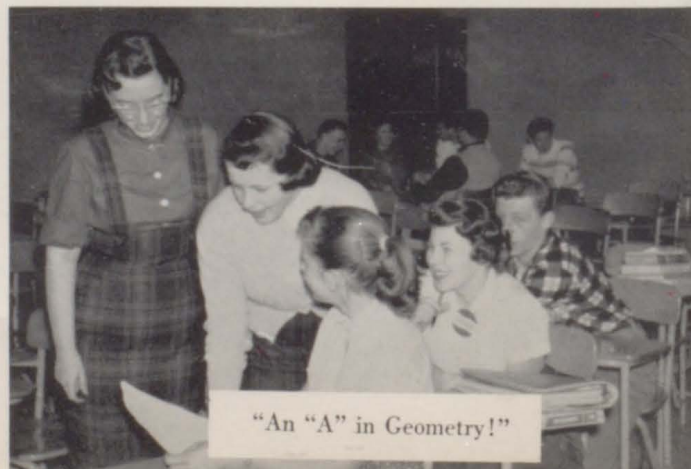
## Sophomore

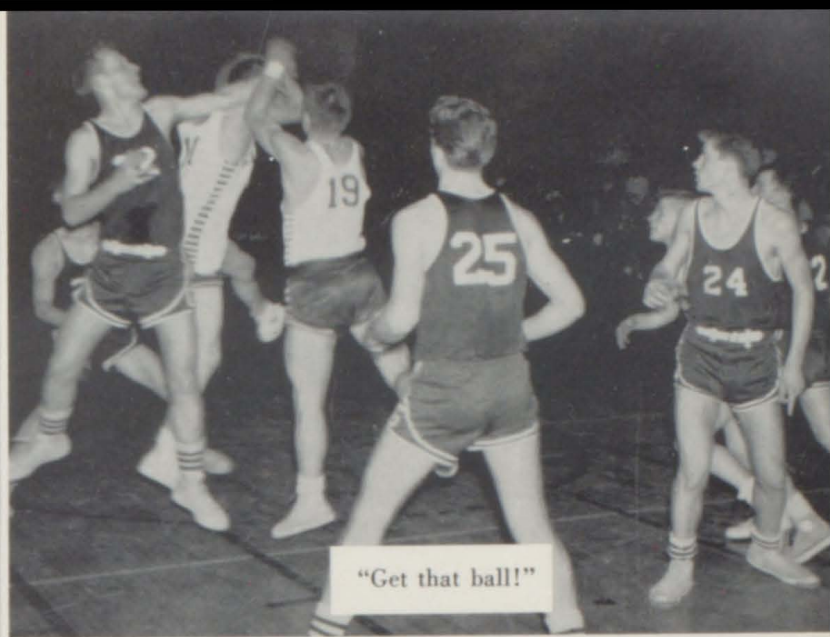
