## Middle School Athletic Field project out to bid

BUCKSPORT— Superintendent of Schools James Boothby said yesterday in an interview, “The middle school athletic field revitalization project has gone out to bid with an anticipated bid opening date of April 19th at 4:30 p.m.

The plan, developed by Olver Associates, anticipates a project that will include adding drainage, adding topsoil and regrading, renovation of both the softball and baseball infields with appropriate

surfaces and integrated watering system.

The primary work will take place in year one of the project, with additional soil augmentation and soil chemistry work happening in years 2-5 of the project.

It is anticipated the cost of year one of the project will be paid for using funds from the district’s capital reserve account with voter approval.

The estimated cost for this project is \$279,000.”

## Ian’s Playground Is Even More Fun!

BUCKSPORT – There are some changes to Ian’s Playground that can only make it more fun for all children. The black flat swings have been replaced with some colorful and more accessible for children with disabilities.

Rich Rotella, the director of the town’s community and economic development, which now has the playground under his wings so to speak, wisely put aside money from the Waterfront budget last year to get this done.

A representative doing a playground safety check last year pointed out the current ones were worn out and becoming unsafe.

When Rotella went to purchase the replacements he saw that ADA swings

were also available for children with disabilities.

The four black flat and 2 bucket swings previously there were replaced with an ADA red swing and a black bucket swing with some colorful flat swings. The Town Highway Department recently put them up.

Ian’s Playground is easy to locate and also free to the public. It is located at 61 Elm Street.

You will see the colorful slides, climbing wall and other outside activities from the road. It is between the main office of the Supt. of Schools and actually next to Gardner Commons which was a school that has been converted to housing for the elderly.

— At the RSU 25 Special Board meeting that was held last night (3/16) the vote was unanimous to approve the current teachers’ contract as proposed.

It was also unanimously decided to allow Mechanical Services to offer to complete an efficiency audit of the school buildings to identify any energy deficiencies. There is no obligation or cost for the audits.

Supt. James Boothby said he was aware there was no HVAC at the Jewett School; the middle school exterior siding was a problem; and there were two 30-plus year boilers at Miles Lane that were not operating efficiently at this time.



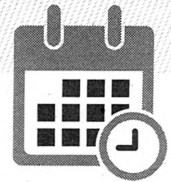

Unfortunately, the post office probably hasn't even caught up with you leaving, let alone coming back home! It has only gotten worse since COVID it seems. At least you tell me how many issues you have either never received or got so late it was a huge disappointment.

Lots of our subscribers tell us that they prefer to get the paper for a particular reason — beyond watching the obituaries, or getting caught up on projects that may be taking place on their street, it may be a missed chance at participation or voicing an opinion— after the fact is too late.

So please do your part and at least let us know when you are coming back—before you get here. It will make it easier on us and give you a fighting chance to be up to date.

Also, I (Sandy, if you haven't already guessed) would like to take this opportunity — now that I have your attention — to explain a few things that seem to confuse some of you. Please see below for reference:

If you receive the paper locally (Bucksport, Verona Island) the annual fee is \$34.82. Those of you outside of Hancock County or are a snowbird! are charged \$36.93. These numbers include Maine sales tax. If you receive your paper and live out of the state all year, then the annual fee is \$38.00. According to tax rules—there is no tax for you. Go figure? I don't make the rules, or try to explain them. The smiley face on your label is to remind you that you are getting close to expire.

Of course the sad face, well that makes me sad 'cause you are past due. We accept Visa, Mastercard and Discover. Also checks and hopefully if Covid goes away—cash! Hope this helps! — Sandy Holmes

## LETTER . . . to the editor

### "It's just plain wrong"

To the Editor:

As readers of the Enterprise may know, Bucksport isn't the only midcoast town slated for a land-based fish farm. Here in Belfast, Nordic Aquafarms, a Norwegian company, wants to build a mammoth \$500 million land-based fish farm.

The problem is that Central Maine Power's midcoast Section 80 power grid can't handle the enormous load of the vast Nordic Aquafarms project. So CMP is asking the Maine Public Utilities Commission (PUC) for permission to expand its Section 80 capacity.

And the problem with that is CMP wants to soak its ratepayers — not Nordic Aquafarms — for \$63 million for the expansion.

And it gets worse.

Not only would ratepayers pay for this, but even with the expansion, Nordic Aquafarms would still use up essentially all of CMP's Section 80 excess capacity, making it impossible for other businesses of any significant size to start up or expand in the midcoast area.

But there is a way to stop this ill-conceived CMP scheme. The PUC is taking public comment on the CMP request. Comments can be posted by sending an email to [harry.lanphear@maine.gov](mailto:harry.lanphear@maine.gov). The PUC has already begun deliberations on the CMP request, so comments should be posted as soon as possible.

It's just plain wrong for CMP ratepayers to have to subsidize a private corporation from 3,000 miles away, and I invite all Enterprise readers to join the hundreds of Mainers who have already spoken out against this unjust CMP shakedown.
