schools and extension courses to keep in step with the times and to improve themselves as teachers. The educational qualifications of the staff can be judged from reading the listing of the staff to be found in the next section of this report.

In connection with Academic Progress, the reader is also referred to the Report of the Principal of Scarborough High School which lists the Colleges to which last years graduating class has been admitted.

Personnel

During the past summer, your school department experienced a somewhat greater turnover of personnel than has been the case for some years. A total of seven teachers left the system and were replaced, while five teachers were added to the staff.

I herewith submit my third annual report as principal of Scarborough High School.

This enrollment is an increase of twenty-five over 1954-1955. Figures at hand indicate that a similar increase may be expected next year and for several years. At this rate we will soon reach 350, the capacity of the new building.

A beautiful new curtain has been installed in our auditorium since my last report. Much credit for this installation is due to the untiring efforts of Mrs. Lary in securing contributions from interested citizens and friends.

On behalf of the school, I wish to thank those individuals who gave so generously to this cause.

Another important addition to the facilities of our school plant is an electric scoreboard purchased entirely through the efforts of the student body and installed by Mr. Hallett and his shop boys.

During the year our program of study was submitted to the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary schools, an accrediting organization which includes in its membership those high schools whose programs measure up to standards acceptable to the best colleges in New England. After a visitation by an investigation committee, our program, teaching staff, and facilities were approved, and we were accepted into membership.

The Iowa Tests of Educational Development were given in November. The results have been analyzed, and all teachers are working to strengthen weaknesses which appear prevalent in certain areas.

The three upper classes have shown continued improvement from year to year which, I feel, speaks well for the type and quality of instruction these young people are receiving at the hands of very competent teachers.

We are continuing our course in Driver Education for the second year under the very capable instruction of Mr. Bragdon. By the end of the year nearly 100 stu-

dents will have satisfactorily completed the course since its inception.

Our school has participated in several scholarship programs this year, two being national in scope — National Merit Scholarship Program and National Honor Society Scholarship Program. This has been a valuable educational experience for those privileged to take part.

In conclusion, I wish to express my sincere thanks to all school officials, teachers, and parents for the fine spirit of cooperation extended to me during the year.

The Polio vaccine program was successfully held and 885 children were given a total of two injections.

SCARBOROUGH COMMUNITY

NURSING SERVICE

To the Board of the Scarborough Community Nursing Service and the Citizens of the Town of Scarborough.

As public health nurse I hereby submit my annual report for the year of 1955.

The work of the nursing service has been carried on this year as in the past with home visits to the acute and chronically ill patient and to pre-school, infants and adults for health supervision. 808 visits in all were made.

Child Health Conferences were held monthly with 166 children attending these clinics. Physical examinations and immunizations for diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough were given. Two special pre-school clinics were held during the early summer to vaccinate those children entering school in the fall.

Chest x-rays were arranged for several patients needing follow-up care.

The Y.M.C.A. very generously sent two children to their camp in Winthrop for two weeks with all expenses paid. Both children benefited greatly from this and enjoyed the experience.

Monthly meetings were held with the Board of Directors of the Nursing Service and the nurse.

Schools

Visits were made regularly to the schools throughout the year and any problems discussed with the teachers. 228 such visits were made for this purpose.

Physical examinations were given by Dr. Haigis to 450 pupils and parents notified of defects found.

359 children received the patch test for tuberculosis. These tests were given to sub-primary, eighth grade and high school pupils. X-rays were given to positive reactors.

44 children were vaccinated for smallpox in the schools.

Polio inoculations (Salk) were given in June to 146 pupils in the first and second grades. In October two more clinics were held to give second shots to those having the first ones in June and to give first shots to any new ones desiring the vaccine. 211 were done at this time. No serious reactions were reported.

X-rays were given to all school personnel needing them this year and 52 high school seniors were given free x-rays. This was paid for by the Cumberland County Tuberculosis Association.

We had very little communicable disease in the schools this year. Measles with 57 cases and chickenpox with 48 cases were the most prevalent.

Our dental clinic was carried on again with the dentist being present for 19 half days.

The Lions Club has as usual given financial assistance in many cases by paying for tonsillectomies and glasses. We thank them for their generosity.

I would like to thank the board members for their valuable assistance in helping at clinics, for transportation etc. Their help is appreciated. Also the teachers and town officials for their cooperation.

HEALTH OFFICERS REPORT

To the Citizens of Scarborough

In submitting my report as Health Officer I wish to report that the number of cases of communicable diseases were below that of several years with the exception of scarlet fever. Eight cases being reported, two more than the year before. The number of dog bites reported, and dogs quarantined were about the same as last year — twelve.

The various clinics required by law were held as usual during the year. In addition the polio vaccine clinics were held as the vaccine became available.

The polio clinics will continue as the vaccine becomes available to the various ages. These being conducted by three doctors and a staff of volunteer workers, mostly registered and practical nurses. This enabled a large number of children to be vaccinated with speed and comfort.

During the year nearly 80 plumbing permits were issued, mostly for new buildings. There were a number of older residences off the water line that have installed water systems and modern plumbing.

While sewerage disposal remains a problem much has been done during the year toward replacing defective systems with those specified by state plumbing code.

In closing, I wish to thank Town Officials, Doctors, Nurse and all others who have aided me in conducting this office during the year.

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NOTICE**COLLECTION OF DOG TAXES**

Chap. 100, Sec. 14, R.S., 1954.

The municipal officers of each city, town or plantation shall annually within 10 days from the 1st day of June issue a warrant, returnable on the 1st day of July following, to one or more police officers or constables, directing him or them to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner or keeper of any unlicensed dog.

On the 1st day of July the municipal officers of cities, towns and plantations shall issue to one or more police officers or constables a warrant returnable on the 1st Monday of the following February, directing him or them to seek out, catch, and confine all dogs within such city, town, or plantation, which are not licensed, collared and tagged, or enclosed as required by sections 9 to 28, inclusive, and to enter complaint and summons to court the owner or keeper of any such dog. Such court may order such police officers or constables to sell, give away, kill, or cause to be killed each such dog which after being detained by him or them for a period of 6 days shall not have been licensed, collared and tagged.

Resident Owners

All inhabitants of the Town of Scarborough, Maine, and all Administrators, Executors, Trustees, etc., of all estates taxable in said town of such persons are hereby notified to **MAKE AND BRING INTO THE ASSESSORS TRUE AND PERFECT LISTS OF THEIR POLLS AND ALL THEIR ESTATES, REAL AND PERSONAL**, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April, 1956 and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same and to answer all proper inquiries in writing as to the nature, situation and value of their property liable to be taxed.

Estates Distributed

And when estates of persons deceased have been distributed during the past year, or have changed hands from any cause, the Executor, Administrator, or other persons interested, are hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held

under the law to pay the tax assessed although such estate has been wholly distributed and paid over.

Persons Doomed

And any resident owner who neglects to comply with this notice is thereby barred of his right to make application to the ASSESSORS or the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed.
