Hon John L. Hodsdon;

Dear Sir,

There is in the town of Phillips
one Wm Mc, Lawyer, who
deserted from the army
some months since, He went
from St Johnsburg, Vt. in
Capt. Halsors' Company, I
have heard that he deserted
from picket duty, I hope
that when we find all the
men we can get & our fighting
forth so much strength, that
such fellows will not be
allowed to go at large, Wm
said that Lawyer ^{two or three weeks since} was here & spent
one or two nights with one
Geo. W. Patton, a rabid democrat,
& who knew that he was a deserter
from the army, This you will
