chance he thinks he ought
as well have it as any body.

a part of our army made
a forward movement last
night and took possession of
Mansons Hill The Rebels fled
without giving Battle. There
were ten thousand of them
encamped there about the
same number of our troops
are there now And our pick
ets extend to Falls Church
Some of our Boys have been
out there to day erecting
Heliographs

Whatever you do about that
matter will be satisfactory to
me
