Dictation, typing, filing—these are only a few of the many duties our Senior office girls perform daily. The girls not only serve as receptionists but also gain valuable office experience.




### SENIOR EXECUTIVES




The last day of school climaxed the Christmas celebration. Seniors aren't too old for Santa—Bruce was jolly Old Saint Nick himself.


# Calendar of Events




